ADDITIONAL LISTING - Any listing of a name or other authorized information in connection with a customer's telephone number in addition to that to which he is entitled in connection with his regular service.
ADJACENT EXCHANGE SERVICE - Local telephone exchange service furnished directly from the central office of a contiguous exchange to the curcomer at a flat monthly rate.

AUTHORIZED USER - A person, firm or corporation (other than the caustomes) on whose premises a telephone, Private Branch Exchange, or private line service or channel is located and who may communicate over such channels in accordance with the terms of the tariff.

BUSINESS SERVICE - Telephone service furnished to customers where the actual or obvious use is of a business, professional or occupational nature.

CENTRAL OFFICE - A switching unit in a telephone system which provides service to the general public, having the necessary equipment and operating arrangements for the terminating and interconnecting customer lines and trunks or trunks only. There may be more than one central office in a building or exchange.

CENTRAL OFFICE LINE - A circuit directly connecting an individual main station, private branch exchange switchboard or an interconmunication system with a central office.

CHANGE CHARGE - The charge a customer is required to pay for a substitution of a different type of telephone station or a rearrangement of equipment or wiring, which does not involve a change in location of the station.

CHANNEL - A path for communication between two or more stations; or rice fommissio central offices furnished in such a manner as the Company may elect, whether by wire, radio or a combination thereof and whether or not by a single physical facility or route.
CIRCUIT - A channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of telephone and other communication services.

CLASS OF SERVICE - The various categories of service generally available to the customer, such as business, residential, public, or semi-public service.

COIN TELEPHONE SERVICE - See "Public Telephone".
COMBINATION SERVICE - Telephone service furnished to a business where a residence is connected to the same line.

COMMISSIONS - A percentage of amounts handled paid as a fee in conoideration of service rendered to the Company.

COMMON BATTERY SERVICE - Manual or dial service where the electrical energy is furnished from the central office and where the operator is signaled or dial tone is obtained by lifting the receiver of the calling station.

COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM - Channels and other facilities which are capable when not connected to exchange telecommunications service, of two -way communications between customer-provided terminal equipment or Telephone Company stations.

COMPANY - A corporation, association, partnership, or individual engaged in the business of furnishing telephone and other communications services to the public.

CONNECTING ARRANGEMENT - The equipment provided by the Telephone Company to accomplish the direct electrical connection of customer-provided facilities with the facilities of the Telephone Company or of facilities of the Telephone Company with other facilities of the Telephone Company CONNECTING COMPANY - A corporation, association, partnership or individual owning or operating one or more exchanges and with which communications services are interchanged.

CONSTRUCTION CHARGE - A separate nonrecurring charge made for the construction of facilities in excess of those contemplated under the rates quoted in the exchange tariffs.

CONTINUOUS PROPERTY - The plot of ground, together with any building thereon, occupied by the customer, which is not divided by public highways or separated by property occupied by other. Where a customer occupies property on both sides of a street, alley, highway, body of water, railroad right-of-way, etc., and the properties would otherwise be continuous, such properties are treated as continuous property provide local wire or cable facilities are used and the customer furnished all local distribution pole line facilities or underground conduit required in connection therewith.

CONTRACT - The agreement between a customer and the Company under which service and facilities are furnished in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Tariffs.

CORD SWITCHBOARD - See "P.B.X. Service".
CORDLESS SWITCHBOARD - See "P.B.X. Service".
COST - The cost of labor and materials, which includes appropriate amounts to cover the Company's general operating and administrative expenses.

CUSTOMER - The individual, partnership, association or corporation which contracts for telephone service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the rules and regulations of the Company.

DATA ACCESS ARRANGEMENT - A protective connecting arrangement for use with the network control signaling unit, or in lieu of the connecting arrangement, and arrangement to identify a central office line and protective facilities and procedures to assure proper operation and protection of the telecommunications network.

DIAL SWITCHING EQUIPMENT - A unit of electromechanical or electronic switching equipment used in a Central office or in connection with <compat>ᄅ<compat>ᅳ<compat>ᄂ private branch exchange system.

DEMARCATION POINT - The point of connection provided and maintained by the terpherat * individual customer dwelling, this point of connection will generally be the modular jack inicorpofatefsior into the customer side of the Network interface Device (NID). The drop wire and the network protector will continue to be provided by, and remain the property of, the telephone company. The demarcation point is usually the point at which the telephone company wiring connects with the customer's wiring.

DIRECTORY LISTING - A publication in the Company's alphabetical directory of information relative to a customer's name or other identification and telephone number.

