ORDER GRANTING PROTECTIVE ORDER

On July 7, 2022, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed an application for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) authorizing it to construct, install, own, operate, maintain, and otherwise control and manage a 200 megawatt solar generation facility in Audrain and Ralls Counties, Missouri pursuant to a Build Transfer Agreement (BTA) with EDF Renewables Development. On that same date, Ameren Missouri filed a *Motion for Protective Order* seeking an order designating as "Highly Confidential" under Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.135(4) the following:

(1) the negotiated terms and conditions of the BTA (and documents reflecting such terms and conditions) (BTA Terms) attached to the direct testimony of Ameren Missouri witness Scott Wibbenmeyer;

(2) cost and pricing information and the BTA Terms reflected inWibbenmeyer's direct testimony;

(3) the terms and conditions of agreements (and documents reflecting such terms and conditions) with entities who will construct the solar and transmissionrelated assets covered by the BTA; and

(4) responses (and documents reflecting responses) to Ameren Missouri's solar generation Request for Proposal (RFP).

The Commission set a deadline of July 21, 2022, for any responses to Ameren Missouri's motion. On July 21, 2022, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed *Staff's Suggestions in Opposition to Ameren Missouri's Motion for a Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.135(4) Protective Order.* Staff argued that the information at issue is already addressed under the standard for confidentiality, set out in 20 CSR 4240-2.135(2)(A)6.

On July 29, 2022, Ameren Missouri filed Ameren Missouri's Response to Staff's Suggestions in Opposition to Ameren Missouri's Motion for a Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.135(4) Protective Order. In its Response, Ameren Missouri argues that, while the information for which it seeks "highly confidential" protections may fall within the definitions of confidential information under Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.135(2)(A), the greater protection provided by "highly confidential" designation under Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.135(2)(A), the greater protection provided by "highly confidential" designation under Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.135(4) is necessary so that employees of any non-state agency entities not covered by statutory confidentiality requirements who may become parties to this case cannot access the information.

The Commission agrees with Ameren Missouri and will grant a protective order.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Ameren Missouri's *Motion for Protective Order* is granted as to the following information designated by Ameren Missouri as "highly confidential":

- a. the negotiated terms and conditions of the Build Transfer Agreement (BTA)
 (and documents reflecting such terms and conditions) (BTA Terms)
 attached to the direct testimony of Ameren Missouri witness Scott
 Wibbenmeyer;
- b. cost and pricing information and the BTA Terms reflected in Scott
 Wibbenmeyer's direct testimony;
- c. the terms and conditions of agreements (and documents reflecting such terms and conditions) with entities who will construct the solar and transmission-related assets covered by the BTA; and
- d. responses (and documents reflecting responses) to Ameren Missouri's solar generation Request for Proposal (RFP).

2. Information designated by Ameren Missouri as "highly confidential" shall be disclosed only to attorneys of record for all parties, to state agency parties and their employees covered by statutory confidentiality requirements, and to designated outside experts of any non-state agency party.

3. Except for attorneys of record for all parties, and employees of state agency employees covered by statutory confidentiality requirements, all persons authorized to access "confidential" information in this case shall complete the nondisclosure agreement attached to this order as Exhibit A.

4. Except for attorneys of record for all parties, and employees of state agency employees covered by statutory confidentiality requirements, all persons authorized to access "highly confidential" information in this case shall complete the nondisclosure agreement attached to this order as Exhibit B.

5. This order shall be effective when issued.
