**ORDER CANCELING THE CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND
NECESSITY**

On December 16, 2015, the Commission issued an order granting Foxfire Utility Company's application to donate its Spring Branch system water utility assets to Upper White River Basin Foundation, Inc. The Commission originally granted a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to Foxfire Utility Company for its Spring Branch water system in File No. WA-2001-53. Foxfire Utility Company continues to provide water service to customers in Stone County, Missouri, pursuant to a CCN granted in File No. WA-95-31.

Since the Commission issued its order authorizing the transfer of the Spring Branch system, Foxfire Utility Company has filed notice of the completed transfer and submitted revised tariff sheets that remove any reference to the Spring Branch System. Since Foxfire Utility Company no longer provides water service to customers of the Spring Branch water system, the Commission will cancel the certificate of convenience and necessity to provide water service, originally authorized in File No. WA-2001-53.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The certificate of convenience and necessity granted to Foxfire Utility Company in File No. WA-2001-53 to provide water service for the Spring Branch Water System is canceled.
2. This order shall be effective when issued.
