COMMENTS OF VERIZON WIRELESS TO TECHNICAL IMPLEMENTATION SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT ON THE EXTENSION TO THE IMPLEMENTATION DATES FOR 314 NPA AND 816 NPA RELIEF PLANS

COMES NOW Verizon Wireless, and hereby submits its comments to the the Technical Implementation Subcommittee Report ("Report") filed in this docket on August 31, 2001. Verizon Wireless does not agree with the conclusion in the Report that 314 NPA relief implementation should be delayed "indefinitely." Consequently, Verizon Wireless was not a signatory to the Report.

On August 3, 2001, Verizon Wireless filed comments to the motion of the Office of the Public Counsel to further postpone implementation dates for the 314 NPA and 816 NPA relief plans. In its comments, Verizon Wireless advocated that the previously adopted 314 NPA relief plan continue to be implemented as ordered on a "back-up" basis so that numbering resources can be assigned when needed by carriers to meet customer demand. Under such a back-up plan, carriers would provision their networks for permissive ten-digit dialing and overlay implementation, but customers would not be impacted until final implementation is triggered. By requiring such "back-up" implementation, the Commission can ensure that relief is available when necessary to meet the legitimate numbering needs of carriers, while not disrupting customers prematurely. Moreover, at this time, there is insufficient information to support an



indefinite delay in implementation. The Commission should request that Neustar update its forecast of demand for NXX codes in the 314 NPA, and not act upon any proposal to delay relief implementation until such data is evaluated.
