Access Service exists between two or more exchanges when connectively complete and the between customers of such exchanges without the use of toll facilities and the interexchange circuits provided for such service are inadequate to permit completion of the connections without unreasonable delay. A list of these exchanges, along with the Access Service points is provided on Sheets 10-15 of Section I. Additive rates are not applied for this service.

It is the intent of the Company to conduct EAS surveys in those exchanges having Access Service connections and upgrade to full EAS (Two-Way) Service, using the rate additive components as set forth on Sheets 17-20 in Section I of this tariff, or determine if the service should be discontinued and the inadequate circuits removed. These surveys will be conducted in accordance with the Commerce Rules and Regulations as set out in 250-22.8 (476) Nontoll interexchange trunking service (EAS) survey procedure. The one exception to this is that due to the nature of this service, point-to-point usage studies will not be made.



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




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EXCHANGE SERVICE AREA MAP - BRADDYVILLE, IOWA (MISSOURI PORTIONE VED

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LIFELINE ASSISTANCE SERVICE

A. General

Lifeline Assistance Service is a basic single line residential service that provides voice grade access to the public switched network and includes touch calling, a standard white page listing, access to emergency services (e.g. 911, E911), access to operator services, access to interexchange services, access to directory assistance, and toll blocking service. A low-income customer is any customer who requests or receives residential essential local telecommunications service and who has been certified by the Department of Social Services (DSS) as economically disadvantaged. Qualified individuals will receive discounted services under either the low-income assistance or the disabled assistance program.

B. Low-Income Assistance

- 1. Low income assistance is available to all residential customers who demonstrate, by self certifying with the company under penalty of perjury, that they are eligible for support by participation in:
 - a. Medicaid
 - b. Food Stamps
 - c. Supplementary Security Income (SSI)
 - d. Federal Public Housing Assistance or section 8
 - e. Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
 - f. Temporary Assistance to Need Families (TANF)
 - g. National School Lunch (NSL) free lunch program
- 2. The customer shall request low income assistance through completion of a form provided by the company. The customer is responsible for notifying the Company if the customer ceases to participate in any of the qualifying assistance programs.

- Blocking Service is available only for blocking access to all NPA or prefix telephone numbers from a particular network access line, and not for blocking access to a specific NPA or prefix telephone number.

- <u>Call Waiting</u>- provides for signaling a customer, who is talking on his line, that another call has been placed to his line. He may, by switchhook operation, hold the first call, answer the second, return to the first or converse alternately with both.
- <u>Speed Calling</u> permits local and long distance calls to be placed by dialing an abbreviated code. This arrangement is available in an eight-number capacity and a thirty-number capacity.
- 3. Three-Way Calling* permits a customer to add a third party to an existing conversation, whether the original call was incoming or outgoing.
- <u>Call Forwarding*</u> permits the customer to have all incoming calls to his line automatically transferred to another dialable telephone number, while this service feature is activated. Where a toll message charge is applicable to a call between the customer's central office access line and the telephone number to which calls are to be forwarded, such charges will be billed to the Call Forwarding customer. Call Forwarding may be arranged for:
 - Fixed operation, which provides for Company establishment or change of the forwarded telephone number destination requested by the customer. In the event of an interruption in "fixed" Call Forwarding Service, the Company will reestablish the most current forwarded telephone number destination shown in its records. Feature activation and deactivation is the responsibility of the customer.

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^{*}The grade of transmission on three-way calling and call forwarding may vary depending on the distance and routing necessary to complete the call. Therefore, the normal grade end-to-end transmission is not guaranteed.

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CUSTOM CALLING SERVICES (Cont'd)

 - b. Variable operation, which provides for customer establishment and change of the forwarded telephone number destination. The customer is also responsible for feature activation and deactivation as well as reestablishing the forwarded telephone number destination upon interruption of "variable" Call Forwarding service.
- 5. Camp On/Busy Number Redial Service permits the customer to dial a camp-on code when a busy station is reached. The call is retried automatically through the central office until both parties are available. A special tone alerts the customer that a successful camp-on has been activated. When both parties are available the calling party's telephone will ring and when the customer answers, the called party's line is rung, and the two parties are connected in a normal two-way call. Only busy calls within the central office are retried automatically.
- 6. <u>Last Number/Saved Number Redial Service</u> permits the customer to dial a code which initiates the switch to automatically place a call to the last called number stored. Each time the customer dials, the most recent number is stored. Saved Number Redial allows the customer to store the called number by dialing a code at any point during a call, or upon encountering a busy or no answer condition when placing a call. The customer may place and receive any number of calls in the normal manner after a number is stored. A customer wishing to reinitiate a call to the party whose number was stored dials a code and the call is placed automatically.
- 7. <u>Cancel Call Waiting Service</u> permits the customer with Call Waiting to inhibit the operation of call waiting for one call. Call Waiting is automatically restored to the customer's line upon a disconnect.

