At a Session of the Public Service Commission held at its office in Jefferson City on the 5th day of May, 1986.

In the matter of the application of GTE Sprint Communications, US

US Sprint Communications Company.

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On March 11, 1986, GTE Sprint Communications Corporation (GTE Sprint), US Telecom-Corporate Network Services Company (US Telecom-Corporate) and U.S. Telephone, Inc. filed their application for authority to transfer their certificates of public convenience and necessity to US Sprint Communications Company, contingent on receipt of the necessary federal approvals. On March 12, 1986, the Secretary of the Missouri Public Service Commission sent copies of the Applicants' tax impact statement pursuant to Section 393.190, RSMo (Supp. 1984) to the clerks of the affected counties. U.S. Telephone, Inc. filed a Notice of Change of Name of U.S. Telephone, Inc. to US Telecom-Communications Services Company and Changes of Principal Business Office with this Commission on March 17, 1986. On March 27, 1986, the Commission issued its Order authorizing U.S. Telephone, Inc. to change its name to US Telecom-Communications Service Company (US Telecom-Communications). Applicants filed their 1985 Annual Reports and updated balance sheets and income statements on March 31, 1985. The Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed its Memorandum on April 29, 1986. On April 30, 1986 MCI Telecommunications Corporation filed its Application to Intervene.

The Commission, upon consideration of the application and the recommendation of its Staff, determines that a hearing is unnecessary to resolve the issues herein and finds and concludes as follows:

Communications Services Incorporated, is the parent company of GTE Sprint. GTE

Sprint provides communications services pursuant to Federal Communications Commission

(FCC) authorization throughout the United States, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam,

Puerto Rico and many international points including Canada, Australia and the United

Kingdom. GTE Sprint also is authorized to provide intrastate telecommunications

services in Missouri.

United Telecommunications, Inc. is a holding company whose wholly-owned subsidiary, US Telecom, Inc., owns US Telecom-Communications and US Telecom

Corporate. US Telecom-Communications provides long distance telephone service to the fifty (50) states, the U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico. It is authorized to provide intrastate service in twenty (20) states including Missouri. U.S. Telecom is constructing a nationwide digital telecommunications network using fiber-optic technology which US Sprint's customers will have access to upon completion.

US Telecom Corporate offers video conferencing and specialized data communications services primarily to large corporate customers, government agencies and bulk transmission users. It is authorized to provide these services in Missouri.

Pursuant to a Letter of Intent executed on January 16, 1986 and a

Partnership Agreement signed on January 31, 1986, US Sprint was formed under the laws of New York as a general partnership of GTE Communications Services Incorporated and US Telecom, Inc. Each partner holds a fifty percent (50%) interest in US Sprint.

All of the assets, licenses, permits and other authorizations of GTE Sprint, US Telecom Corporate, US Telecom-Communications and the following subsidiaries: GTE Telenet, US Telecom-Data (formerly known as UNINET) and US Telecom, Inc. will be contributed to the partnership following the receipt of the necessary governmental

approvals. Ut_print, according to the Applicants, will be fully eparated from GTE and United telephone operating companies.

Applicants attached their financial qualifications in Attachment F to the Application and filed updated Annual Reports, balance sheets and income statements in Case No. TM-86-125. Applicants state that their technical and managerial qualifications are evidenced by their lengthy, successful operations. Applicants further state that current services and operations will remain unchanged and for the most part will be managed by the same personnel.

Applicants request permission to continue billing customers at the rates set forth in their respective intrastate tariffs until their computer systems and data bases can be merged. Applicants state that subscribers during this period would have a choice between three US Sprint services: one based on the GTE Sprint tariff, another based on the US Telecom-Corporate tariff and a third based on the US Telecom-Communications tariff. Applicants further state that there would be no charge to the customers to switch between the services.

According to the Applicants, each partner will contribute key ingredients to the joint venture: GTE Sprint has a nationwide residential customer base and is well established in international markets while US Telecom-Communications has more experience in serving the needs of large corporate users and has under construction and planned a more extensive fiber optic digital network than GTE Sprint. Applicants state that these features, coupled with the ability to share expenses and avoid duplication of facilities will make US Sprint more efficient than GTE Sprint, US Telecom-Communications or US Telecom-Corporate. Applicants contend that the combined resources of the partners will enable US Sprint to deliver a wider range of services more efficiently and thus the formation and operation of US Sprint will serve the public interest.

