II. SERVICE CHARGES

A. GENERAL

2. Service Charges are in addition to any other scheduled rates and charges. They apply in addition to and not in lieu of installation charges, nonrecurring charges, mileage charges or construction charges which are found in other sections of this Tariff.
3. Service Charges for the initial establishment of residential or business service are due and payable upon application for service.

B. DEFINITIONS

1. Service Charge

A Service Charge consists of one or more of the following nonrecurring charges for work functions required due to customer request or treatment.
