The Missouri Public Service Commission has 3 afternoon. set this time for a local hearing in File No. 4 WR-2022-0303. That's the Missouri-American general rate 5 The Missouri Public Service Commission regulates 7 the rates charged by investor-owned utility companies in 8 Missouri to ensure that these rates are just and 9 reasonable. 10 The Commission also regulates the quality and 11 service and safety of the operations of these utilities. 12 The Commissioners are appointed by the Governor to fixed terms and confirmed by the Senate. The Commissioners 13 14 also employ a staff of engineers, accountants, 15 attorneys, financial analysts and other specialists in the field of utility regulation. 16 17 Good afternoon. I am Ron Pridgin. 18 Regulatory Law Judge for the Commission and I will 19 preside over this hearing.