The Commission's Staff in its Memorandum stated that it had no objection to this application and therefore would recommend that the application be granted. The Communications Department of the Staff recommended that the Applicants advise them on

a monthly basis as to the status of the consolidated tariff and the progress toward a combined billing system until such time as a unified tariff is filed with the Commission and the combined billing system is operational.

The Commission has jurisdiction over these telephone corporations pursuant to Chapters 386 and 392, RSMo (Supp. 1985). Section 392.300, RSMo (Supp. 1984) provides that a telephone corporation shall not merge without having first secured from the Commission an order authorizing it to do so. This Commission has held that the sole issue to be decided by it in this case is whether the proposed transactions are detrimental to the public interest, Re: Union Electric Company, 26 Mo. P.S.C. (N.S.) 418 (1983), Re: Kansas Power & Light Company, 26 Mo. P.S.C. (N.S.) 254 (1983). See State ex rel. City of St. Louis v. Pub. Serv. Comm'n., 335 Mo. 448, 73 S.W.2d 393, (en banc. 1934), State ex rel. Fee Fee Sewer Trunk Sewer, Inc. v. Litz, 596 S.W.2d 466 (Mo. App. 1980).

Having considered the application filed on behalf of GTE Sprint, US
Telecom-Corporate and US Telecom-Communications and the Staff's Memorandum, the
Commission finds that the proposed transactions do not appear to be detrimental to
the public interest and therefore, should be approved contingent on receipt of the
necessary federal approvals. The Commission further finds that US Sprint should
notify the Communications Department of the Public Service Commission on a monthly
basis as to the status of the consolidated tariff and combined billing system until a
unified tariff is filed with the Commission and the combined billing system is
operational.

MCI Telecommunications Corporation (MCI) filed its Application to Intervene in this case. Therein, MCI stated that in its position as an interexchange carrier, it has a substantial interest in insuring that competition in the interexchange market is fair. MCI further stated that it neither opposes nor supports the involved application at this time, but requests permission to intervene so that it will have an opportunity to protect its interests. MCI states that it reserves the right to challenge the proposed transfer of certificates, if it is allowed to intervene, in

the event that grounds for such a challenge arise. Having considered MCI's Application to Intervene the Commission finds that there is no need to grant or deny said application since MCI neither opposes nor supports the application and there is no request that proceedings in this matter be scheduled on any ground.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That GTE Sprint Communications Corporation, US

Telecom-Corporate Network Services Company and US Telecom-Communications Services

Company be and hereby are, authorized to transfer their certificates of public convenience and necessity to US Sprint Communications Company upon the Secretary of the Commission receiving written notice that the necessary federal approvals have been received.

ORDERED: 2. That US Sprint Communications Company be and hereby is, directed to file a letter with the Secretary of the Commission within ten (10) days of receipt of the necessary federal approvals stating that said approvals have been received.

ORDERED: 3. That US Sprint Communications Company be and hereby is, directed to file a report on the 15th day of each month with the Communications

Department of the Public Service Commission regarding the status of the consolidated tariff and the unified billing system until such time as a unified tariff is filed and the combined billing system is operational.

ORDERED: 4. That US Sprint Communications Company be and hereby is, authorized to provide service under the filed effective tariffs of GTE Sprint Communications Corporation, US Telecom-Corporate Network Services Company and US Telecom-Communications Services Company from the date that it is authorized to provide service in Missouri until the Commission approves US Sprint's consolidated tariff and it becomes effective.

ORDERED: 5. That this Order shall become effective on the 15th day of

On May 19, 1986, U.S. Sprint Communications Company submitted for Commission approval its consolidated tariff with a requested effective date of July 1, 1986.

The Commission is of the opinion the proposed consolidated tariff submitted May 19, 1986, should be allowed to become effective on July 1, 1986.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That the following tariff submitted by U.S. Sprint Communications Company be, and the same is, hereby approved for service rendered on and after July 1, 1986.



