APPLICABILITY

This tariff applies to Interexchange Telecommunications Services furnished by MCI Communications Services, Inc. between and among points within the State of Missouri.

Effective August 1, 2001, pursuant to the direction of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), MCI Communications Services is canceling its federal tariffs for services with certain exceptions, including those pertaining to exchange access, casual calling, and basic long distance service during a 45-day period for customers who sign up for service with a Local Exchange Carrier (LEC). International services for Residential and Small Business customers will also remain tariffed through January 27, 2002.

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INTEREXCHANGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES TARIFF

SECTION A - DEFINITION OF TERMS

For the purpose of this tariff, the following definitions shall apply:

Access Coordination

Provides for the design, ordering, installation coordination, pre-service testing, service turn-up, and maintenance on an MCI WORLDCOM or customer provided local access channel.

Access Line

A dedicated arrangement which connects a customer location to an MCI WORLDCOM terminal location or an MCI WORLDCOM switching center.

Accounting Code

A two-digit code which is available to subscribers of Option A (Dial One/Direct Dial), Option B (Credit Card) and Option C (MCI WATS) which enables them to identify individual users and thereby allocate the cost of their long distance service.

Accounting Code (Vnet Service)

Customer-defined, non-verified codes which can be used to identify a project or an account for allocating the cost of the long distance call. From a dedicated access line, an Accounting Code can consist of up to seven digits but when used with an ID Code (as defined herein), the total number of digits cannot exceed seven. From a Vnet Dial "1" telephone number, an Accounting Code will consist of two digits and cannot be dialed in conjunction with an ID Code.

Administrative Change

The modification of an existing circuit, dedicated access line or port, at the request of the customer, that involves changes to authorization codes, speed numbers, route guide, consolidation of billing within Dedicated Leased Line Service, verification of testing performed by parties other than MCI, or any other administrative change not covered by a Billing Record Change (see below for definition).

Application for Service

A standard MCI WORLDCOM order form which includes all pertinent billing, technical and other descriptive information which will enable MCI WORLDCOM to provide a communication service as required.

Attenuation Distortion

The difference between the amount of power lost at certain frequencies compared to the power lost at a frequency of 1004 Hz. Used in connection with C-Type conditioning.

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SECTION A - DEFINITION OF TERMS (Cont.)

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Authorization Code

A five-digit or 14-digit code, one or more of which are available to Metered Use Service customers to enable them to identify individual users or groups of users, and thereby allocate the costs of their long distance service.

<u>Bandwidth</u>

The total frequency band, in hertz, allocated for a channel.

Billing Record Change A change in customer billing address.

Called Station

The station called, or the terminating point of a call.

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Calling Circle

For customers subscribing to the Friends & Family Program Domestic Option A (Friends & Family Original), a Calling Circle includes U.S. telephone numbers, including the number of the Subscriber, which numbers are presubscribed to MCI WORLDCOM and enrolled in Metered Use Option A (Dial One/Direct Dial);

As used in conjunction with the Domestic Calling Promotion A, a Calling Circle includes U.S. telephone numbers, including the number of the Subscriber, which numbers are presubscribed to MCI WORLDCOM and enrolled in Metered Use Option A (Dial One/ Direct Dial);

For customers subscribing to the Friends & Family Program Domestic Option B, a Calling Circle includes U.S. telephone numbers including the number of the Subscriber, which numbers are presubscribed to MCI WORLDCOM and enrolled in Metered Use Option A (Dial One/Direct Dial).

As used in conjunction with the Friends of the Firm Program, a Calling Circle is defined as follows:

In connection with Metered Use Service Option G (Prism Plus), a Calling Circle is a group of up to twenty (20) telephone numbers, which numbers are presubscribed to MCI WORLDCOM;

The telephone numbers included in a Calling Circle may be changed by the Subscriber from time to time.

Telephone numbers which are not capable of being presubscribed to an interexchange carrier (except for the Best Friends number), and telephone numbers which are associated with MCI 800 service (other than those associated with the Personal 800 Option), or MCI 900 Service, payphone numbers, institutional telephone numbers and numbers associated with MCI WORLDCOM services other than switched services will not be eligible for inclusion in Calling Circles.

Service Commission

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Calling Station

The station from which a call is originated.

Cancellation of Order

A customer initiated request to discontinue processing a service order, either in part or in its entirety, prior to its completion. Cancellation charges will be assessed for each circuit-end or dedicated access line canceled from an order prior to its completion by MCI WORLDCOM, under the following circumstances: (1) if the local Telco has confirmed in writing to MCI WORLDCOM that the circuit-end or dedicated access line will be installed; or (2) if MCI WORLDCOM has already submitted facilities orders to an interconnecting telephone company (this differs from a Disconnection, see page 6.1 for definition).

Casual Caller

Denotes any person who uses MCI WorldCom service from an equal access end office who does not have a current account with the Company for services subject to this tanff, to include: (i) any person who has not established an account with the Company who places calls over the Company's network from an equal access area; (ii) any presubscribed customer located in an equal access area who has either voluntarily terminated his MCI WorldCom account or has had his MCI WorldCom account terminated in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in Sections B-5 and B-10; and (iii) new or allocated customers whose accounts are not yet established in the Company's billing system.