DISCONNECT NOTICE - The written notice sent to a customer following billing, notifying him that his service will be discontinued if charges are not satisfied by the date specified on the notice.

DROP WIRE - That portion of a circuit between the pole line or cable distributing box and the building in which the station or switchboard is located.

DUE NOTICES - See "Disconnect Notices".
ENTRANCE FACILITIES - Facilities extending from the point of entrance on private property to the premises on which service is furnished.

EXCHANGE - A geographical area established for the administration of telephone service in a specified area, called the "Exchange Area", which usually embraces a city, town or village, and its environs. It may contain one or more central offices together with the associated plant, equipment, and facilities used in furnishing communication service within that area.

EXCHANGE AREA - The territory served by an exchange.
EXCHANGE LINE - Any circuit connecting an exchange station with a central office.
EXCHANGE SERVICE - The furnishing of facilities for the telephone communication within an exchange area, in accordance with the regulations and charges specified in the Local and General Exchange Tariffs. Exchange facilities are used to establish and maintain connection between an exchange station and the other telephone plant and facilities in connection with long distance calls or extended area service calls.

EXTENSION BELL - A bell on the same circuit and operated in connection with the signaling device of the primary, extension or private branch exchange station.
EXTENSION LINE - A circuit connecting a primary station with an extension station or a circuit connecting a private branch exchange station with a private branch exchange switchboard. An extension line may terminate on a key in lieu of an instrument.
EXTENSION STATION - See "Telephone Station".
EXTRA LISTING - see "Additional Listings".
FLAT RATE SERVICE - Service furnished at a fixed monthly charge, including extended area service where applicable.
FOREIGN ATTACHMENT - Lines, instruments, appliances or apparatus not owned or furnished by the Company.
FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE - Any central office other than that which serves the area in which the customer is located.
FOREIGN ERUIPMENT - See "Foreign Attachment".
FOREIGN EXCHANGE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement applying to that portion of a central office line connecting a customer with a foreign central office, from the common boundary line to the customer's station for which a monthly charge is made in addition to the base rate for exchange service.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE - Telephone exchange service furnished to a customer through a central office of an exchange other than the exchange regularly serving the area in which the customer is located.

GRADE OF SERVICE - The term used in describing exchange service with respect to the number of main telephones which may be connected to a central office line. (one-part, two-party, four-party, multi-party.)

INDIVIDUAL LINE - An exchange line designed for the connection of one main station. (Not a private branch exchange trunk line.)

INITIAL SERVICE PERIOD - The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service and facilities, whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

INSTALLATION CHARGE - A non-recurring charge made at the time of installation of communications service or equipment, which may apply in place of or in addition to Service Charges and other applicable charges for service or equipment.

INTERCOMMUNICATING SYSTEM - An arrangement involving two or more stations which enables a user to signal and connect with other stations in the system.

JOINT USER SERVICE - An arrangement whereby an individual, firm or corporation whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the provision of separate customer service is permitted to use the service of a customer.

MEMBERSHIP FEE - An amount paid to buy a share of stock in the Company in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws of the Company.

MILEAGE - The measurement upon which charges are computed for Foreign Exchange, extension, tie and private lines and for lines serving exchange stations located outside the basp rate areatiscidemphe central office area of the serving central office.

MINIMUM CONTRACT PERIOD - Same as "Initial Service Period".
MOBILE TELEPHONE SERVICE - A communication service provided by means of radio frequencies through a land radio-telephone base station. connections may be established between two mobile or fixed units.

MORSE CHANNEL - A channel not connected with the general telephone exchange system and of the type which may be derived from telephone wire facilities by simplexing, compositing or other methods of similar character and equipped with instruments used in sending Morse Code or equipped with instruments other than telephone or typewriter equipment depending for their operation upon the variation of the flow of electrical energy, according to a specified plan or code.

MOVE CHARGE - The charge a customer is required to pay when, at his request, service is continued under the same or superseding contract at a different location on the same premises.

MULTI-LINE TELEPHONE SYSTEMS - See "Key Equipment".
MULTI-PARTY LINE - A single circuit for rendering exchange service to a number of primary stations outside the base rate area.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING UNIT - The terminal equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Telephone Company for the provision of network control signaling.

NETWORK INTERFACE DEVICE (NID) - A device wired between the telecommunications protector and the inside wiring to isolate the customer's equipment from the network.

NONRECURRING CHARGE - A one-time charge associated with certain installations, changes or transfers of services, either in lieu of or in addition to recurring monthly charges.

OPERATOR'S SET - A head set used by an operator at a switchboard or console consisting of a receiver, transmitter and necessary cords.

