Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(13) states that parties have ten days to respond to pleadings unless otherwise ordered. The Commission issued no order to the contrary, ten days have elapsed since Staff’s motion, and the Commission received no objections. Thus, the Commission will take Staff’s motion up unopposed.

The Commission finds the motion reasonable, and will grant it.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Motion to Accept Late-Filed Affidavit filed by Ameren Transmission Company of Illinois (“ATXI”) is granted.

2. This order shall be effective when issued.
