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A. Sheet Numbering

Numbers appear in the upper-right corner of the sheet. Sheets are numbered sequentially. However, new sheets are occasionally added to the tariff. When a new sheet is added between existing sheets with whole numbers, a decimal is added. For example, the first sheet added between sheets 34 and 35 would be 34.1.

B. Sheet Revision Numbers

Revision numbers also appear in the upper-right corner of the sheet. These numbers are used to determine the most current sheet version on file with the Commission. For example, the 4th revised sheet 34 cancels the third revised sheet.

C. Paragraph Numbering Sequence

There are five levels of paragraph coding. Each level of coding is subservient to the next higher level of coding.

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SECTION I

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1. Technical Terms and Abbreviations1.1 DefinitionsMISSOURI
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Certain terms used throughout this tariff are defined as follows:

A. Access Line

A local exchange carrier provided transmission path which connects a customer location to the Carrier's terminal location or switching center.

B. Application for Service

A standard order form which includes all pertinent billing, technical, and other descriptive information which will enable the Carrier to provide the communication service as required.

C. Authorization Code

A numerical code, one or more of which are available to a Customer or Traffic Aggregator to enable him to identify individual users or groups of users on his account and to allocate the costs of his service accordingly.

D. Authorized User

A person permitted by a Customer or Traffic Aggregator to use or communicate over such services or facilities as may be provided pursuant to this tariff. Authorized Users are responsible for payment of the charges incurred in the use of carrier's service or for the designation of an End User to make such payment.

Public Service CommissionE. Automatic Dialing Device

A device provided by the Carrier which when attached to customer's telephone equipment, dials the Carrier's facilities, emits an authorization code, and forwards the number which the authorized user is calling to the Carrier's facilities.

F. Billing Cycle

A monthly period used as the basis for recurring charges or usage requirements.

G. Carrier

American Network Exchange, Inc. ("AMNEX"), unless the context means otherwise.

H. Commission - The Missouri Public Service Commission.I. Company

American Network Exchange, Inc. ("AMNEX"), unless the context means otherwise.

J. Customer

Any individual, partnership, association, trust, corporation, cooperative or governmental agency or other entity which utilizes the direct dial services provided by the Carrier on a subscription basis. A Customer, as set forth herein, is responsible for the payment of charges or for designation of an End User to make such payment.

K. Customer Provided Equipment

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Terminal Equipment or facilities provided by persons other than Carrier and connected to Carrier's services and/or facilities. The Customer or Traffic Aggregator, not the Carrier, shall be responsible for compliance with FCC Rules, 47 C.F.R. Part 68, and for all maintenance of such equipment and/or facilities.

L. Dialed Access

An arrangement whereby a Customer uses the public switched network facilities of a local exchange telephone company to access the terminal of the Carrier.

M. Direct Access

An arrangement whereby a Customer uses facilities other than the public switched network facilities of a local exchange telephone company to access the terminal of the Carrier.

N. End User

An individual or entity designated by the Authorized User to be responsible for payment of calls placed using the Carrier's services.

O. Local Access Transport Area (LATA)

A geographic area established pursuant to the AT&T/Bell System Plan of Reorganization developed under the Modified Final Judgment that defines the boundaries for provision and administration of services as between Bell operating companies, AT&T and other interexchange carriers.

P. Local Exchange Carrier (LEC)

Public Service Commission

A telephone company which furnishes local exchange services.

Q. Measured Usage Charges

A charge assessed on a per minute basis in calculating all or a portion of the charges due for a completed call over the Carrier's facilities.

R. Message Telecommunications Service (MTS)

A measured, duration and distance sensitive switched access service.

S. Premises

The space designated by a Customer or Traffic Aggregator as its place or places of business for provision of service, whether for its own communications needs or for its Authorized Users.