PARTY LINE - See "Multi-Party Line".
PORTABLE TELEPHONE SET - A telephone station equipped with cord terminting in a plug.

PREMISES - The building, portion or portions of a building on continuous property used and or occupied at one time by the customer in the conduct of his business or as a residence. Where floor space in adjoining buildings is made continuous at one or more floor levels, all floor space in both buildings is considered as the same premises insofar as the customer who uses and occupies such continuous floor space is concerned, the two buildings otherwise being considered as separate buildings.

PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SYSTEM - An arrangement of equipment consisting of switching apparatus with attendants' telephone, trunks to a central office and stations connected with the switching apparatus, providing for intercommunication between these stations and communication with the general exchange and interexchange system. Throughout this Tariff the commonly used abbreviation "P.B.X." will be substituted for the words Private Branch Exchange.
A. P.B.X. Trunk: A circuit connecting a P.B.X. system with a central office.
B. P.B.X. Station: Any station (including the operating set or sets) connected with a P.B.X. system.
C. Switchboards: Switchboards are classified as follows:

1. Cord Switchboard: A switchboard on which all lines terminate in jacks; interconnection of stations and of stations and trunk lines is established manually by means of cords equipped with plugs.

a. Multiple Cord Switchboard: A cord switchboard arranged so that each line may have two or more appearances or jack terminations.
b. Nonmultiple Cord Switchboard: A cord switchboard arranged so that each line has only one appearance or jack termination.
2. Cordless Switchboard (Key Switchboard): A switchboard on which all lines terminate on keys which may be used to interconnect stations and stations and trunk lines.
3. Dial Switchboard: A switchboard on which interconnection of stations and stations and trunk lines is established by means of dialing.
D. Battery Power: Power furnished for talking and for operating lamp or visual signals and relays.
E. Ringing Current: Current furnished by means of a circuit from a central office or some other source of supply, to enable signaling within a P.B.X. system.

PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TELEPHONE - Any telephone station connected with a private branch exchange system.

PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TRUNKS - See "Private Branch Exchange System".
PRIVATE LINE - A circuit provided to furnish communication between two or more instrumentalities directly connected to it. Such instrumentalities do not have access to the general exchange and interexchange networks.

RESIDENCE SERVICE - Telephone service furnished to customers when the actual or obvious use is for domestic purposes.

TELETYPEWRITER - A teletypewriter consists of apparatus designed for the sending and receiving, or receiving only, of typewritten messages transmitted electrically.

MO. PUBLIC SERVICE COMAM
TERMINATION CHARGE - A charge applied under certain conditions when a contract for service is terminated by the customer before the expiration of the minimum contract period.

TERMINAL EQUIPMENT ACCESSORIES - Devices, apparatus and their associated wiring, provided by a customer, which do not constitute a communications system and which, when connected to the telecommunications system of the Company, are connected either electrically, acoustically or inductively.

TIE LINE - A circuit connecting two private branch exchange systems for the purpose of interconnection between the stations connected with such systems.

TIE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement on which the rates for tie lines connecting customer's switchboard is based.

TOLL BLOCKING - Toll blocking is a service provided by carriers that lets customers elect not to allow the completion of outgoing toll calls to the Long Distance Message Telecommunications Network, this would include $1+, 0+$ and/or 0 - operator handled calls.

TOLL CENTER - A telephone switching center at which the operations (manual or dial) function (message timing, switching and recording) (manual or dial) function (message timing, switching and recording) takes place in connection with the provision of toll message service.

TOLL LINE - A circuit used exclusively for the transmission of messages between points located in different exchange areas where specific charges for each such messages are applicable.

TOLL MESSAGE - A message between stations in different exchange areas and furnished under the provisions of the applicable toll Tariff.

A APPOINTMENT CALL TOLL MESSAGE - A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communication with a specified person or persons at a specified time only.
B. MESSENGER SERVICE TOLL MESSAGE - A toll message on which at the request of the calling party, the Company arranges for a messenger to notify a person at the called address to go to a telephone.
C. PERSON-TO-PERSON TOLL MESSAGE - A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communications with a specified person or extension station at a specified location:
D. STATION-TO-STATION TOLL MESSAGE - A toll message in which the user stiputhatedeside for communication only with a specified telephone or switchboard.

TRUNK LINE - A circuit over which customers' messages are sent between two central offices or between a central office and a private branch exchange system.

UNDERGROUND SERVICE CONNECTION - A customer's "Drop" wire which is run underground from a pole line or an underground distributing cable.

WIRING PLAN - An arrangement of wiring for connecting primary and extension stations.