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1. APPLICATION OF TARIFF

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- 1.1 This tariff applies to intercity interLATA telecommunications services furnished by GTE Sprint Communications Corporation ("GTE Sprint") of Communications Corporation ("GTE Sprint") of Communications Corporation ("GTE Sprint") of Communications within the State of Pulsion Communications
- 1.2 Intercity interLATA telecommunications services are furnished within the State of Missouri in conjunction with GTE Sprint's interstate telecommunications services originating or terminating in Missouri in accordance with the rules, conditions, and regulations which are set forth below.

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INTERCITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES REGETVED

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2. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE

GTE Sprint proposes to offer its Sprint, Sprint Advanced WANSC and Monthly Leased Line services on an intrastate interLATA basis in Missouri. These services are also provided on an interstate basis under GTE Sprint's federal tariffs.

The switched message services, e.g., Sprint and Sprint Advanced WATS, offer the shared use of interexchange communications facilities by GTE Sprint's subscribers. Subscribers use local exchange service provided by the established local telephone companies to access long distance facilities which are owned by or have been leased by GTE Sprint.

For Sprint service, access to the GTE Sprint network in end offices not converted for equal access is accomplished by dialing a local seven-digit telephone number. This call is then answered by the GTE Sprint switching equipment, which provides a second dial tone enabling the subscriber to dial his personal multi-digit identification number (plus an assigned travel identification code if entering the network other than via his primary access number), and the ten-digit long distance telephone number of the desired destination. In equal access areas, Sprint subscribers access the GTE Sprint network with one-plus dialing or by dialing 10777.

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GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE (Continued)

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Sprint subscribers, who may access the network 24 hours a day, are charged for the cost of each call made. Discounts are available for subscribers whose usage exceeds specified amounts. While there is no monthly subscription fee for the first authorization code, there is a small monthly fee for each additional code. Charges for Sprint calls are both time and distance sensitive.

INTERCITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

Sprint Advanced WATS-1 calls are originated via dedicated facilities between the subscriber's premises and GTE Sprint's terminal in the originating city and are terminated via normal shared use facilities. Charges vary with duration but do not vary with distance.

Sprint Advanced WATS-2 calls are originated, in equal access areas, via Feature Group D connections and are terminated via normal shared use facilities. Charges are time sensitive, but do not vary with distance.

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At an additional cost, Sprint and Sprint Advanced WATS subscribers may elect one or more optional features applicable to switched service. With Call Detail Tape Service, GTE Sprint provides subscribers with the monthly call detail reports of switched service usage on a magnetic tape. Speedial is an abbreviated dialing arrangement whereby the Carrier provides subscribers with the ability to call pre-selected locations by dialing a three or four digit code. A separate list of Speedial numbers is provided for each Sprint number or Authorization Code to which Speedial service applies. Insprint, available only to Sprint subscribers, is an inward calling service that is toll free to the calling party. Accounting Code Service is an arrangement whereby GTE Sprint, by means of multi-digit accounting codes associated with a switched service billing number, provides subscribers with the capability to allocate usage costs to separate cost centers.



Sprint subscribers, who may access the network 24 hours a-day, are charged for the cost of each call made. Discounts are available for subscribers whose usage exceeds specified amounts. Insprint, available only to Sprint subscribers, is an inward calling service that is toll free to the calling party. Accounting Code Service is an arrangement whereby GTE Sprint, by means of multi-digit accounting codes associated with a switched service billing number, provides subscribers with the capability to allocate usage costs to separate cost centers.

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INTERCITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

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2. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE (Continued)

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In addition to the switched message services, GTE Sprint also provides Monthly Leased Line Service. This is a non-switched point-to-point service over fully dedicated lines at a fixed monthly cost. These facilities are offered in numerous configurations depending on the individual subscriber's needs.

The GTE Sprint network circuits are designed and engineered to provide high quality transmission of the human voice with a minimum level of impairment such as noise and echo. However, overall quality may vary somewhat due to the variability in quality of the connections provided by the local telephone companies, which is beyond GTE Sprint's control.

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

3. REGULATIONS

3.1 Definitions

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Certain terms used generally throughout this tariff for services furnished by the Carrier are defined below.