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*The grade of transmission on three-way calling and call forwarding may vary depending on the distance and routing necessary to complete the call.

Therefore, the normal grade end-to-end transmission is not guaranteed.

- Application of Installation Charges
 - a. When Custom Calling features are provided in conjunction with the establishment of exchange telephone service or a change which involves a central office charge, the \$7.95 installation charges quoted above do not apply.

When equipment or service of a special type is requested and provided, rates and charges based on the additional costs involved to meet the requirements of each case shall apply.
- 3. Electro-Mechanical Central Offices

The Telephone Company assigns station numbers for DID in blocks of 100 numbers in all Electro-Mechanical Central Offices. When additional numbers are required, they will be made available as soon as the Telephone Company has equipment available for this purpose. The Telephone Company cannot guarantee that station numbers will be made available in all cases.

4. Stored Program Control Central Offices

The Telephone Company assigns station numbers for DID in blocks of 20 numbers or in blocks of 100 numbers in all Stored Program Control Central Offices.

- 5. Customers to DID shall be responsible for the mechanical or manual interception of calls placed to station lines or numbers not connected for service.
- 6. The rates and charges specified are in addition to the applicable trunk rate or other rates and charges for other services or facilities with which this service is associated. It is the customer's responsibility to ensure that the CPE selected is compatible to operate with DID service.

A. GENERAL

MISSOURI Public Service Commission

Regular full-time and qualified part-time employees of the Company are granted a concession in the rates for local exchange service furnished in connection with telephone service at their place of residence, and for retired employees of all companies of the General Telephone System who are receiving pensions under established pension plans of the System companies.

B. CONDITIONS

- 1. Management support and qualified part-time employees must have at least six months of service with the Company. To qualify, a part-time employee must have 1,040 hours of service.
- 2. The employee's place of residence must be within the territory served by an exchange of the Company and so located that it may be served by means of available facilities or without undue cost.
- 3. Concession rates are not allowed when the employee resides in a boarding and/or rooming house unless the transmission service is installed in the employee's private room and it is not available to other occupants of such a house.
- 4. The primary listing must be a published listing and must be in the name of the employee as it appears on the personnel records of the Company, except that the listing of a married individual may be in the name of the individual, in the name of the spouse, or dual listed.
- 5. Concession service shall not be installed or upgraded at the expense of regular customers.

C. RATES

 Salaried employees and all regular full-time and qualified part-time hourly paid employees with 20 or more years of accredited service are provided 100% concession on rates for residence local service, flat rate or usage sensitive (where available), and for service charges to establish local service.

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FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE

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A. GENERAL

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Public Service Commission

- 1. Foreign Exchange Service is exchange service from an exchange other than the one which would normally serve. This service is offered only to those customers located within the foreign exchange area.
- 2. Foreign Exchange Service does not come within the Telephone Company's general undertaking, nor does the Telephone Company obligate itself to furnish such service generally, but will do so where facilities of such a character are available as will permit satisfactory telephone transmission. It will not be provided when there may be a resulting impairment of service or when undue expense is involved.

B. REGULATIONS

- 1. Foreign Exchange Service is offered between all exchanges of this Company and between exchanges of this Company and other companies located within the boundaries of the state of Iowa. It will be furnished jointly with other companies only when those companies agree to furnish service in accordance with the provisions contained in this tariff.
- 2. Only individual central office access line or A-trunk foreign exchange service is furnished.
- 3. Off-premises services, will be furnished in accordance with the tariff provisions of the local exchange provided that facilities and operating conditions permit. Off-premises service will be furnished only for the use of the foreign exchange customer.

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NONPUBLISHED DIRECTORY SERVICE

- 1. Nonpublished directory service is a telephone number which is not in the telephone directory or the Telephone Company's directory assistance records at the request of the customer.

- 4. The Company reserves the right to forward name and address information of nonpublished telephone number service customers to governmental agencies subscribing to Enhanced 911 Service.
- 5. Acceptance by the Telephone Company of the customer's request to furnish nonpublished service does not create a relationship or obligation, direct or indirect, to any person or entity other than the customer.
- 6. The Telephone Company shall not be held liable for any damages which might result because of the customer's telephone number(s) being nonpublished.

