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APPLICANT'S INITIAL BRIEF REGARDING WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT

COMES NOW Environmental Utilities, LLC and pursuant to the Commission's Order herein submits the following for its Initial Brief regarding the Water Supply Agreement between Environmental Utilities, LLC and Osage Water Company.

FACTUAL ISSUES

The parties herein agreed at the Pre-Hearing Conference held herein on this issue on October 9, 2002 that there are no factual issues regarding the Water Supply Agreement, as the document submitted is a contract, the terms of which speak for itself.

LEGAL ISSUES

Environmental Utilities, LLC has identified no legal issues pertaining to the Water Supply Agreement which would require a determination by this Commission. The document is a contract for the provision of water supply by Environmental Utilities, LLC to Osage Water Company at Environmental Utilities proposed tariff rate, so that Osage Water Company can supply water to retail customers within Eagle Woods Subdivision. The Commission ordered that Environmental Utilities enter into such a contract as a condition of obtaining a certificate of convenience and necessity rather than relying solely on the terms and conditions of its tariff, which by law constitutes a contract between the utility company and the State of Missouri, and it has done so.

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CONCLUSION

Environmental Utilities, LLC has complied with the conditions set forth by this Commission in its Report and Order for the granting of a certificate of convenience and necessity. The Commission should enter an Order finding that the company has satisfied its requirements, and holding that the certificate is in full force and effect.

WHEREFORE, Environmental Utilities, LLC prays for an Order of the Commission finding that the company has satisfied the conditions established by the Commission for the certificate of convenience and necessity to provide water utility service to Golden Glade Subdivision, and holding that said certificate is now in full force and effect, and for an award of its attorney's fees and expenses incurred in this matter.