Analog Transmission

The term "Analog Transmission" represents information transmitted in the form of continuously varying signal current and/or voltage.

Authorized User

The term "Authorized User" denotes a person, firm, or corporation who is authorized by the subscriber to be connected to the service of the subscriber.

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INTERCITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

REGULATIONS (Continued)

3.1 Definitions (Continued)

Band

The term "Band" represents the spectrum of frequencies within-two-definite limits.

Bandwidth

The term "Bandwidth" denotes in Hertz the approximate size of the channel or termination and represents the difference between the highest and lowest frequencies of a band.

Casual Caller (Applicable to Sprint service only)

The term "Casual Caller" denotes any party who uses the Sprint network from an equal access end office, either by dialing a one-plus or 10777-plus call, and for whom an account has not been established with GTE Sprint.

3. REGULATIONS (Continued)

3.1 Definitions (Continued)

Central Office End (Applicable to Monthly Leased Line Public Sen Service Only)

The term "Central Office End" denotes that end of a foreign exchange channel at which the subscriber has a dial access to a telephone company central office.

Channel


The term "Channel" denotes a path for electrical transmission between two or more points having a bandwidth and termination of subscriber's own choosing.

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3.1 Definitions (Continued)

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Closed End (Applicable to Sprint Advanced WATS Service only.)


The term "Closed End" refers to the Sprint Advanced WATS termination point where the Dedicated Access Line required by Section 4.2.4.1 herein is located.

Connect Charge (Applicable to Sprint Advanced WATS Service only)

The term "Connect Charge" denotes a monthly recurring charge which provides for the user to connect an access port to a Sprint switch or Technical Operating Center (TOC).

3. REGULATIONS (Continued)

3.1 Definitions (Continued)

Daytime

The term "Daytime" denotes 8:00 AM to but not including 5:00 PM local times at the originating terminal on Monday through Friday, excluding national holidays.

Dedicated Access Line (Applicable to Sprint Advanced WATS Service only)

The term "Dedicated Access Line" denotes a dedicated communications channel which terminates on a general access port provided by the Carrier.

Designated Location (Applicable to Sprint and Sprint Advanced WATS Services only)

The term "Designated Location" or "Location" refers to a terminal device (e.g., handset, PBX, facsimile machine) having a unique telephone number (or, in the case of locations served by direct inward dialing, a set of telephone numbers serving a single user), and to which the subscriber represents to Carrier that subscriber has a regular and continuing requirement for communications which are related directly to the business of the subscriber at the designated location (e.g., including but not limited to: affiliates, subsidiaries, subcontractors, suppliers, subscribers, and other regular business contacts).

Distant City (Applicable to Sprint Advanced WATS Service Only)

The term "Distant City" refers to a Sprint Advanced WATS termination point opposite a Closed End.

3. REGULATIONS (Continued)

3.1 Definitions (Continued)

Evening

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The term "Evening" denotes 5:00 PM to but not including Plant On PM local time at the originating terminal on Sunday through Friday and anytime on national holidays except when a lower rate would normally apply. These national holidays are New Year's Day, President's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

Foreign Exchange Service (Applicable to Monthly Leased Line Service only)

Foreign exchange service provides subscribers with the capability of local dialing in a remote exchange via private line service.

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INTERCITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

3. REGULATIONS (Continued)

3.1 Definitions (Continued)

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General Access Port (Applicable to Sprint Advanced WATS Service only)

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The term "General Access Port" denotes an entrance or exit device on a switching machine which provides a means of connection between that switching machine and a termination point of the service. A General Access Port may itself be a termination point of a Sprint Advanced WATS circuit.

- 3.1 Definitions (Continued)

Intercity Channels (Applicable to Monthly Leased Line Service only)

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The term "Intercity Channels" denotes those channels derived from Carrier's main network providing channels between cities. This channel system is operated in the analog mode with digital data channels derived through modern multiplexing techniques.

Intercity Circuit (Applicable to Sprint and Sprint Advanced WATS Services only)

"Intercity Circuit" denotes a circuit, created by Carrier by means of multiplex equipment, between Carrier's switches which are shared by subscribers. Shared intercity circuits will consist of identifiable and discrete circuits between a given city-pair.

