The Link Up Missouri Service Connection Program is a Federal Lifeline assistance program applicable to eligible residential subscribers, as defined below, and designed to promote subscribership to the telephone network among low income residential households.

- a. Service Connection Charges, as set forth in this tariff<sup>1</sup>, for initial installation of the main residential service access line, will be discounted at a rate of 50 percent or \$30.00, whichever is less. These reduced charges shall be assessed only for a single residential telephone line per eligible household at the principle place of residence.
- b. The customer may defer payment on up to \$200 of the above charges without interest for a period not to exceed one year. The deferred charges do not include any permissible security deposits required. Payments shall be equally paid over a twelve month period.
- c. A qualifying low-income customer may choose either a or b, or both a and b as described above.
- d. Link Up assistance is available for a second or subsequent time only for a principal place of residence with an address different form the residence address where assistance was previously provided.
- e. The premises at which the residence service is requested must be the applicant's principal place of residence.
- f. There is only one telephone line serving the residence premises. The residence premises household (dwelling unit) shall consist of that portion of an individual house or building or one flat or apartment occupied by a single family or individuals functioning as one domestic establishment.
- g. Link Up will not be furnished on a Foreign Exchange service.

### Feature Descriptions

- Automatic Busy Redial is an arrangement which permits the purish the particular dialog. If the redial is a summer dialog. automatically the last number dialed. If the called line is found to be busy, a 30minute queuing process begins. The customer is then given an indication that the network will attempt to set up the call when the called line is idle. The network periodically tests the busy/idle status of the called line until both lines are found idle, the customer cancels the request, or the queuing process expires. If both lines are found to be idle, the calling party is alerted with a distinctive ring signifying that the call can now be completed.

- 1. Payphone Service includes lines to which coin, coinless, card reader or a combination of coin/card reader telephones may be attached.
- Payphone Service is a two-way or, optionally, one-way originating only business exchange access line composed of the serving central office line equipment, all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer's premises, and the Network Interface Device at the demarcation point. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for long distance service and local calling.
- 3. In the case of one-way service, intercept treatment will be provided.
- 4. A maximum of one customer-provided instrument implemented pay telephone may be connected to any one Instrument or CO implemented coin line.
- 5. General Rules and Regulations found in other sections of this tariff are applicable to the provision of Payphone Service.
- 6. Directory listings may be provided under the regulations governing the furnishing of listings for business subscribers.
- 7. A Network Interface Device will be installed at a location mutually agreed upon by the Payphone Service Provider and the Company. The Network Interface Device is a company-provided jack or its equivalent. It is the point of connection between the telephone company owned wiring and wiring owned by the Customer.
- 8. One directory will be distributed to the Payphone Service Provider without charge for each payphone business exchange line.
- 9. Installation Charges and the appropriate Network Interface Device (NID) material charge are applicable for the installation, move or rearrangement of the NID on the customer's premises to establish or reestablish network access.

- 4. Directory listings may be provided under the regulations governing the public Service Commission of listings for business main line subscribers. However, listings (not indicating a business or profession) provided in connection with Customer Owned Pay Telephone Service furnished at boarding or rooming houses or at other locations where the party desiring the additional listings resides, are furnished under the regulations covering the furnishing of listings in connection with residence main line service.
- 5. Customers who provide Customer Owned Pay Telephone Service shall not charge users more than twenty-five cents (\$.25) per local telephone call.

### A. General

- 1. Digital Centrex Service is a local exchange telecommunications service available only to customers served from suitably equipped central offices. It is a central office based service arrangement which consists of host central office interface equipment and software located on Company premises. This service provides local exchange access, interexchange access, intrasystem communication and Digital Centrex feature packages as set forth in Paragraph A.4. following. A system may not be provided for stand alone service only and access to the Company's Exchange Network must be provided by the Company.
- 2. If remote units are required to provide switching capabilities for intracommunication purposes, they will be located on Company provided sites located on the customer's premises. Any remote units and all system cabling used in association with Digital Centrex Service are provided by and remain the property of the Company.
- Digital Centrex Service will be provided under this tariff for a minimum of two Digital Centrex lines up to a maximum of 200 Digital Centrex lines at rates set forth in D. following. Digital Centrex Custom Service will be provided for over 200 lines as set forth in F. following.
- 4. Digital Centrex Service offers Feature Packages 1 or 2 shown below. Feature capabilities may vary depending on the type of host central office equipment.
  - a. Features provided via Digital Centrex Service from host central office interface equipment and software include:

Basic Digital Centrex: Automatic Identification of Outward Dial (AIOD), Direct Inward Dialing, Direct Outward Dialing, Distinctive Ringing, Station-to-Station Calling, and Touch Call.

- B. Liability of the Telephone Company

In the event that a customer's basic service is interrupted and remains out of service for more than twelve (12) hours after being reported to or found to be out of service by the Company, appropriate adjustments shall be made to the customer's account upon request with a minimum of credit for twenty-four (24) hours. The adjustment shall be the pro rata part of the month's charge for local exchange service for the period of days service was inoperative and shall be accomplished by a credit on a subsequent bill for service. - 1. The Company will furnish one alphabetical directory listing on a per Digital Centrex summary account, without charge. Additional listings are offered subject to the provisions set forth in this Tariff.
- 2. The rates and charges shown for Digital Centrex Service apply to establishment of Digital Centrex Service only. Appropriate Service Charges, excluding the Central Office Line Connection Charge, set forth in Section 2 of the Company's General Exchange Tariff apply to installation of a Digital Centrex Service system up to and including the Standard Network Interface. In the case of Digital Centrex Service customer moves within the same exchange area, appropriate service charges, including the Central Office Line Connection Charge, will apply. Other services as provided for in the Tariffs of the Company may be furnished in connection with this service at rates and charges specified for such services.

### A. General

- This service provides an arrangement in connection with station-to-station message toll service whereby a customer offers patrons the privilege of calling him without the payment of a toll charge and without having to request specific reversal of the charge.
- 2. This service is available to customers to any class of central office access line service except coin box service.
- The exchanges in which such service is furnished are selected by the customer subject to the approval of the Company and the Company assigns and lists in the directory a special call number designation for use of patrons in each such exchange.
- 4. Calls for the special call number are accepted when originating at telephones located in the exchanges with which the special call number is associated, except that where several exchanges are served from one switchboard, the customer must assume all charges for calls for his special call number originating from telephones in any of the exchanges. Only those toll calls placed by calling this special number are considered as coming within the scope of this service.
- 5. The customer assumes the charges for all toll calls placed by calling this special number in each exchange.
- 6. The initial contract period for this service is three months. Service may be terminated within the initial contract period by payment of the minimum service charge to the end of the initial contract period.
