ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR DEFAULT DETERMINATION

Issue Date: November 17, 2016 Effective Date: November 28, 2016

On July 5, 2016, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a three-count Complaint against Missouri Utilities Company ("Missouri Utilities" or "Company") alleging that the Company failed to submit its annual reports for the years 2013, 2014, and 2015. In 1993, Missouri Utilities was granted a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to provide water and sewer service to approximately 151 residential customers in Henry County, Missouri. Although the Company is an administratively dissolved Missouri corporation, Gary Cover is still identified in the Commission's records as the Company's official representative. A copy of the complaint was sent by certified mail to Mr. Cover, who received it on July 19. The Commission directed Missouri Utilities to file an answer.

Missouri Utilities failed to submit an answer by the August 13 deadline. On August 19, Staff filed a *Motion for Default Determination* requesting the Commission enter a default judgment against the Company and authorize the Commission's General Counsel's Office to seek civil penalties. The Commission set a September 29 deadline for Missouri Utilities to file a response to Staff's motion, but no response was received.

The Commission's rules provide a respondent an opportunity to contest allegations brought before the Commission, but Missouri Utilities has repeatedly failed to respond. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.070(10) states that if a respondent in a complaint case fails to file a timely answer, the Commission may find the party to be in default, and may deem admitted by the respondent the truth of all averments in the complaint. Staff's *Complaint* alleges Missouri Utilities failed to submit its annual reports for 2013, 2014, and 2015, as required by Section 393.140(6), RSMo.¹ Based on the Company's default, the Commission finds Missouri Utilities failed to submit its 2013, 2014, and 2015 annual reports. The Commission further finds that Missouri Utilities is subject to penalties under Section 393.140(6), RSMo, and will authorize its General Counsel to seek civil penalties in circuit court.

By the Commission's rule, Missouri Utilities has seven days from the issuance of this order to file a motion to set aside this order of default.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Staff's *Motion for Default Determination* is granted.
- 2. A default determination is entered against Missouri Utilities Company.
- 3. The facts alleged in Staff's Complaint are deemed established.

¹ All statutory references are to the 2000 Missouri Revised Statutes, as cumulatively supplemented.

- 4. The Commission's General Counsel is authorized to file an action in an appropriate circuit court seeking penalties against Missouri Utilities Company, as allowed by Sections 386.570, 386.600, and 393.140(6), RSMo.
- 5. No later than November 24, 2016, Missouri Utilities Company may file a motion to set aside this order of default.
 - 6. This order shall become effective on November 28, 2016.