Intercity Mileage (Applicable to Sprint and Monthly Leased Line Services only)

The term "Intercity Mileage" denotes the mileage, measured as the shortest distance between any two of the Carrier's technical operating centers using the Telephone Industry Standard Rate Centers ("V" & "H") associated with said Carrier's offices.

- 3.1 Definitions (Continued)

Local Access Transport Area (LATA)

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A geographical area established by the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia in Civil Action No. 17-49, within which a local exchange company provides communication services.

Local Distribution Area (Applicable to SAW & MLL services only)

The term "Local Distribution Area" denotes a geographically contiguous area surrounding the Carrier's serving location.

Local Distribution Facility (Applicable to Monthly Leased Line Service only)

The term "Local Distribution Facility" denotes the channel provided by the Carrier to connect the Carrier's network terminal office to the subscriber's premises. Normally, this channel will have a network terminal on one end (Carrier's office) and a subscriber terminal on the other end (subscriber's premises).

The term "Multidrop Channel" denotes a single channel which serves two or more separate subscriber premises from a Carrier network terminal office.


The term "Multipoint Channel" denotes a single channel serving a subscriber at three or more network terminals.

National Holidays

Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.


The term "Nighttime" denotes 11:00 PM to but not including 8:00 AM local time at the originating terminal, any time on Saturday, and all day Sunday except 5:00 PM to but not including 11:00 PM.

Normal Work Hours

The term "Normal Work Hours" denotes the time after 8:00 AM and before 5:00 PM Monday through Friday excluding Holidays.

Off-Network Access Line (ONAL) (Applicable to Sprint and Spring Advanced WATS Services only)

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The term "Off-Network Access Line" denotes a facility leased by Carrier and used in common by subscribers to gain entrance to and/or exit from the GTE Sprint network.

Other Common Carrier (OCC)

The term "Other Common Carrier" denotes a specialized or other type of common carrier authorized by the Federal Communications Commission to provide domestic or international communications service.



3.1 Definitions (Continued)

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Premises

The term "Premises" denotes a building or buildings on contiguous property (except railroad rights of-way, etc.) not separated by a public highway.

Rate Center

The term "Rate Center" denotes a geographically specified point used to determine mileage dependent rates.

Regular Billing

The term "Regular Billing" denotes a standard bill sent in the normal monthly Carrier billing cycle. This billing consists of one bill for each account assigned to the subscriber, or, in the case of Monthly Leased Line service, one bill for each subscriber together with explanatory detail showing the derivation of the charges.

Regular Voice Grade Facility (Applicable to Monthly Leased Line Service only)

The term "Regular Voice Grade Facility" denotes a communications channel with a bandwidth of approximately 2,700 Hertz (300 to 3,000 Hertz).

Subscriber

The term "Subscriber" denotes the person, firm, company or corporation, or other entity, having a communications requirement of its own which contracts for service under this tariff and is responsible for the payment of charges as well as compliance with the Carrier's regulations pursuant to this tariff.

- The liability of the Carrier for damages arising out—of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors or defects in the transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service, channels or other facilities and not caused by the negligence of the subscriber, commences upon activation of service and in no event exceeds an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the subscriber for the period of service during which such mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors or defects in transmission occur, nor does it include unavoidable damage to the subscriber's premises. For the purpose of computing such amount, a month is considered to have 30 days.
- .2 When the facilities of other carriers are used in establishing connections to points not reached by the Carrier's facilities, the Carrier is not liable for any act or omission of the other carrier or carriers. The subscriber will indemnify and save harmless the Carrier from any third party claims for such damages referred to in Section 3.4.1.
- .3 The Carrier will make no refund of overpayments by a subscriber unless the claim for such overpayment together with proper evidence be submitted within two (2) years from the date of alleged overpayment.




