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Income-Eligible Weatherization



Weatherization can help make your home more energy efficient, lowering utility bills for a long period. For income-qualified participants, KCP&L can help.



Insulation, window daulk and other weatherization measures can reduce energy bills by more than 20%. Through Income-Eligible Weatherization, low-income families can benefit from lower electricity bills, reducing dependency and freeing up the funds for more pressing issues.

- Find an agency that provides weatherization services in your area.
 They's determine if you qualify, help you apply, and guide you through the entire process.
- Receive a visit from a professional crew that will audit your home to determine your needs.
- Review recommendations from the home audit. The agency will determine the work to be done and hire contractors.
- Eanefit from trained contractors who implement your weatherization efforts. The
 average value of work completed through the program is \$2,500. Your agency will
 inspect the completed work.

Am I eligible?

Income-Eligible Weatherization is available for residential electricity customers whose household income doesn't exceed the levels listed below and who have received service for at least one year. You must also own your residence or, if you rent, get written permission from your landlord. The landlord must also agree to pay for no less than 50% of the total weatherization cost and not raise rent for at least two years from the completion date.

2014 Income Guidelines*

Your household income cannot exceed the levels listed below to be eligible for the Low-Income Weatherization Program. Typical levels represent 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.
