RULES AND REGULATIONS APPLICABLE
TO FRANCHISE TAXES

I. GENERAL REGULATIONS:

When any legally constituted governmental body imposes a franchise, occupation, business, sales, license, excise, privilege, or similar tax of any kind on this Company, the amount thereof, insofar as practical, shall be charged on a proportionate basis to all customers receiving telephone service within the boundaries of such governed area. This tax charge, in all cases, will be in addition to the regular charges for telephone service, and will appear on the regular customer bill, identified as such.

II. METHOD OF BILLING:

All such taxes imposed on this Company may be billed periodically to each access line in proportion to the total tax divided by the number of access lines, or it may be billed monthly to each customer as a percentage of their total local service charges. If a percentage factor is used, it shall be equivalent to the ratio of the total tax to be paid by the Company, to the local service revenues, or gross receipts, etc., being taxed.

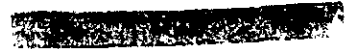