- The magnitude and the character of the voltages and currents impressed on the Telephone Company channel by the customer premises equipment and wiring and the operation and maintenance of such equipment and wiring shall be such as not to interfere with any of the services offered by the Telephone Company or interfere with others. The characteristics of the customer premises apparatus shall be such that its connection to the Telephone Company channel does not interfere with service over other Telephone Company circuits or channels. In cases in which additional protective equipment is required, this shall be provided by the customer, at the customer's expense. The Telephone Company may, upon suitable notification to the customer, make such tests and inspections as may be necessary to determine that the above requirements are being complied with in the installation, operation, and maintenance of customer premises equipment. The Telephone Company may interrupt the channel if at any time such action should become necessary in order to protect any of its services because of departure from these requirements.

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SPECIAL REVERSED CHARGE TOLL SERVICE

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

- 8. Any party residing within the E911 Service district forfeits the privacy afforded by nonpublished service to the extent that the telephone number and the address associated with the originating station location are furnished to the PSAP.
- 9. The customer releases, indemnifies, and holds harmless the Company from any and all loss, claims, demands, suits or other action or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted or asserted by the customer or by any other party or person caused, or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly by its publication of such number or the disclosing of said number to any person.
- 10. The Company's entire liability to any person for interruption or failure of E911 Service shall be limited by the terms set forth in this section and other sections of this tariff.
- 11. The customer will have the responsibility to determine whether the system is functioning properly for its use and shall promptly notify the Company in the event the system is not functioning properly.

Application for E911 Service must be executed in writing by each customer and must be accompanied by satisfactory proof of authorization to provide E911 Service in the exchanges where service is requested. At least one local law enforcement agency must be included among the participating agencies in any E911 Service request.

 - a. The customer will answer all E911 Service calls on a 24-hour day, seven-day week basis.
 - b. The customer has the responsibility for dispatching the appropriate emergency service within the E911 Service area, or will undertake to transfer all E911 Service calls received to the governmental agency with responsibility for dispatching such services, to the extent that such services are reasonably available.
 - c. The customer will develop an appropriate method for responding to calls for nonparticipating agencies which may be directed to an E911 Service PSAP by calling parties.

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CONNECTIONS WITH CUSTOMER PREMISES EQUIPMENT TARIFFS

A. GENERAL

Customer premises equipment and wiring may be used with the facilities furnished by the Telephone Company for telecommunications service as set forth in this tariff section and Section III, General Rules and Regulations.

These tariffs shall not be construed as to prohibit connection of registered or grandfathered customer premises equipment or protective circuitry which may be directly connected to the telecommunication network in accordance with Part 68, of the F.C.C. Rules and Regulations.

B. GENERAL REGULATIONS

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1. Liability

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- a. In view of the fact that the customer has exclusive control of his communications over the facilities furnished him by the Telephone Company, and of the other uses for which facilities may be furnished him by the Telephone Company, and because of unavoidability of errors incident to the services and the use of such facilities of the Telephone Company the services and facilities furnished by the Telephone Company are subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations herein specified.
- b. The liability of the Telephone Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors or defects in transmission, or failure or defects in facilities furnished by the Telephone Company, occurring in the course of furnishing service or other facilities and not caused by the negligence of the customer, shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistake, omission, interruption, delay, error or defect in transmission, or failure or defect in facilities occurs.
- c. The Telephone Company shall be indemnified and saved harmless by the customer or customers against claims for libel, slander, or the infringement of copyright arising directly or indirectly from the material transmitted over the facilities or the use thereof, against claims for infringement of patents arising from combining with, or using in connection with, facilities furnished by the Telephone Company, apparatus and systems of the customer; and against all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with the facilities provided by the Telephone Company.

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- 2. Responsibility of the Telephone Company
 - a. The Telephone Company shall not be responsible for the installation, operation or maintenance of any customer premises equipment. - 3. Responsibility of the Customer
 - a. Where telecommunications service is available under this tariff for use in connection with customer premises equipment, the operating characteristics of such equipment shall be such as not to interfere with any of the services offered by the Telephone Company.
 - b. The customer shall subscribe to Telephone Company facilities which are in parity with the operating characteristics of the customer premises facilities.
 - c. Such use is subject to the further provisions that the customer premises equipment does not endanger the safety of Telephone Company employees or the public; damage, require change in or alteration of the facilities of the Telephone Company; interfere with the proper functioning of such facilities; impair the operation of the telecommunications system or otherwise injure the public in its use of the Telephone Company's services.

- 4. Violation of Regulations

Where any customer premises equipment is used with telecommunications service in violation of any of the provisions set forth herein, the Telephone Company will take such immediate action as necessary for the protection of the network, and will promptly notify the customer of the violation. Refer to Rules and Regulations in Section III of this tariff.

