B. Limitations

Usage from Conference Calls, 900 Services, 800 Plan P Service, calls to Directory Assistance, calls billed to a LEC calling card, Operator Handled calls, AT&T DIRECTORY LINK Service calls, mobile, marine or cellular services are excluded from this plan. The AT&T Green Sense Plan is not available to Customers who subscribe to any of the AT&T Optional Calling Plans and Discount Plans. This plan is available where billing capability permits.

C. Application of Rates

1.5.3 Timing of Messages

- A. The chargeable duration of the message is the elapsed time between the start of conversation, with all points on the conference connection, and the time at which the disconnect signal is received from the originating service point, except as provided in 1.5.3, B., following.
- B. When the originating customer requests that one or more service points be added to or disconnected from a conference call on which conversation is in progress, that message is considered terminated and a new message is considered initiated to the revised group of service points.
- C. Chargeable time does not include time lost because of faults or defects in the service.

1.5.4 Rates and Charges

The total charge for conference connection is the sum of the set-up charge and the charge for total conversation time.

- A. The set-up charge is \$1.36 minimum to \$1.60 maximum for each main service point included in the conference call. (1)
- B. The charge for conversation time will consist of the total minutes of conversation multiplied by the appropriate charge per minute applying to the conference call.

MTS is not represented as adapted for connection to other services or communications systems. It is designed, operated and maintained to provide satisfactory transmission only between a calling and a called service point(s) equipped with suitable customer premises equipment.

The Company is responsible for the quality of transmission for MTS from demarcation point to demarcation point. The Company is not responsible for the quality of transmission of the customer's side of the demarcation points at a premises.

1.7.2 Responsibilities of the Customer

A. General

Local Exchange Company Debit Card Service is a prepaid calling card service that allows holders of debit cards of local exchange companies (LECs) with whom prior arrangements have been made to originate outbound direct dial calls. Unless otherwise specified, LEC Debit Card Customers may originate calls at any location in Missouri and may terminate calls at any other location in Missouri.

B. Exclusions

The types of calls that may not be completed while utilizing a LEC Debit Card vary by issuing LEC, and may be validated by contacting the LEC at the designated Customer Service Number printed on the LEC Debit Card. Generally, the following types of calls are not completed while utilizing a LEC Debit Card:

- Calls to 500, 700, 800 and 900 numbers
- Calls to Directory Assistance
- Calls completed via Conference Service
- Calls completed via Dual Party Relay Service
- Calls completed via Air to Ground Services
- Calls to Busy Line Verification and Interrupt Services
- Calls requiring quotation of time and charges

C. Availability of Service

LEC Debit Card Service is available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week from Dual Tone Multi Frequency phones. LEC Debit Cards are issued by participating LECs and are available from the LECs and their authorized outlets.

D. Regulations

1. LEC Debit Card Service is accessed using the LEC 800 number printed on the card.
2. All calls must be charged against a LEC Debit Card that has a sufficient available balance.
