Minimum Customer Charge Rate for Low-Income Customers

AVAILABILITY- Customers that default on payments for two (2) consecutive months will no longer be eligible for this rate, and will not be allowed to requalify for twelve (12) months. Customers must reestablish eligibility on an annual basis. This rate will be available until the effective date of new rates in Missouri American Water’s next general rate proceeding.

TARIFF QUALIFICATIONS

The program administrator will determine a customer’s eligibility using the following criteria: the customer’s household earnings meet the low-income guidelines for the Missouri Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Residential customers, who demonstrate a financial need and qualify for LIHEAP, should contact a local Community Action Agency referenced below or any subsequent program administrator whose contact information may be found on Missouri American Water’s web site. Upon qualification for LIHEAP, residential customers with a 5/8” meter will receive a discount of 80% of the fixed 5/8” meter minimum customer charge. The current fixed monthly 5/8” meter minimum customer charge for St. Joseph, Brunswick, Platte County and Lawson is \$12.00, the discount applied to the customer’s monthly bill would be \$9.60.

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Revenue Stabilization Mechanism (RSM)

AVAILABILITY – All residential (“domestic”), commercial, other public authority and sale for resale metered water customers.

SECTION A – DEFINITIONS

Actual Revenue (AR) shall mean the actual dollar amount of revenues billed to customers for the identified Service Classifications, excluding revenues arising from adjustments under this tariff and any other tariff, which were billed for the applicable Fiscal Year.

Actual Production Costs (APC) shall mean the actual dollar amount of power, chemicals, purchased water and waste disposal incurred by the Company in the Fiscal Year.

Effective Period shall mean the period for which the adjustments in Section B are to be billed to customers, and shall be the nine-month period April through December after the Filing Month.

Effective Period Usage (G) shall mean the number of 100 gallon units delivered to customers by the Company, including the number of 100 gallon units for the applicable Effective Period.

Filing Month shall mean the month in which an adjustment is determined by the Company and submitted to the Commission, on or before January 31.

Fiscal Year shall mean the Fiscal Year of the Company that ended as of the most recent December 31.

Interest (i) shall mean the Company short-term interest borrowing rate.

Previous Amortization Period shall mean the nine-month reconciliation amortization period that ended as of the most recent Fiscal Year.

Rate Case Revenue (RCR) shall mean the dollar amount of revenues reflected in the revenue requirements approved by the Commission for the applicable Service Classifications in the Company’s most recent general rate case. In a month or year in which new rates come into effect, the RCR shall be prorated based upon the number of days in the month or year under the old rates and the number of days in the month or year under the new rates. If the dollar amount of revenues is expected to change as a result of the Commission’s approval of one or more water system acquisitions by the Company, then the RCR will be adjusted to reflected the additional revenue as determined in the acquisition case. In a month or year in which the Commission approves a water acquisition by the Company, the RCR shall be prorated based upon the number of days in the month or year that do not reflect the revenues billed to customers in the acquired system(s) and the number of days in the month or year that do reflect the revenues billed to customers in the acquired system(s).

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Revenue Stabilization Mechanism (RSM) (continued)

Rate Case Production Costs (RPC) shall mean the dollar amount of power, chemicals, purchased water and waste disposal expenses reflected in revenue requirements approved by the Commission in the Company’s most recent general rate case. In a month or year in which new rates come into effect, the RPC shall be prorated based upon the number of days in the month or year under the old rates and the number of days in the month or year under the new rates. If the dollar amount of production costs is expected to change as a result of the Commission’s approval of one or more water system acquisitions by the Company, then the RPC will be adjusted to reflected the additional production costs as determined in the acquisition case. In a month or year in which the Commission approves a water acquisition by the Company, the RPC shall be prorated based upon the number of days in the month or year that do not reflect the production costs in the acquired system(s) and the number of days in the month or year that do reflect the production costs in the acquired system(s).

Upcoming Amortization Period shall mean the nine-month reconciliation amortization period commencing on April 1 following the Fiscal Year.

SECTION B – DETERMINATION OF ADJUSTMENT

The adjustment components above shall be summed together for billing purposes. If either component of the adjustments computes to \$0.0001 per 100 gallons or more, any fraction of \$0.0001 in the computed per 100 Gallons adjustment amount shall be dropped if less than \$0.00005 or, if \$0.00005 or more, shall be rounded up to the next full \$0.0001.

SECTION C – REPORTS AND RECONCILIATIONS

The Company shall file with the Commission on or before January 30 of each year, the RSM calculation and support for any annual adjustments to be effective under this tariff. The Commission Staff will have 60 days to review. The reconciliation amount will be surcharged from April 1 through December 31 of each calendar year. Any credit will be issued as soon as administratively possible.

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**Rules and Regulations Governing the Rendering of
Water Service**

P. Abandoned or unused Water Service Lines must be disconnected from the "tap" at the Company's main, and the tap(s) must be destroyed. For a corporation cock(s), destruction shall be by sawing off the outlet threads. Abandoned taps, other than brass corporation cocks, shall be destroyed as directed by the Company.

This disconnection and tap destruction shall be accomplished by the owner of the premises or the owner's authorized agent as directed by the Company. At the option of the Company the destruction of the tap may be done by others. A new connection will not be made to serve the same premises or a new premises on the same parcel of property or another premises on another parcel of property until all of the abandoned or unused Water Service Lines to the premises, referred to in the paragraph above, are disconnected and the tap(s) destroyed.

Upon customer's request to reuse an existing Water Service Line and tap to serve a new premises on a parcel of property, the Company may review the existing Water Service Line installation, and if it meets all requirements of size, materials, alignment, etc. to comply with Company's Rules, Company may approve such reuse, provided the owner of the parcel of property conveys in writing to the Company that the new premises to be added will be under construction within 180 days. Otherwise, destruction of the Water Service Line and destruction of the tap(s) is required.

If the tap is not destroyed and construction has not commenced to rebuild on the premises within 180 days, the company shall destroy the tap at the premise property owner's expense. The premise property owner shall be billed the actual cost of destroying the tap.

The Company may require a security deposit equal to the estimated cost of destroying the tap(s). Refund of this deposit will be made when either the tap(s) is reused and a meter has been set by the Company to serve the new premises, or the customer decides not to reuse the tap(s) and the customer destroys the tap(s).

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**Rules and Regulations Governing the Rendering of
Water Service**

- R. When a tap has been made to serve a private fire protection service line and a customer or owner decides either (a) not to install the private fire protection service line and piping and to cancel the private protection billing or (b) to terminate existing private fire protection service, the following are required:
 - 1. A written request for termination of private fire protection service from the customer and owner of the premises; and
 - 2. Proof that the appropriate fire protection authority has been notified that private fire protection service will not be available at the premises; and
 - 3. Destruction of the tap as provided in Rule 4. In the case of a "split water service line," that portion of the water service line providing the private fire protection service may be made unusable as directed by the Company in lieu of tap destruction.

- S. If the above requirements are not fulfilled, the Company will continue the Private Fire Protection billing in accordance with Rate Tariff F. If Private Fire Protection bills are not paid, the company may do either or both of the following:
 - 1. Transfer the unpaid balance to any other service account of the customer, and/or
 - 2. Attempt to notify the appropriate fire protection authority and the owner of the premises if either are known to the Company, and then proceed to terminate Private Fire Protection service by destroying the tap. In the case of a "split water service line" destruction of the tap will also terminate domestic service. The actual costs of Company's work, including excavation, will be billed to the customer. A new tap and service restoration will not be permitted until all bills, including any transferred bills are paid.

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