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- 3.5 Obligations of the Subscriber
 - .1 The Carrier shall be indemnified and saved harmless by the subscriber against claims of libel, slander, or the infringement of copyright, or for the unauthorized use of any trademark, trade name, or service mark, arising from the material transmitted over the channels, against claims for infringement of patents arising from, combining with, or using in connection with, channels furnished by the Carrier or apparatus and systems of the subscriber; and against all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the subscriber in connection with the channels provided by the Carrier.
 - .2 The facilities provided hereunder by the Carrier may be terminated in subscriber-provided terminal equipment or subscriber-provided communication systems. When such terminations are made, the subscriber shall comply with the minimum protective criteria which shall be no less stringent than the criteria generally accepted in the telephone industry or other appropriate criteria as may be prescribed by the Carrier.

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3.5 Obligations of the Subscriber (Continued)

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- The subscriber will be responsible for insuring that subscriber-.3 provided signals will not result in interference with any of the services provided by the Carrier or interfere with others using services provided by the Carrier. Physical arrangements for protection of the Carrier's facilities serving the subscriber shall be employed if needed. The subscriber will be required to use only those devices found to be necessary to insure proper operation of the local distribution facility and the intercity channel facility. The intent of this provision is to insure proper signal insertion so as to protect the entire network. All signals must be of the proper type bandwidth, and other technical parameters, so as not to damage the Carrier's equipment or degrade service to other subscribers. It shall also be the responsibility of the subscriber to provide adequate electrical power, wiring and electrical outlets necessary for the proper operation of Carrier's equipment on his premises.
- .4 The equipment and facilities which are connected with those of the Carrier shall be constructed, operated, and maintained by those providing same so as to work satisfactorily with the service furnished by the Carrier. Such equipment and facilities shall be suitable to avoid hazard or damage to Carrier's plant or injury to Carrier's employees or to the public because of the character or location of such equipment or facilities and sources of power to which it is connected. In cases in which additional protection equipment is required, this shall be provided by the subscriber or by the Carrier at the subscriber's expense.
- .5 Upon notice from the Carrier that the equipment or facilities of the subscriber, or of others so authorized to be connected, is causing or is likely to cause hazard or interference, the subscriber, or others so authorized to be connected, shall make such changes as may be necessary to remove or prevent such hazard or interference.


3.6 Use of Service

Neither subscribers nor their authorized users may use the services furnished by the Carrier for any unlawful purpose, including service configurations of switched services which, as a result of sharing thereof, are the equivalent of a service configuration which exceeds the scope of Carrier's applicable authorization. Subscribers and their authorized users may not receive any payment or other compensation for use of service, except when the subscriber is a duly authorized and regulated common carrier. This provision does not prohibit subscribers and authorized users from sharing the cost of the service on a non-profit basis. 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3.15 Interruption of Service

It shall be the obligation of the subscriber to notify the Carrier of any interruption in service. Before giving such notice, the subscriber shall ascertain that the trouble is not being caused by any action or omission of the subscriber within his control, and is not in wiring or equipment connected to the terminal of the Carrier.

When Sprint or Sprint Advanced WATS Service is interrupted for eight (8) continuous hours or more, or when Monthly Leased Line Service is interrupted for sixty (60) continuous minutes or more, credit is allowed on demand to the Carrier, computed as set forth below, provided such interruption is not shown by the Carrier to have been caused by the negligence or willful act of the subscriber, or anyone at a subscriber terminal location, or is not caused by the failure of the subscriber's equipment or power supply.

Credit is computed by multiplying the monthly rate for the service by the ratio that the number of hours (including, for Monthly Leased Line service, fractional parts calculated to the nearest tenth of an hour) in the period of interruption bears to 720 hours. (For the purpose of this computation, each month shall be considered to have 720 hours). The monthly bill on which the credit will be based shall be the non-usage sensitive billing for the month during which the interruption occurred. An interruption is measured from the time the Carrier detects trouble, or the subscriber notifies the Carrier of the interruption by an expeditious means, until the trouble is cleared. Each interruption is considered separately for purposes of establishing credit allowance. Interruptions shall be accumulated to the nearest half hour period (or for Monthly Leased Line, to the nearest tenth of an hour).

3.16 Cancellation of Application for Service

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Where the subscriber or applicant cancels an application for service prior to the start of installation of service, or prior to the start of installation of service, or prior to the start of special services. Public Service Control construction, no charge applies.