NETWORK PROTECTION CRITERIA

To protect the telecommunications network and the services furnished to the general public by the Telephone Company from harmful effects, the customer premises equipment must comply with the following minimum network protection criteria:

To prevent excessive noise and crosstalk in the network, it is necessary that the power of the signal which is applied by the customer premises equipment to the network be limited so that the signal power at the output to the network (i.e., at the input to the Telephone Company line) does not exceed 9db below one milliwatt when averaged over any three-second interval. However, to permit each customer, independent to distance from the central office, to supply signal power which at the central office approximates 12db below one milliwatt when averaged over any three-second interval, the Telephone Company, at the customer's request, will specify, for each customer location, the signal power at the output of network control signaling unit (i.e., at the input to the Telephone Company line), which shall in no case exceed one milliwatt.

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C. NETWORK PROTECTION CRITERIA (Cont'd)

- 2. To protect other services, it is necessary that the signal which is applied by the customer premises equipment to the network control signaling unit located on the customer's premises meet the following limits at the output of the network control signaling unit (i.e., at the input to the Telephone Company line):
 - a. The power in the band from 3,995 Hertz to 4,005 Hertz shall be at least 18db below the power of the signal as specified in C.1. preceding.
 - b. The power in the band from 4,000 Hertz to 10,000 Hertz shall not exceed 16db below one milliwatt.
 - c. The power in the band from 10,000 Hertz to 25,000 Hertz shall not exceed 24db below one milliwatt.
 - d. The power in the band from 25,000 Hertz to 40,000 Hertz shall not exceed 36db below one milliwatt.
 - e. The power in the band above 40,000 Hertz shall not exceed 50db below one milliwatt.
- 3. To prevent the interruption or disconnection of a call, or interference with network control signaling, it is necessary that the signal applied by the customer premises equipment to the network control signaling unit located on the customer's premises be limited so that the signal at the output of the network control signaling unit (i.e., at the input to the Telephone Company line) shall at no time have energy solely in the 2450 to 2750 Hertz band. If there is signal power at the output of the network control signaling unit in the 2450 to 2750 Hertz band, it must not exceed the power present at the same time in the 800 to 2450 Hertz band.

Recording equipment shall be equipped with or connected to a recorder tone device automatically producing a distinctive recorder tone that is repeated at intervals of approximately fifteen seconds when the recording equipment is in use, except as follows:

- such distinctive recorder tone need not be produced when the recording equipment is used by a Federal Communications Commission licensed broadcast station customer for the recording of two-way telephone conversations solely for broadcast over the air.
- recorder connector equipment without the recording tone device is allowed in connection with public fire and/or police service for the recording of two-way telephone conversations, provided that proper public authority certifies that the service will be used exclusively for receipt of emergency fire and police calls.

The types of available features offered may be expanded or deleted from time to time when determined to be in the best interest of the Telephone Company or its customers.
- B. The Telephone Company does not undertake to actually provide the services as set forth in this section. As a service to its customers the Telephone Company has contracted with third parties to make the offerings contained herein available for those customers requiring them. The rates and charges apply only when costs are passed on to the Telephone Company by contractor(s).
- C. No liability shall accrue to the Telephone Company for errors or omissions during the use of operator services except for the rates and charges for each type of service, in which case its liability shall be limited to a refund at the applicable nonrecurring charge or monthly rate for the time the error or omission occurred, after reasonable notice in writing to the Telephone Company.
- D. The customer indemnifies and holds the Telephone Company harmless from any and all liability, damages, losses, claims or demands arising from any actions, omissions, mistakes, or negligence of any kind occurring from the use of operator services.

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OPERATOR SERVICES

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BUSY VERIFICATION SERVICE

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A. GENERAL

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- 1. Busy Verification Service is furnished to customers upon request to provide Line Status or Busy Interrupt for a requested line or trunk.
- 2. This service is provided where facilities exist for Line Status or Busy Interrupt through a Telephone Company operator.
- 3. The provision of Line Status involves an operator determining the condition of a line or trunk that a customer requests to be checked. The status of this line or trunk is verified to the customer for a charge as listed below.
- 4. The provision of Busy Interrupt involves an operator interrupting a line or trunk that a customer requests to be checked. Information concerning the Busy Interrupt to this line or trunk is passed to the customer for a charge as listed below.
- 5. No request will be processed on a collect or reversal of charge basis.

B. CHARGES

 The charges listed below are in addition to the rates and charges associated with local or Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service.

