RE: Notice of Election and Withdrawal of Spectra Communications Group, LLC (Missouri) d/b/a CenturyLink Tariffs Pursuant to §392.461, RSMo.

Dear Secretary:

Section 392.461 allows telecommunications companies, upon notice to the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission"), to elect to be exempt from the requirement that they offer retail services to residential or business end users only through tariff, and to withdraw such tariffs.

Spectra Communications Group, LLC (Missouri) d/b/a CenturyLink hereby provides notice of its election to be exempt from tariff filing requirements, and of its intent to withdraw the below-listed tariffs, effective October 1, 2014.

Compliant with the requirement that electing companies publish generally available retail prices on a website, the *Local Terms of Service* containing the terms, conditions and rates for services previously provided under tariffs will be located on CenturyLink's website at <u>www.CenturyLink.com/tariffs</u>. Affected customers were advised at least thirty days in advance of CenturyLink's withdrawal of the above referenced tariffs and of the website at which *Local Terms of Service* are available.

The withdrawal of tariffs and establishment of *Local Terms of Service* will not result in any changes to customers' current services or rates. CenturyLink will notify customers in advance if future changes are made.

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

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

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

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- Long Distance Message Telecommunications SerMOCPUBLIONSERVIS theme a. furnishing of those service components required for telecommunications between service points in different local service areas in accordance with the regulations and system of charges specified in this Tariff. The message charges specified in this Tariff are in payment for Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service furnished between the calling and called service points. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service usage is classified as a transitionally competitive service.
- The charges specified in this Tariff do not encompass work being b. performed by the Telephone Company employees involved at a time when overtime wages apply due to the request of the customer, nor do they encompass work once begun being interrupted by the If the customer requests that overtime labor be . customer. performed or interrupts work once begun, an additional charge based on the additional costs involved applies.
- C. The Telephone Company does not undertake to transmit messages but furnishes the use of its services to its customers for telecommunications.
- The design, maintenance and operation of Long Distance Message d. Telecommunications Service envisions that communications will originate or terminate at a service point of the associated exchange telephone service used for LDMTS. Connections of customer premises equipment or communications svstems or interexchange customer-provided premises equipment or However, the communications systems may be made to LDMTS. Telephone Company will not be responsible for the through transmission of signals or for the quality of transmission through such connections.
- The rules and regulations as applied to billing and collection e. practices for services provided to customers are found in the General Rules and Regulations of the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff.

 - b. (Cont'd)
 - 3) The use of the service of the Telephone Company for a call or calls, anonymous or otherwise, if in a manner reasonably to be expected to frighten, abuse, torment or harass another.
 - 4) The use of profane or obscene language.
 - 5) The use of the service in such a manner as to interfere unreasonably with the use of the service by one or more other customers.
 - 6. Use of Service for Unlawful Purposes

The service is furnished subject to the condition that it will not be used for an unlawful purpose.

- 7. Obligation of the Customer

9. Application of Construction Charges

When special construction for individual customers is necessary, special construction charges may apply as set forth in the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff.

10. Definitions

<u>ACCESSORIES</u> - The term "Accessories" denotes devices which are mechanically attached to or used with the services furnished by the Telephone Company and which are independent of and not electrically, acoustically or inductively connected to the conductors in the communications path of the telecommunications system.

<u>BILL TO THIRD PARTY</u> - The term "Bill to Third Party" denotes a billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to an authorized service point as determined by the Telephone Company other than the service point originating the call or the service point where the call is terminated.

<u>BUSY INTERRUPT</u> - The term "Busy Interrupt" denotes the service whereby the operator will interrupt a call in progress at the request of a customer after the line has been verified to be busy (see Line Status Verification).

<u>CALL FORWARDING</u> - Call Forwarding denotes that feature whereby a call placed to a customer's telephone number in one exchange (the call forwarding location) is automatically forwarded by Telephone Company serving office equipment on a Long Distance Message Telecommunications Services basis only to a service point designated by said customer in another exchange within the same LATA. Provision of Call Forwarding is subject to the availability of service components.

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10. Definitions (Cont'd)

<u>CALLING CARD</u> - The term "Calling Card" denotes a billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to an authorized telecommunications company calling card number.

