4. Temporary Tenant Listings

- (a) Residence subscribers who lease their premises for period of less than one year and request the Telephone Company to render service to their tenant without change in contract, may arrange for listing of such tenant provided that the subscriber and the tenant do not occupy the premises at the same time.

A Nonpublished Telephone Service will be furnished at the customer's request providing for the omission or deletion of the customer's telephone listing from the telephone directory and, in addition, the customer's telephone listing will be omitted or deleted from the directory assistance records, subject to the provisions set forth below.

- a. The Telephone Company will not be liable for failure or refusal to complete any call to such telephone when the call is not placed by number.
- b. The Telephone Company will try to prevent the disclosure of the number of such telephone, but will not be liable should such number be divulged inadvertently.
- c. When a customer with Nonpublished Service places a call over a 911 service to a public safety answering point, and the public safety answering point attendant places such call on called party hold, and such call is represented to the Telephone Company to be of an emergency nature, the Telephone Company will release the name and address of the calling party, where such information can be determined, to the appropriate local governmental authority responsible for the 911 service upon request of such governmental authority.

EXTENSION STATIONS

1. The monthly rates for extension stations in the Local Exchange Tariffs for each exchange include circuits not exceeding 100 feet in length connecting main and extension stations when both stations are located in the same building or on the same premises. For rates applicable to extension lines extending beyond these limits see the mileage charge section of these General Rules and Regulations.

EMPLOYEES' TELEPHONE SERVICE

A. GENERAL

1. The Employees' Telephone Service classification is available to employees of the Telephone Company with at least 12 months net credited service in the company in connection with telephone service at their residence. This classification is not available when the employee resides in a boarding and/or rooming house.
2. The primary listing provided with the service is permitted only in the name of the employee except that the listing of a married woman may be in her own or in her husband's name. EXTRA listings for other Telephone Company employees residing at the same address are permitted but no other listings are provided.

B. RATES

1. The charge for Employees' Telephone Service is 50% of the standard basic residence rate for exchange service; computed to the next higher five cent multiple.
2. The discount will not be allowed from the regular rates for toll messages, extension stations, installations, moves and changes or other miscellaneous equipment or facilities.
3. Service may be furnished wholly or partially at the expense of the company at the residence of Employees, when in its judgment, the interests of the company in rendering continuous and adequate service to the public will be advanced thereby. These arrangements shall be limited to employees who are likely to be communicated with at their residence outside of regular office hours, concerning affairs relating to the business of the Telephone Company.

Failure of the customer to participate in the inquiry of disputed charges shall constitute a waiver of the customer's right to continuance of service. If part of a charge is disputed, the customer shall pay the balance of the charge not in dispute. If the customer fails to pay that part of the charge not in dispute within five (5) days of the date the charges become delinquent, the Telephone Company may discontinue service. Disputed charges resolved in favor of the customer shall be refunded or credited promptly. The Telephone Company will, with equal effort, attempt to resolve all disagreements with business customers; however, the special payment terms stated above shall not apply.

- 5. The regular restoral of service charge will be made for reconnecting services which have been discontinued for non-payment of charges due. No allowance will be made for loss of service during the period service is disconnected for non-payment if payment is made and service reconnected before the completion of an order to terminate the service. Subsequent to the completion of an order to terminate the service, it may at the option of the Telephone Company be re-established only on the basis of a new application.
- 6. In the event the service of business subscriber has been twice denied for non-payment within the previous 12 months, service may be terminated in lieu of a third denial. Service then may be re-established at the option of the Company only on the basis of a new application.
- 6a. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this tariff, service to a residential customer may be discontinued at any time after written notice has been sent, certified mail, at his last known address or address where service is to be discontinued provided the customer does either of the following:
 - a. Incurs charges not covered by deposit or guarantee and evidences and intent not to pay such charges when due, or
 - b. Damages or evidences an intent to damage Telephone Company equipment.

The notice shall state how the customer evidenced an intent to not pay charges when due or to damage telephone equipment.

Payphone Service is a two-way or, optionally, one-way originating only business exchange access line composed of the serving central office line equipment, all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer's premises, and the Network Interface Device at the demarcation point. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for long distance service and local calling.
3. In the case of one-way service, intercept treatment will be provided.
4. A maximum of one customer-provided instrument may be connected to any one Instrument or CO implemented coin line.
5. General Rules and Regulations found in other sections of this tariff are applicable to the provision of Payphone Service.

The Company offers those features that are provided by the functionality of the Company's switches. These include coin supervision, coin control (collect and return of coins, if applicable), and answer supervision. CO implemented coin line features that are implemented by the functionality of an operator service provider, such as coin rating, coin refund, repair referral, and operator call screening, are the responsibility of the Payphone service provider (Customer).

Automatic Dialing - Announcing Device

Any automatic equipment used for delivery of a recorded message which features a storage capability of numbers to be called or a random or sequential number generator that produces numbers to be called. Such equipment may deliver recorded messages, working alone or in conjunction with other equipment, to the number called.

Channel

The term "Channel" designates the electrical path provided by the Telephone Company between two or more locations.

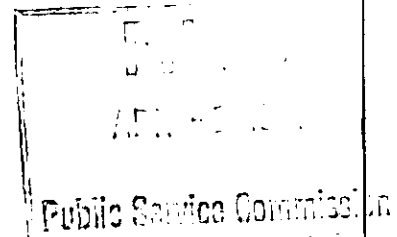