Per request:	<u>Charge</u>
(a) Line Status	\$1.55
(b) Busy Interrupt	2.15

2. No charge will apply if the line situation indicates a trouble condition. No charge applies when the request is identified as an emergency request by the customer and originates from or to emergency agencies, such as police, fire, rescue, or ambulance.

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DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE SERVICE

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A. GENERAL

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Public Service Commission

Directory Assistance service is defined as furnishing aid in obtaining telephone numbers. The Directory Assistance charges specified in this tariff apply when a customer within an Iowa Number Plan Area (NPA) requests the telephone numbers of customers within the same Iowa Number Plan Area (NPA).

B. RATES

- An allowance of two direct dialed calls per month is provided without charge for each:
 - (a) Exchange Service Line
 - (b) Wide Area Telecommunications Service Line
 - (c) Mobile Telephone Service Line
 - (d) Trunk Line
- Direct dialed calls (maximum of two requests per call)
- \$.45
- 3. Requests placed through the operator (when normal DA Service is available maximum of two requests per call) will be billed the \$.45 rate.
- 4. Call allowances are not transferable between accounts.
- For the purposes of administering this tariff the full allowance will apply for service on record as of the customer's billing date.
- Rates specified in B.2 and B.3 preceding are not applicable to:
 - (a) Calls placed from hotels and motels.
 - (b) Calls placed from hospitals.

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DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE SERVICE (Cont'd)

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B. RATES (Cont'd)

6. (Cont'd)

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- (c) Calls placed from residence telephones where a member of the customer's household has been certified by a qualified authority as unable to use a directory or from the business telephone of a certified customer where other assistance is not available. A qualified authority is defined as including doctors of medicine, ophthalmologists, optometrists, registered nurses, therapists, professional staff of hospitals, institutions and public welfare agencies. Certification of physical disability sufficiently severe to prevent reading or using conventional reading materials may also be made by professional librarians or by any person whose competence in this area is acceptable to the Librarian of Congress of the United States.
- (d) Calls from certified exempt customers and charged to their calling card.

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LOCAL OPERATOR ASSISTANCE

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A. GENERAL

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Public Service Commission

- 1. Local Telecommunications Service is that of furnishing telephone communications within local service areas.
- 2. Local operator assistance is furnished to customers upon request in order to complete local calls.
- 3. For the purpose of rate application, local operator assistance charges are categorized as follows: Calling Card, Operator Station, and Person-to-Person calls.
 - a. Calling Card calls The customer dialed Calling Card rate is applicable to "O+" calls which are completed by the caller or the operator and are billed to the caller's calling card or special billing number. This rate is also applicable when no automatic recording equipment for operator assisted calls is available in order to complete a calling card or special billing number call.
 - b. Operator Station calls The Operator Station rate is applicable when calls are completed with the assistance of a Company operator, except as specified for the customer dialed Calling Card or Person-to-Person type calls. Customer dialed "O-" calls where the operator completes the call and arranges billing are charged the Operator Station rate. The call can be billed to the originating telephone number, a calling card, the called number (collect), or to a third number.

Operator Station calls also include "O+" calls when the customer is placing a collect or billed to third number call.

- c. Person-to-Person calls The Person-to-Person rate applies to customer dialed "O-" calls where the operator completes the call to a designated person or extension. The call can be billed to the originating telephone number, calling card, the called number (collect), or to a third number.
- 4. Dial Station-to-Station class of service applies to operator station-to-station calls placed sent paid from residence service lines or trunks which are certified by a qualified authority as services of persons who are disabled and unable to dial telephone numbers. All station-to-station calling card calls charged to the certified line are subject to the charges in B.1. following.

MISSOURI **Public Service Commission**

Certification is provided upon the customer's written application to the Telephone Company for each residence line or trunk to be included. Certification becomes effective with the bill following approval of the application. Requests to change to or from certification are not subject to charge. Customers may verbally identify themselves as being unable to dial a call because of their disability. Only the Dial Station-to-Station charges will apply to these sent-paid calls.

- Customers who verbally identify themselves as being unable to dial a call because of their disability will not be required to pay the operator assisted charge for sent-paid station-to-station calls from pay telephones.
- When an operator is used to complete a local call, the charges appearing in B.1., 2., and 3., following apply.

2.	For all other Operator Station calls	1.30
3.	For Person-to-Person calls	2.75

- Local Operator Assistance charges are in addition to any local usage charges and any local service charges.
- Local Operator Assistance charges do not apply to calls placed to the Telephone Company Business Office, Telephone Company Repair Service, or to emergency agencies such as 911 service, police, fire, rescue or ambulance.
- 6. These charges are not subject to any discounts.

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