<u>COLLECT CALL</u> - The term "Collect Call" denotes a billing arrangement by which the charge for a call may be reversed provided the charge is accepted at the called service point. A collect call may be billed to a calling card or third party number. In the case of a public or semi-public coin telephone, the charges must be billed to a calling card or third-party number, or the call may be reoriginated from the called service point.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS</u> - Channels and other service components which are capable, when not connected to the Telecommunications Network, of two-way communications between customer premises equipment and/or Telephone Company service points.

<u>COMMUNITY OPTIONAL SERVICE (COS) CALLING SCOPE</u> - The Community Optional Service (COS) Calling Scope consists of the Target Exchange to which Petitioning Exchange customers have qualified for COS calling, plus all other exchanges with which customers in the Target Exchange have Extended Area Service (EAS).

10. Definitions (Cont'd)

COS PETITIONING EXCHANGE - The COS Petitioning Exchange is that exchange whose customers petition the MPSC to have COS calling with the customers in the COS Target Exchange.

<u>COS_TARGET_EXCHANGE</u> - The Target Exchange is the exchange to which customers in another exchange have petitioned for COS service.

<u>CUSTOMER</u> - The person, firm or corporation which orders service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the regulations of the Telephone Company.

EXCHANGE ACCESS ARRANGEMENT - (EAA) A telephone service component which permits access to and from the customer's premises and the telephone exchange network point. A telephone exchange network point is also known as a serving office.

EXTENDED AREA SERVICE (EAS) - Mandatory interexchange telephone service furnished at a flat rate between two or more exchange areas.

INITIAL AND ADDITIONAL PERIOD - The initial period denotes the interval of time allowed at the rate specified for a connection between given points. The additional period denotes the unit of time used for measuring and charging for time in excess of the initial period.

10. Definitions (Cont'd)

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<u>INTEREXCHANGE CUSTOMER(S) (IC)</u> - Denotes any individual, partnership. association, corporation, or governmental agency or any other entity which subscribes to the services offered under Tariff P.S.C. Mo. No. 2, Facilities for Intrastate Access, to provide intrastate telecommunications services for its own use or for the use of its customers (End Users).

<u>INTERFACE</u> - That point on the premises of the customer at which provision is made for connection of other than Telephone Company provided service components to service components provided by the Telephone Company.

<u>INTRALATA</u> - Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service (LDMTS) where the originating service point location and the terminating service point location are all within the same Local Access and Transport Area (LATA).

<u>LINE STATUS VERIFICATION</u> - The term "Line Status Verification" denotes the service whereby the operator will verify and provide the status of a subscriber line at the request of a customer.

LOCAL ACCESS AND TRANSPORT AREA (LATA) - The Local Access and Transport Area denotes a geographical area established for the administration of communications service. It encompasses designated local operating Telephone Company exchanges which are grouped to serve common social, economic and miscellaneous purposes.

LOCAL EXCHANGE CARRIER (LEC) - The certificated provider of basic local exchange telephone service.

<u>NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING</u> - The transmission of signals used in the telecommunications system which perform functions such as supervision (control status and charging signals), address signaling (i.e., dialing), calling and called number identification, audible tone signals, (call progress signals indicating re-order or busy conditions, alerting, coin denominations, coin collect and coin return tones) to control the operation of switching machines in the telecommunications system.

10. Definitions (Cont'd)

<u>NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING UNIT</u> - The equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Telephone Company for the provision of network control signaling.

<u>QRIGINATING EXCHANGE</u> - Telephone Company exchanges in which residential and business customers may order Extended Exchange Calling Plan (EECP) Service. A listing of all EECP originating exchanges is found in Section J.4.a. of this tariff.

<u>PERSON-TO-PERSON</u> (See Two-Point Service).

<u>SERVICE POINT</u> - When used in connection with customer provided communications channels or systems, denotes the point on the customer's premises where channels provided by or furnished to the customer are terminated in switching equipment used, in the normal mode of operation, for communications with service points or customer premises equipment located on the premises.

<u>SERVICE TERMINATING ARRANGEMENT</u> - The term "Service Terminating Arrangement" denotes Telephone Company provided equipment which terminates exchange telephone service, used for Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service (LDMTS), at a customer's premises. The "Service Terminating Arrangement" provides a clearly delineated interface which facilitates the design, isolation and testing of LDMTS. Where a protective connecting arrangement is required, the "Service Terminating Arrangement" is provided as a part of the protective connecting arrangement.

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B. GENERAL REGULATIONS (Cont'd)

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10. Definitions (Cont'd)

<u>STATION</u> - The network control signaling unit, **GLPUSEC SERVICE** equipment at the customer's premises which enables the customer to establish the communications connection to effect communications through such connections; also denotes a termination of an individual exchange line or PBX trunk, provided in accordance with the provisions of this Tariff, in switching equipment located in an exchange foreign to the exchange in which the customer is located.

<u>STATION-TO-STATION</u> (See Two-Point Service).

<u>TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICE</u> - Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service is that of furnishing service for telecommunications between service points in different local service areas within the same LATA in accordance with the regulations and system of charges specified in this Tariff.

TELEPHONE COMPANY - SPECTRA COMMUNICATIONS GROUP, LLC.

<u>TERMINATING EXCHANGE</u> - Missouri exchanges in which SPECTRA Extended Exchanges Calling Plan (EECP) customers may terminate calls. A listing of EECP Originating and Terminating Exchanges is found in Section J.4.a. of this tariff.

<u>TOLL COMPLEX</u> - Generally an Operator Toll Complex, Class Four Office and its subtending toll routes as traditionally known, expanded to include certain non-operator complexes as agreed upon by the involved Local Exchange Carriers.

TWO-POINT SERVICE -

- a. <u>Person-to-Person</u>
 - That service where the person originating the call specifies to the operator a particular person to be reached, a particular mobile service point to be reached through a Mobile Telephone Service attendant, or a particular service point, department or office to be reached through a PBX attendant.

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B. GENERAL REGULATIONS (Cont'd)

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10. Definitions (Cont'd)

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- a. <u>Person-to-Person (Cont'd)</u>
 - 2) When, after the service point, mobile radio system or PBX service point called has been reached and while the connection remains established, the person originating the call requests or agrees to talk to any person other than the person specified or to any other person or mobile unit to be reached through a Mobile Telehone Service attendant, or to any other service point, department or office to be reached through a PBX attendant, the classification of the call remains person-to-person.
 - 3) When the person originating the call wishes arrangements made in advance with a particular party or service point for the establishment of a connection at a specified time (appointment call) the call is classified as person-to-person.
 - 4) The Telephone Company does not undertake in connection with person-to-person service to bring to a telephone a called person who cannot be reached at a telephone connected to the telecommunications network.

 - b. <u>Station-to-Station</u>

That service where the person originating the call:

- 1) dials the telephone number desired or
- 2) gives to the operator the telephone number of the desired service point. Mobile Telephone Service connecting circuit. PBX or PBX station which is reached directly rather than through a PBX attendant, or gives only the name and address under which the number of the desired service point. Mobile Telephone Service connecting circuit or PBX is listed, and does not specify a particular person to be reached, nor a particular mobile service point to be reached through a Mobile Telephone Service attendant, nor a particular service point. department or office to be reached through a PBX attendant.
- 11. Special Taxes, Fees and Charges
 - a. There shall be added to the customer's bill or charge as a part of the rate for service, a surcharge, equal to the pro rata share of any franchise, occupation, business, license, excise, privilege, or other similar tax, fee or charge (hereafter called "tax") now or hereafter imposed upon the Telephone Company by any taxing body or authority, whether by statute. ordinance, law or otherwise, and whether presently due or to hereafter become due.
 - b. On and after the effective date thereof, any subsequent increase, decrease, imposition or determination of liability for such taxes. fees or charges, as described above, shall be applied in the manner provided below. to the customer's bill or charge on each individual billing date.

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- 11. Special Taxes, Fees and Charges (Cont'd)
 - When such tax or taxes are imposed in terms of a WDapupur Beyment С. of money, the surcharge applicable to each customer's bill or charge, as the pro rata share of such taxes described above, shall be determined by relating the flat sum payment to the total local exchange revenues within the jurisdiction of the taxing body; the fraction so described shall be converted to a percentage; the local exchange rate shall be increased by that percentage, and applied to the customer's bill or charge, so that the amount added, when accumulated from all customers residing in the geographic jurisdiction of the body, will equal the amount of the flat sum payment.
 - d. When such tax or taxes are imposed in terms of a percentage of revenues or gross receipts, the surcharge applicable to each customer's bill or charge as the pro rata share of such taxes described above shall be determined by dividing the tax expressed as a percentage by 100% minus the tax expressed as a percentage and multiplying the decimal thus obtained by the customer's charges to which such tax applies.

- e. The Tariff charge constituting the amount of the surcharge provided for herein shall be stated separately on each customer's bill.
- f. Where more than one tax, fee or charge is imposed by a taxing body or authority, the total of such surcharge applicable to a customer may be billed to the customer as a single amount.
- 12. Time and Charges

Time and charges on long distance calls may be guoted upon request from the customer. Name association with time and charge details will be provided where service components permit. The Telephone Company reserves the right to determine the service component used where there are multiple service components.

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C. METHOD OF APPLYING RATES

- 1. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service rates between points (cities, towns, or localities) within the same LATA are based on the airline distance between rate centers. In general, each point is designated as a rate center; certain small towns or localities are assigned adjacent rate centers with which they are closely associated for communication purposes or by community of interest.
- 2. For the purpose of determining airline mileages vertical and horizontal grid lines have been established across the United States and Canada. The spacing between adjacent vertical grid lines and between horizontal grid lines represents a distance of one coordinate unit. This unit is the square root of 0.1, expressed in statute miles. A vertical (V) and a horizontal (H) coordinate is computed for each rate center from its latitude and longitude location by use of appropriate map projection for determining airline mileages, at a particular intersection of an established vertical grid line with and established horizontal grid line. The distance between any two rate centers is the airline mileage computed as explained in 3., following.
- 3. Determination of Airline Mileages
 - Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service To determine the rate distance between any two rate centers proceed as follows:
 - 1) Obtain the (V) and (H) coordinates for each rate center.
 - Obtain the difference between the (V) coordinates of the two rate centers. Obtain the difference between the (H) coordinates. NOTE: The difference is always obtained by subtracting the smaller coordinate from the larger coordinate.
 - 3) Divide each of the differences obtained in 2) by three. rounding each quotient to the nearer integer.

 - 4) Square these two integers and add the two squares. If the sum of the squares is greater than 1777, divide the integers obtained in 3) by three and repeat step 4). Repeat this process until the sum of the squares obtained in 4) is less than 1778.
 - 5) The number of successive divisions by three in steps 3) and 4) determines the value of "N". Multiply the final sum of the two squares obtained in step 4) by the multiplier specified in the following table for the value of "N" preceding:

6) Obtain the square root of product in 5) and, with any resulting fraction, round up to next higher integer. This is the message rate mileage except that when the mileage so obtained is less than the minimum rate mileage shown in 5) preceding, the minimum rate mileage corresponding to the "N" value is applicable.

D. TWO-POINT SERVICE

1. Classes of Service

Service is offered on a Dial Station-to-Station, Dial Calling Card Station-to-Station, Operator Station-to-Station or on a Person-to-Person basis. Day, Evening, Night and Weekend rates apply to all classes of service. Discounts, as specified in D.8, do not apply to service charges.

 - when an operator re-establishes a call which has been interrupted after the called number has been reached, then the Dial Station-to-Station rate shall apply.

 - 2) "Dial Calling Card Station-to-Station PUBLIC SERVICATION Station-to-station service where the person originating the call, including from a public or semi-public telephone, dials zero, then the telephone number desired and the call is completed either with or without the assistance of an operator and is billed, where automatic billing equipment is available. to a telecommunications company calling card, except:
 - when an operator records the telecommunications company calling card where no automatic recording equipment is available;
 - when an operator reaches the called telephone number and ' records the telecommunications company calling card where service components are not available for dial completion:
 - when an operator places a calling card call for a calling party who identifies himself as being handicapped and unable to dial the call because of his handicap;
 - when an operator re-establishes a dial calling card call which has been interrupted after the called number has been reached.

This class of service involves no other operator services except those necessary to complete the above described call.

- 3) "Operator Station-to-Station" is that station-to-station service other than Dial Station-to-Station and Dial Calling Card Station-to-Station. Operator Station-to-Station includes station-to-station service originating at a public or semi-public coin telephone, except for those public or semi-public telephone calls that are Dial Calling Card Station-to-Station as described above.
- 3. Person-to-Person Service
 - a. Person-to-Person Service is defined in B.10 preceding.

