D. DAMAGE TO A PRIVATE LINE SERVICE

2.6.1 GENERAL

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The charge for a private line service may be a recurring and/or a nonrecurring charge. Public Service Commission

2.6.2 APPLICATION OF CHARGES

The charges billed are based on the rates that are in effect in this tariff during the period that the private line service is furnished. If the rates for a period covered by a bill change after the bill has been rendered, the bill will be adjusted to reflect the new charges (see Fractional Charges and Credits, Section 2.6.9).

2.6.3 PAYMENT OF CHARGES

Payment is due upon presentation of a bill for the private line service furnished. A private line service may be discontinued for nonpayment of a bill (see Violation of Regulations, Section 2.9).

2.6.4 MINIMUM PAYMENT PERIOD AND NOTICE OF DISCONTINUANCE

A. MINIMUM PAYMENT PERIOD

The minimum payment period is the minimum period for which the Customer is required to make payment for the private line service. The charges applicable to the minimum payment period include the recurring charge(s) plus any nonrecurring and/or special construction charge(s) that may apply.
