Page 4 1 The following proceedings began at 6:32 p.m.: 2 JUDGE CLARK: Can we go on the record now? Good evening. It's January 25 of 2023, and the current 3 4 time is 6:32 p.m. You just completed the guestion and 5 answer portion of the hearing. If you had questions about this rate case, I hope you were able to get those 6 7 questions answered. Now, I'm pleased to see that so 8 many people showed up tonight since we had to change 9 this from in person to WebEx. 10 Before I take comments, I'm going to ask that 11 anybody who is participating by phone or computer that 12 you mute yourself unless you are speaking. If you're participating by phone and you need to unmute yourself, 13 just dial *6 at that time. 14 Now, the Missouri Public Service Commission 15 has set aside this time for a local public hearing in 16 17 File No. WR-2022-0303, which is a general rate case captioned as In the Matter of Missouri-American Water 18 19 Company's Request for Authority to Implement a General 20 Rate Increase for Water and Sewer Services Provided in 21 its Missouri Services Area. 22 My name is John Clark, and I'm the Regulatory 23 Law Judge that's going to be presiding over this hearing The Missouri Public Service Commission 24 tonight. 25 regulates the rates charged by investor-owned utility

Page 5 1 companies in Missouri to ensure that those rates are 2 just and reasonable. The Commission also regulates the 3 quality of service and the safety of operations of investor-owned utilities. 4 Now, the Commission is made up of five 5 Commissioners: Chairman Scott Rupp and Commissioners 7 Maida Coleman, Jason Holsman and Glen Kolkmeyer. One 8 Commission seat is currently vacant. The Commissioners 9 are appointed by the Governor to fixed terms and 10 confirmed by the Senate. The Commissioners employ a 11 staff of engineers, accountants, attorneys, financial 12 analysts and other specialists in the areas of utility regulation. 13 With me tonight are Chairman Rupp and 14 15 Commissioner Coleman. Do I have any other Commissioners on at this time? 16 17 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: Thanks, Judge. Commissioner Holsman is here. 18 19 JUDGE CLARK: Thank you. I also have 20 Commissioner Holsman. 21 Now, the court reporter is transcribing this 22 hearing so that Commissioners that are not present will 23 have an opportunity to review the comments. I'm going 24 to begin by asking counsel to enter their appearance for 25 the record starting with Missouri-American Water

Page 6 1 Company? 2 MS. NIEMEIER: Good evening. Rachel Niemeier 3 on behalf of Missouri-American Water Company this 4 evening. Lindsay 13 VanGerpen on behalf of OPC. Thank you, Ms. VanGerpen. 14 JUDGE CLARK: 15 have some intervening parties. Are there any parties that I have not called? Okay. I hear no one. 16 17 Now, for those who would like to provide 18 comments today, I'm going to call the names listed, and 19 currently I have only one person listed. When I call your name, I'm going to ask you to -- I'm going to place 20 21 you under oath and I'm going to ask you to state and spell your name for the court reporter. Then I'll give 2.2 23 you an opportunity to offer your comments to the Commission. Now, there's no specific time limit, but 24 please try and keep your remarks short and concise. 25 Ιf

Thank you very much for 25 your comment. I don't have any questions. Is there