Where installation of service (Sprint Advanced WATS and Monthly Leased Line service only) has been started prior to the cancellation, a cancellation charge equal to the costs incurred by the Carrier shall apply, but in no case shall such charge exceed the charge for the minimum period of the service ordered, including applicable installation charges, if any.

Where the subscriber or applicant delays activation of his service during the period 30 days preceding the scheduled installation date for a period of more than one week, normal charges for local distribution facilities shall apply from the scheduled date of installation. In the event that the customer-induced delay exists for more than 30 days after the scheduled installation date, the Carrier may consider the delay a cancellation of application for service.

Where special construction has been started prior to cancellation, a charge equal to costs incurred in the special construction, less net salvage, applies. In determining the charge, cancelled service is treated as discontinued as of the date on which it was to have been placed in service. Installation or special construction for a subscriber or applicant is considered to have started when the Carrier incurs any expense in connection therewith or in preparation therefor which would not otherwise have been incurred, provided that the subscriber or applicant has advised the Carrier in writing to proceed with the installation or special construction.

3.17 Cancellation for Cause


The rates and charges for Monthly Leased Line service set forth in this tariff provide for furnishing service by means of facilities selected by the Carrier. Custom service is involved where one or more of the following conditions are present:

- .1 At the request of the subscriber, the Carrier provides service by means of facilities of a type other than that which the Carrier would otherwise utilize in order to provide service to the subscriber. This type of custom service might involve routing or expedited construction.
- .2 At the request of the subscriber, the Carrier provides technical assistance of a design or consulting nature, beyond that of just properly matching subscriber's equipment with that of the Carrier.

Usage charges are based on the distance and duration of each call as specified in Section 5.1.1. Discounts are available as specified in Section 5.1.2 to subscribers whose usage exceeds specified amounts.

A monthly Authorization Code charge does not apply to the subscriber's first Authorization Code. A fee as specified in Section 5.1.3 applies to each additional code. A subscriber must enter the network via an off-network access line using an authorization code except where equal access is available. In equal access areas, presubscribed Sprint subscribers access the GTE Sprint network with 1+ dialing and nonpresubscribed Sprint customers access the network by dialing 10777. Each subscriber is assigned an authorization code and a travel code. A subscriber must designate a primary local access number. A subscriber wishing to enter the network via an off-network access line other than via his primary access number or a presubscribed telephone must use the Authorization Code plus his assigned travel code.

In "equal access" end offices (Feature Group D), subscribers who are presubscribed to Sprint dial 1 plus the ten-digit telephone number of the party the caller wishes to reach. Subscribers not

presubscribed to Sprint, in calling from telephones connected to equal access end offices, dial 10777 plus the ten-digit telephone

number.

All subscribers are provided with one authorization code at no charge. A fee as specified in Section 5.1.3 applies to each additional code. A subscriber must have at least one authorization code to enter the network via an off-network access line where equal access is unavailable.

Each authorization code is enabled with a two-digit travel security feature called Travelcode. A subscriber must designate a primary local access number. A subscriber wishing to enter the network via an off-network access line other than via the primary local access number (e.g. when away from normal local calling area) must use the authorization code plus an assigned travelcode.

In equal access offices, the subscriber may choose to use his authorization code rather than 1+ dialing for billing to another address. In this instance, he would follow the dialing sequence for Feature Group A or B, whichever is applicable.

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



A monthly Call Detail Report for each Accounting Code is included in the service. A separate list is generated for each Sprint number to which Accounting Code service applies. Accounting Codes apply to Sprint per authorization code.

The term "ANI Accounting Codes" refers to accounting codes in equal access areas which are limited to use with a subscriber's presubscribed lines. Subscribers in equal access areas requiring accounting codes for traveling would need to order one (1) set of ANI Accounting Codes (for use with presubscribed lines) and one (1) regular set (for traveling).

.2 Call Detail Tape Service

An arrangement whereby Carrier provides subscriber the monthly call detail reports of switched service usage on a magnetic tape.

The number of simultaneous calls which can be received is limited only by the number of local telephone lines, in rotary arrangement, coming into the Insprint subscriber's location. A subscriber who has a non-rotary arrangement must purchase one Insprint code for each incoming line for which he desires the Insprint feature.
