- C. Upon receipt of notice from the PSC that a valid petition has been received, the Company will conduct a study of calling from the Petitioning Exchange to the Target Exchange. These calling studies will be filed with the PSC.
- D. The PSC has ruled that a community of interest is found to exist when the calling studies show that both of the following criteria are met:
 - Customers in the Petitioning Exchange make an average of six calls per access line per month to the Target Exchange;
 - 2. Two-thirds of the customers in the Petitioning Exchange make two or more calls per month to the Target Exchange.

Note that in calculating these statistics, an adjustment will be made for the number of Foreign Exchange Service lines having the open end in the Target Exchange and the closed end in the Petitioning Exchange.

The Telephone Company will implement a revenue recovery mechanism based upon anticipated subscription to Optional MCA service as provided for herein. This revenue recovery mechanism is designed to recover the actual net revenue loss associated with the provisioning of Optional MCA service. A review will be conducted after the Commission has MCA service implementation. The audit will compare the difference between the net revenue loss projections and the actual net revenue loss experienced. If the actual net revenue loss is found to be less than the revenue collected under the revenue recovery mechanism interim rates, the Telephone Company will provide a single credit to all the customers charged pursuant to the revenue recovery mechanism, on their regular monthly billing or, in the case of customers who have discontinued service during the period the interim rates are in effect, to their last known address, to reflect the difference between the actual net revenue loss and the revenue collected under this revenue recovery mechanism. This credit will include interest at the rate of 9% per annum. If the actual net revenue loss is found to be more than the revenue collected under the revenue recovery mechanism, then the revenue recovery mechanism will be adjusted to reflect revised additional revenues sufficient to recover the actual net revenue loss. At this time, the additional revenues sufficient to recover the net revenue loss would be made permanent.



1.7.1 Description

Business Reserve Line Service is an optional additional local access line service available to business customers who have a need for a low use line in addition to their primary service. Reserve Line Service is provided at a flat monthly rate with usage sensitive charges for both outgoing local calls and all incoming calls.

1.7.2 Regulations

- A. Reserve Line Service is only available to customers who have at least one of the following SWB business main services (as listed in paragraph 1.2.2) at the same customer premises as Reserve Line Service: Business Flat Rate 1-Party, Business Message Rate 1-Party, Business Measured 1-Party, Business Multiline, or Information Terminal Service.
- B. Reserve Line Service must be billed on the same account as the associated main service. If the associated main service is disconnected, the Reserve Line is also disconnected.
- C. Reserve Line Service is not provided in conjunction with Foreign Exchange Service or Foreign Serving Office Service.
- D. A maximum of one Reserve Line is provided per customer premises.
- E. A directory listing is not provided as part of Reserve Line Service. An Extra Listing may be ordered at the customer's option as described in the Directory Listings section of the General Exchange Tariff.
- F. Customer-initiated temporary suspension of service is not offered for an individual Reserve Line. If an entire account is placed on temporary suspension, the Reserve Line Service will also be suspended.
- G. The Paralleling Service restriction (General Exchange Tariff, paragraph 17.5.2) does not apply to Reserve Line Service.
- H. Reserve Line Service is only available in equipped central offices.
- I. Due to technical limitations, Reserve Line Service can not be included in a hunt group. At the customer's option, a call forwarding service may be purchased for the last line in a hunt group so that calls can be forwarded to the Reserve Line.

1.7.7 Revenue Neutrality

The Telephone Company will implement a revenue recovery mechanism based upon anticipated subscription to the COS qualifying routes as provided for herein. This revenue recovery mechanism is designed to recover the actual net revenue loss associated with the provisioning of COS. A review will be conducted after the Commission has completed an audit of COS losses and the revenue recovery mechanism gains, as a result of COS service implementation. The audit will compare the difference between the net revenue loss projections and the actual net revenue loss experienced. If the actual net revenue loss is found to be less than the revenue collected under the revenue recovery mechanism interim rates, the Telephone Company will provide a single credit to all the customers charged pursuant to the revenue recovery mechanism, on their regular monthly billing or, in the case of customers who have discontinued service during the period the interim rates are in effect, to their last known address, to reflect the difference between the actual net revenue loss and the revenue collected under this revenue recovery mechanism. This credit will include interest at the rate of 9% per annum. If the actual net revenue loss is found to be more than the revenue collected under the revenue recovery mechanism, then the revenue recovery mechanism will be adjusted to reflect revised additional revenues sufficient to recover the actual net revenue loss. 1.9 CUSTOM BIZSAVER II

1.9.1 Description

Custom BizSaver II is an optional small business package offer that includes a network access line, Caller ID, customer selected EasyOptions Services and hunting (optional). Custom BizSaver II is available at flat monthly rates. Customers must select either a month to month package rate or a 12-month, 24-month or 36-month term.

Custom BizSaver II allows customers to subscribe from one to twenty lines at discounted rates at a given location. Customer must select a Custom BizSaver II package that includes Caller ID and the customer selected EasyOptions Services on their primary line to qualify for the Custom BizSaver II package rates.

The Custom BizSaver II rates are inclusive of any applicable business Extended Area Service charges as shown in this Tariff.

1.9.2 Terms and Conditions

Custom BizSaver II (CBS II) packages are available to business customers with 1 to 20 business lines at a given location who agree to a month to month arrangement or to a 12-month, 24-month or 36-month term agreement and commit to subscribe to network access line service, Caller ID, hunting (optional) and a flexible bundle of four EasyOptions Services on their primary line.

Eligible customers have two additional line options available for lines 2 – 20:

CBS II Additional Line (ADL) Option 1 includes a network access line, Caller ID and hunting (optional). Prices are shown in PRICES following. Pay Per Use features are not eligible.

CBS II Additional Line (ADL) Option 2 includes a network access line, Caller ID, hunting (optional) and a flexible bundle of four EasyOptions Services as described in the Selection List below. Prices are shown in PRICES following. Pay Per Use features are not eligible.

Customers can add or subtract CBS II additional lines at any time without affecting the term agreement associated with the primary CBS II line.

CBS II packages are available only to customers that require 1 to 20 business exchange lines and are not available on FX Service, ISDN, Coin, PRI, Inmate, Hotel-Motel, 800/900, Hot Line, Warm Line, Telebranch, Location Routing Service, Payphone Exchange Access Service, WATS access lines, PBX, DID, Centrex, PLEXAR, or Semi-Public Coin services.

- B. Optional MCA Service is not offered in conjunction with Public, Semi-Public, Customer-Owned Pay Telephone or Cellular Service.
- C. MCA is designed and intended for the exclusive use of the end user customers of the Telephone Company. MCA is not to be shared, resold or used in any configuration of customer-provided equipment with the intent of reselling the service. With the exception of Shared Tenant Service, as described in other tariffs of the Telephone Company, MCA is available to interexchange carriers or other telecommunications service providers for administrative trunks only.