Central Office Connection

Connects the Inter-Office Channel (as defined herein) of a Dedicated Leased circuit or connects the access port of a switched channel to the Local Access Channel (as defined herein).

Channel or Circuit

A communications path between two or more points, having a bandwidth or transmission speed selected by a customer.

Channel Bank (M24 or M44)

A device that converts Analog voice frequency channels into digital formats and multiplexes these channels and/or data channels into a 1.544 mbps digital signal.

Channel Options

Features which can be added to a local access channel to change and/or augment its transmission characteristics. Typical channel options are signaling and data conditioning.

Channel Termination

The point at which MCI channel originates, terminates, or drops for the insertion or removal of a customer's signal.

CCSA

An arrangement for switched service networks in which common control MCI switching machines are used to switch network trunks. The switching machines may be shared with other users.

Collect Call

A billing arrangement which bills the charge for a long distance call to the called station's telephone number. The person agreeing to accept the call, whether they are an MCI customer are not, is responsible for all charges related to the call. Regardless of whether the person is an MCI customer or not, he or she is subject to the provisions of this tariff which are applicable to the call accepted.

Commercial Service

A switched network service which provides for dial station originations for which the subscriber pays a rate that is described as a business or commercial rate in the applicable local exchange service tariff for switched service.

Company

MCI Communications Services, Inc.

Customer

The person, firm, corporation or other entity which orders service either for its own use, as a resale carrier, or as a non-profit manager of a sharing group and which is responsible for the payment of charges and for compliance with MCI tariff regulations. For billing purposes, a customer is considered to be an account. In the Metered Use Services, if a person, firm, corporation or other entity orders the service in more than one MCI originating city, or requests the assignment of more than one account number in a particular city, each such account is a separate customer for billing purposes. A customer may also function as a Casual Caller as defined in this Tariff.

Customer-Provided Terminal Equipment

Terminal equipment, as defined herein, provided by a customer.

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Disconnection The disconnection of a circuit, dedicated access line or port connection being used for existing service. (This differs from a Cancellation, see page 5.1 for definition).

Envelope Delay Distortion

Denotes a measure of the linearity of the phase versus frequency of a channel. It is the maximum Variation over a band of frequencies of the envelope delay, which is the derivative of the phase with respect to frequency. Used in connection with C-type conditioning.

Exemption Certification

A written notification provided by the customer certifying that his or her dedicated facility should be exempted from the monthly Special Access Surcharge because (a) the facility terminates in a device not capable of interconnecting MCI 's service with the local exchange network or (b) the facility is associated with a Switched Access Service that is subject to Carrier Common Line Charges. Credit provisions are available, as detailed in Section B-7.06.

Expedite

A service order initiated at the request of the customer, plus the accompanying installation or change to related circuits, that is processed in a time period shorter than the MCI standard service interval.

Fiber-Only Routing

A channel will be provisioned exclusively on fiber optic transmission facilities between MCI points of presence.

Four-Wire Circuit

 \overline{A} circuit using two one-way transmission paths, which include two carrier paths and two wire pairs.

<u>Installation</u> The connection of a circuit, dedicated access line or port for new or additional service.

SECTION A - DEFINITION OF TERMS (CONT.)

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Institutional Phones

Telephones, other than payphones, located in public institutions such as universities, prisons, or public offices, or in hotels or motels, or in other premises where the subscriber to MCI WORLDCOM service may not be able to control access to the phones.

Inter-Office Channel

The long-haul portion of a dedicated circuit that connects two or more points of presence (as defined herein) in distant cities.

Inter-Office Conditioning

Special adjustments made to the long-haul portion of a dedicated circuit (required for data circuits only) to assure specific performance levels required for high-speed data transmission.

Interswitch Trunk A circuit which connects two CCSA switching centers.

Intermodulation Distortion

A measure of the non-linearity of a channel used in connection with D-type conditioning.

Joint Users

A person, firm or corporation designated by the customer as a user of communication facilities furnished to the customer by MCI WORLDCOM, and to whom a portion of the charge for such facilities are billed under a joint user arrangement.

LATA (Local Access Transport Area)

A geographical area established by the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia in Civil Action No. 17-49, within which a local exchange company provides communications services.

Local Access Channel

The dedicated line that connects the customer's premise to MCI WORLDCOM's point of presence (as defined herein).

Member

As used in conjunction with the Friends & Family Program or the Friends of the Firm Programs, a Member is a MCI WORLDCOM customer whose telephone number is included in a Calling Circle. An MCI WORLDCOM customer may be a Member of an unlimited number of Calling Circles.

<u>Multiline Terminating Device</u> Denotes switching equipment, key telephone type systems or other similar customer premise terminating equipment which is capable of terminating more than one access line.

Multipoint Arrangement

An arrangement whereby an Inter-Office Channel connects customer locations serviced by more than two MCI WORLDCOM Points of Presence and/or where an Inter-Office Channel connecting two or more MCI WORLDCOM Points of Presence connects three or more customer locations.

<u>Network Trunks</u> Access lines, interswitch trunks, and circuits connecting services and facilities witching centers. of MCI WORLDCOM or other carriers to MCI WORLDCOM CCSA switching centers.

Off-Network Access Line

A local exchange, foreign exchange, or WATS line connecting both incoming and outgoing traffic from an MCI WORLDCOM switched service network to the DDD network.

Non-Qualified Commercial Affinity Group:

an association or affiliation of business entities whose members/individuals are not organized for the sole purpose to qualify for the discounts described herein.

Non-Qualified Residential Affinity Group:

an association or affiliation of residential users whose members/individuals are not organized for the sole purpose to qualify for the discounts described herein.

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One-Way Transmission

The capability of transmission in only one direction.

Other Common Carrier

A person, firm, corporation or entity which subscribes to MCI WORLDCOM's communication services and facilities and resells these communication services and facilities to the public for profit. Unless otherwise indicated herein, the term "other common carrier" when used in this tariff also means "customer" and includes entities which are brokers of the service (act as intermediaries for the purposes of reselling), those entities which are processors of the service (enhance the value of the service through substantial incurred costs), and those entities which are underlying carriers (own transmission facilities).

Person-to-Person

A service for which the person originating the call specifies to the Company operator a particular person, mobile station, department, extension, or office to be reached. If the called party is unavailable and the calling party requests or agrees to speak to a party other than the party initially specified, the call is still billed as a Person-to-Person.

Physical Change

The modification of an existing circuit, dedicated access line or port, at the request of the customer, requiring some physical change or retermination.

Point of Presence

MCI WORLDCOM's physical presence in a LATA (as defined herein). Locations where MCI WORLDCOM maintains a Terminal Facility for purposes of providing Interexchange Telecommunications Services.

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Premises

Redundancy

The offering of alternate Interexchange Telecommunication Services which may be provided using one or more different routings, circuits, and/or additional equipment.

Residential Service

A switched network service which provides for dial station originations for which the subscriber pays a rate that is described as a residential, non- commercial, or non-business rate in the applicable local exchange service tariff for switched service.

Restoration

The re-establishing of service by rerouting, substitution of component parts, or otherwise, as determined by the carrier(s) involved.

<u>Route Diversity</u> Two channels which are furnished partially or entirely over two physically separate routes.

Service Group

The term "Service Group" as used in connection with MCI WATS denotes one or more MCI WATS dedicated access lines terminated in the same multiline terminating device at the same customer premises.

Shared Access

Utilization of the local exchange network facilities for origination of Vnet calls.

Shared Termination

Utilization of the local exchange network facilities for termination of Vnet calls.

Shared Transport

Utilization of MCI WORLDCOM's switched network for the long-haul portion of Vnet calls.

Special Promotional Offering

Subscriber

As used in conjunction with the Friends of the Firm Program, a Subscriber is an MCI WORLDCOM customer who undertakes to establish a Calling Circle by giving MCI WORLDCOM a list of proposed Members and their telephone numbers (ANIs). Two-Way Transmission

The capability of transmission in either direction or in both directions at once.

Two-Wire Circuit

A circuit using two one-way carrier transmission paths, plus one wire-pair.

 - .04 Customers billed for service on Southwestern Bell Telephone Company's local invoice will be subject to the provisions of Section 1.2.16 (Long Distance Availability Limits) of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company's LDMTS Tariff, PSC Mo. No. 26.

3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- .01 Service is provided and billed on the basis of a minimum period of at least one month, beginning on the date that billing becomes effective, and continues to be provided until cancelled, by the customer, in writing, on not less than 30 day's notice from the date of postmark on this letter.

- .04 MCI WORLDCOM does not guarantee or make any warranty with respect to any euipment provided by it where such equipment is used in locations containing an atmoshpere which explosive, prone to fire, dangerous or otherwise unsuitable for such equipment. The customer indemnifies and holds MCI WORLDCOM harmless from any and all loss, claims demands, suits or other action, or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted or asserted by the customer or by aany other party or persons, for any personal injury to or death of any person or persons, and for any loss, damage or destruction of any property, whether owned by the customer or others, caused or claimed to have been caused directly or indirectly by the installation, operation, failure to operate, maintenance, removal, presence, condition, location or use of such equipment so used.

Up to one requests may be made on each call to Directory Assistance. The Directory Assistance Bureau will furnish requested telephone numbers. The Directory Assistance charge applies to each call regardless whether the Directory Assistance Bureau is able to furnish the requested number. In addition to the Directory Assistance charge, the following surcharges will apply: Surcharges associated with Option G (Prism Plus) calling card calls; Option B (Credit Card); and the surcharges associated D with operator assisted calls. The Operator Dialed Surcharge will not apply to Directory Assistance calls made using an MCI Calling Card. The customer will be charged an additional undiscountable surcharge of \$0.35 per completed call. Call Completion is available to residential customers only.
