On November 23, 2010, ATX Licensing, Inc. ("ATX") filed an application, not signed by a Missouri attorney, requesting the Commission cancel its certificate of service authority and accompanying tariff to provide interexchange telecommunication service in the State of Missouri. The Commission granted ATX a certificate of service authority to provide interexchange telecommunication service in the State of Missouri in File Number XA-2005-0272.

On November 30, 2010, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a motion requesting the Commission cancel ATX's certificate and tariff stating the application is considered a statement that the company has ceased operations and are requesting the cancellation.

The Commission need not hold a hearing, if, after proper notice and opportunity to intervene, no party requests such a hearing.¹ Therefore, if no request for a hearing or objection to Staff's motion is received, the Commission may cancel the certificate based on Staff's motion.
