Enclosed herewith for filing with the Missouri Public Service Commission are second revised tariff sheets in reference to tariff sheet P.S.C. MO. No 7 R-30.12 and tariff sheet P.S.C. MO. No. 8 R-30.12 - language found under the Program Funding section which says any unspent funds from this sub-budget will be made available for other programs in the following year. These tariff sheets, have an issue date of February 5, 2020, and an effective date of March 6, 2020, reflected by the Company's tariffs.

In order to better serve our low-income customers that reside in our Spire Missouri service territory, we are submitting these new tariffs for your approval. With your approval, Spire will deliver the Income Eligible Multiple Family program outside of the current co-delivery territories shared with Ameren and Evergy to help spend carryover funding. Spire will keep the program administration with ICF which manages the other program efforts for the income eligible multiple family programs. Spire has drafted language to help customers utilize incentive funding by providing up to 100% of the installed measure cost in line with the Ameren Missouri Gas Tariff language.

No additional funds are being requested but Spire would like to note the funding is carryover from what was originally budgeted in FY19 that went unspent for the Income Eligible Multiple Family program. This budget will be shared with the Commission before the start of each program year and managed as a sub-budget item.
