## ORDER APPROVING DEMAND SIDE INVESTMENT MECHANISM RIDER RATE ADJUSTMENT TARIFF

Issue Date: July 17, 2019

Effective Date: August 1, 2019

On June 17, 2019, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO) filed a tariff, with supporting testimony, to adjust charges related to its approved Demand Side Investment Mechanism (DSIM) rider under the Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act (MEEIA). The submitted tariff sheet carries an effective date of August 1, 2019. The Commission issued notice of the filing, set an intervention deadline, and directed the Commission's Staff to submit a recommendation. Staff submitted its recommendation on July 10, 2019, advising the Commission to approve GMO's tariff.

Commission Rules 4 CSR 240-20.093(4) and 4 CSR 240-3.163(8) require GMO to make semi-annual adjustments of its DSIM rates to reflect the amount of revenue that has been over- or under-collected. The proposed tariff sheet increases the current residential DSIM Rider rate from \$0.00019 per kWh to \$0.00373 per kWh for residential customers and increases the DSIM Rider rate from \$0.00258 per kWh to \$0.00437 per kWh for non-residential customers. For a residential customer using 1,000 kWhs, this

change will increase the customer's bill by \$3.54 per month. The proposed change would increase a non-residential customer's bill by \$1.79 for every 1,000 kWhs used.

Staff also notes that this DSIM filing includes GMO's MEEIA Cycle 2 extension through December 31, 2019, in accordance with a stipulation and agreement filed in File No. EO-2019-0132.

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-20.093(4) regarding adjustment of DSIM rates between general rate proceedings states that if the proposed adjustments are in accordance with the rule, Section 393.1075, RSMo, and the previously-approved DSIM, the Commission shall issue an order approving the tariff within sixty days after the tariff is filed. The Commission has reviewed GMO's tariff filing and Staff's recommendation and memorandum, and finds that the proposed tariff implementing the DSIM rate adjustment is in compliance with GMO's existing DSIM tariff and with all applicable statutes and regulations. The Commission will approve GMO's tariff.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company's tariff filing, assigned Tariff Tracking No. JE-2019-0224, is approved to be effective August 1, 2019, as an interim rate adjustment, subject to prudence review. The tariff sheet approved is:
