1. Application of Tariff

This tariff applies to the provision of Community Optional Service (COS) in the exchanges of Grand River Mutual Telephone Corporation (the Telephone Company) where the Telephone Company is the Petitioning Exchange for COS.

2. General Regulations

A. Applicability of Provisions from the General Exchange Tariff

Unless otherwise specified in the specific provisions of this tariff, COS is subject to the following sections of Grand River Mutual Telephone Corporation Tariff P.S.C. MO. No. 1:

- 1. Section 2-General Exchange Service Applying to All Customer Contracts
- 2. Section 3-General Exchange Service Rules & Regulations of Grand River Mutual Telephone Corporation

3. Definitions

COS Calling Scope-The calling area within which a subscriber can make calls using COS service. This area includes the Target Exchange and the local calling area of the Target Exchange available through existing Extended Area Service or existing Metropolitan Service Plans tarified by the Target Exchange LEC.

COS Route-A Specific pair of Petitioning and Target Exchanges that has met the Commission's COS calling criteria and has been certified by the Commission to qualify for COS.

COS Qualifying Exchange (Qualifying Exchange)- A Petitioning Exchange which has met the Commission's COS calling criteria and has been certified by the Commission to qualify for COS for a particular COS Route.

Petitioning Exchange-An exchange of the Telephone Company which has petitioned for COS to a particular Target Exchange of the Telephone Company or of another Local Exchange Company.

Target Exchange-The exchange to which the Petitioning Exchange has requested COS.

4. Service Description

A. Community Optional Service (COS) is a plan approved by the Missouri Public Service Commission (PSC) that allows customers in a qualifying petitioning exchange to purchase intraLATA interexchange calling to customers in designated exchanges, known collectively as their COS Calling Scope, under terms, conditions and rates that differ from those applicable to Local Exchange Service and Extended Area Service (EAS) as found in tariff P.S.C. MO. No. 1 of Grand River Mutual Telephone Corporation and from Intrastate IntraLATA long distance message telecommunications service as found in the Long Distance Message Telecommunications Tariff of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company or United Telephone Company. The COS Calling Scope consists of the Target Exchange to which Petitioning Exchange customers have qualified for COS calling plus all other exchanges with which customers in the Target Exchange have mandatory EAS. Calling scopes may also include other expanded calling areas but only through the application of COS rates deemed appropriate by the MPSC.

B. COS (Rural) is provided on a route specific basis via two call directions/usage payment options. Rates are specified in 7.A. following.

1. One-Way Optional Flat Rate COS (Rural) allows customers to make unlimited calls to their COS Calling Scope for a constant monthly charge.
2. Two-Way Optional Flat Rate COS (Rural) allows customers to make unlimited calls to and receive unlimited calls from their COS Calling Scope for a constant monthly charge. In addition, this option provides a listing in and a copy of the white pages directory of the Target Exchange, if a separate Target Exchange number is used to implement the service. If the Target Exchange white page listings are already included in the Petitioning Exchange's directory, the provisioning of a copy of the Target Exchange's directory is not required.

5. Qualification Process

MISSOURI

In order to qualify for COS, customers in one exchange, known as the Petitioning Exchange, must demonstrate that a community of interest exists with customers in the exchange with which they desire COS calling, known as the Target Exchange.

A. Consideration of eligibility for COS calling is initiated by a petition filed with the PSC by any or all of the following parties:

- 1. By 25 or more cusomters in the Petitioning Exchange;
- 2. By the presiding official(s) of the appropriate city, town, village or county, served by the Petitioning Exchange;
- 3. By Missouri Office of the Public Counsel on behalf of the customers in the Petitioning Exchange;
- 4. By the Telephone Company serving the customers in the Petitioning Exchange.

B. Petitions requesting COS must specify the Target Exchange with which COS calling is requested, and be within the same LATA as the petitioning exchange. The Target Exchange may be served by another telephone company.

C. Upon issuance of a Missouri Public Service Commission order directing a calling study, the Telephone Company will conduct a study covering a one month billing period of long distance message telecommunications service traffic from the Petitioning Exchange to the Target Exchange.

D. The PSC has ruled that a community of interest is found to exist when the traffic studies show that both of the following criteria are met:

- 1. Customers in the Petitioning Exchange make an average of six calls per access line per month to the Target Exchange;
- 2. Two-thirds of the customers in the Petitioning Exchange make two or more calls per month to the Target Exchange.

E. If the criteria shown above are found to have been satisfied, the Petitioning Exchange and Target Exchange will be certified as a COS Route and the service will be implemented within 120 days of the date of the PSC order authorizing such certification, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.

6. Regulations

A. COS (Rural) Routes are specified in paragraph 8.A. below. All COS Routes have been designated "Rural".

B. Unless otherwise specified in these regulations, COS is offered to all classes and grades of residence and business customers located in a COS Qualifying Exchange.

C. COS is not offered in conjunction with Public, Semi-Public or Customer-Owned Pay Telephone services.

D. COS is offered to Hotel/Motel customers for administrative trunks only.

E. COS is designed and intended for the exclusive use of the end user customers of the Telephone Company. COS is not to be shared or resold. Upon discovery of COS being utilized in a shared or reselling arrangement, the service will be immediately disconnected.

F. Access to the Local Calling Scope of the Target Exchange

1. When a Target Exchange has Extended Area Service (EAS) as defined in the General Exchange Tariffs applicable to the Target Exchange, COS customers with service to the Target Exchange will be able to access the total extra exchange local calling scope.

F. Access to the Local Calling Scope of the Target Exchange (Continued) Public Service Commission

- 2. However, any EAS additive rate charged to customers in the Target Exchange for that extra exchange local calling scope shall apply to COS customers in the Qualifying Exchange in addition to the COS rates shown in 7.A. below. Furthermore, if the EAS additive is changed for customers in the Target Exchange, the rate change will also apply to COS customers in the Qualifying Exchange on the same date it is effective in the Target Exchange.

G. Rate Application

- 1. COS is offered on a COS Route basis. COS rates apply separately for each COS Route to which the customer subscribes.
- 2. The COS monthly rates specified in 7.A. below apply on a per line basis and are billed in advance.
- 3. All COS rates and charges apply in addition to all other rates and charges paid by the customer for other services of the Telephone Company.
- 4. Any rates or charges in the tariff of the Target Exchange for Extended Area Service (EAS) will also apply in addition to the rates shown in 7.A. below.
- 5. COS must be purchased on all exchange access lines on the accounts that are group billed. A multi-line customer may mix one-way and two-way flat rate COS on the same account.
- 6. If a customer of the company currently has a trunk-hunting arrangement and wishes to subscribe to two-way COS, two-way COS must be purchased for each line within an existing trunk-hunting group.