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D. TWO-POINT SERVICE (Cont'd)

4. Reversal of Charges (Collect Calls)

Charges for Operator Station-to-Station and Person-to-Person telephone calls may, upon request, be reversed, that is, charges against the called telephone, provided the charges are acceptable at the called telephone.

The regularly established Operator Station-to-Station and Person-to-Person rates apply.

5. Time of Day

The time when connection is established, as provided in D.6, following, determined in accordance with the time-standard or daylight saving-legally or commonly in use at the location of the rate center at the point of call origination - determines whether Day, Evening, Night, or Weekend rates apply. This rule applies to all classes of service.

6. Rates

a. Usage - All Classes of Service

- 1) Initial Period rates indicated in the Rate Table in D.8, following, are for connections of one minute or any fraction thereof.
- All additional minute rates indicated in the Rate Table in D.8, following, are for each additional minute or any fraction thereof that the connection continues beyond the initial period.
- 3) When the connection is established in one rate period and ends in another, the rate for each rate period applies to the portion of the connection occurring within that rate period. In the event that a minute of use is split between two rate periods, the rate in effect at the start of that minute applies.

- 5) Discounts apply to the charge for the initial minute occurring within the discount rate period and to all additional minutes occurring within each discount rate period. The discount is computed separately for charges in each rate period and the results are then totaled. When application of the discount results in a fractional charge, the amount will be rounded to the nearest cent.
- b. Service Charges

Service Charges apply to all exchanges in the operating territory of SPECTRA COMMUNICATIONS GROUP, LLC within the State of Missouri as listed in Section A.2 of this Tariff.

- 1) The rates in 7) and 8), following, will apply on Dial Calling Card Station-to-Station, Operator Station-to-Station and Person-to-Person service in addition to the rates as specified in D.6.a., preceding. Discounts, as specified in D.8. do not apply to service charges. Only one service charge per call will apply.

 - The Outstate Calling Area (OCA) Plan is an optional one-way Dial Station-to-Station Message Telecommunications Service (MTS) for customers in selected exchanges. See H.1.b following.
 - 2) The OCA Plan offers discounted block of time calling beyond a customer's local exchange to rate centers that fall within the Calling Scope. See H.1.c following.
 - 3) The local exchange company providing basic local exchange service in each exchange has the option to determine whether this service will be dialed as either 1+ (NXX-XXXX) or on a seven-digit basis.
 - b. Service Availability
 - The exchange listing in Section A.2 and A.3 identifies exchanges where OCA service is available.  - The Calling Scope for an OCA exchange includes all intrastate intraLATA toll rating points within a 23-mile radius. The 23-mile radius, from each exchange, is based on air miles and is measured from rate center to rate center, as defined in this Tariff.
 - 2) Customers in Kansas City MCA-5, St. Louis MCA-5 and Springfield MCA-2 exchanges will be able to subscribe to the OCA Plan; however, the 23-mile radius will not include any toll rating points within the MCA.  - d. Calling Options

Residential and Business customers can choose from two OCA options. - Two-hour block of time: This option allows subscribers two hours of calling per month at a flat rate. MTS rates are applicable for calls exceeding the two hours.
- Five-hour block of time: This option allows subscribers five hours of calling per month at a flat rate. An additional per minute rate, as identified in Rates, applies for all calls exceeding the five hour block. Time of day and holiday discounts are not applicable.

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- H. SPECTRA BLOCK-OF-TIME
 - 1. General Description

MO. FUBLIC SERVICE COMm

- a. Spectra Block-of-Time is an optional calling plan for one-way originating dial station-to-station Intrastate IntraLATA messages offered to residential local exchange customers. For all other classes of messages other than dial station-to-station, the appropriate calling rates and charges as specified in Section D of this tariff apply.
- b. Spectra Block-of-Time consists of a one hour block of time plan with a monthly flat rate for the first hour and a per minute rate for all additional IntraLATA long distance minutes exceeding the block of time.
- c. The service is applicable to customer dialed station-to-station calls as described below:
 - Dial station-to-station service is that service where the person originating the call from other than a public (coin or coinless) or semipublic telephone dials the telephone number desired and the call is completed without the assistance of a telephone company operator and the call is not billed to a number other than the originating number.

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




