D. Responsibility of the Telephone Company

WATS is not represented as adapted to the use of customer-provided equipment and where such terminal equipment or communications system is connected to Telephone Company facilities the responsibility of the Telephone Company shall be limited to the furnishing of facilities suitable for WATS and to the maintenance and operation of such facilities in a manner proper for such service; subject to this responsibility the Telephone Company shall not be responsible for (i) the through transmission of signals generated by the customer-provided equipment or for the quality of, or defects in, such transmission, or (ii) the reception of signals by customer-provided equipment, or (iii) address signaling where such signaling is performed by customer-provided tone-type signaling equipment.