T. Traffic Aggregators

Any person, firm, partnership, association, trust, corporation, cooperative, governmental agency or other entity that makes telephones available to Authorized Users for the placement of telephone calls and has selected the Carrier as the provider of operator services for one or more locations within its control. These locations include, but are not limited to, telephones located in rooms, offices and similar locations in hotels, motels, hospitals, colleges, universities, airports and public or customer-owned pay telephone locations, whether or not coin operated. A Traffic Aggregator, as set forth herein, is responsible for compliance with all terms of Carrier's tariff relating to operator services.

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SECTION II

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2. Rules and Regulations2.1 Undertaking of the CarrierMISSOURI
Public Service Commission2.1.1 Scope

The Carrier is an interexchange telecommunications company providing resold long distance and operator services to Customers and Authorized Users within the State of Missouri.

2.1.2 Limitations

- A. The services provided pursuant to this tariff are offered subject to the availability of facilities and the other provisions of this tariff.
- B. The Carrier does not undertake to transmit communications or messages, but rather furnishes facilities, service and equipment for such transmissions by the Customer or Authorized User.
- C. The Carrier retains the right to deny service upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to any Customer or Traffic Aggregator who repeatedly fails to comply with the rules and regulations of this tariff, or other applicable rules, regulations or laws.
- D. If the Carrier has clear and convincing evidence that the Customer or Traffic Aggregator is in violation of the requirements of Section 3.6.3, below, the Carrier shall withhold payment of compensation to the Customer or Subscriber, as the case may be, including commissions, for any location where such violation or unlawful blocking is occurring until such time as the Customer or Subscriber complies with Section 3.6.3.

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2. Rules and Regulations (Cont'd)

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2.2 Liabilities of the Carrier

- A. Except as stated in this Section 2.2, Carrier shall have no liability for damages of any kind arising out of or related to events, acts, rights or privileges contemplated in this tariff, including but not limited to, the withholding of compensation as set forth in Section 2.1.2 above.
- B. The liability of Carrier for damages resulting in whole or in part from or arising in connection with the furnishing of service under this tariff, including but not limited to mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors or other defects or misrepresentations shall not exceed an amount equal to the charges under this tariff applicable to the specific call (or portion thereof) that was affected. No other liability in any event shall attach to Carrier.
- C. Carrier shall not be liable for any failure of performance hereunder due to causes beyond its control, including but not limited to acts of God, fires, flood or other catastrophes; any law, order, regulation, directive, action or request of the United States Government, or any other government, including state and local governments having jurisdiction over Carrier, or of any department, agency, commission, bureau, corporation or other instrumentality of any one or more of said governments, or of any civil or military authority; national emergencies, insurrections, riots, wars or other labor difficulties.
- D. Carrier shall not be liable for any act or omission of any other entity furnishing facilities, equipment, or services used by a Traffic Aggregator or Customer or any other user of Carrier's services. Nor shall Carrier be liable for any damages or losses due to the failure or negligence of any Customer, Traffic Aggregator or Authorized User or due to the failure of Customer Provided Equipment, facilities or services.

- E. Carrier shall be indemnified and saved harmless by the Customer or Traffic Aggregator from and against all loss, liability, damage and expense, including reasonable counsel fees, due to claims for libel, slander, or infringement of copyright or trademark in connection with any material transmitted by any person, Authorized User or End User using the Carrier's services; and any other claim resulting from any act or omission of the Customer, Authorized User, End User or any Traffic Aggregator relating to the use of the Carrier's facilities.

MISSOURI2.3 Obligations of the Customer or Traffic Aggregator

- A. All Customers or Traffic Aggregators assume general responsibilities in connection with the provisions and use of Carrier's service. General responsibilities are described in this section. When facilities, equipment, and/or communication systems provided by others are connected to Carrier's facilities, the Customer or Traffic Aggregator assumes additional responsibilities as set forth in Sections 2.10 and 2.11.
- B. Customer is responsible for the payment of all charges for any and all services or facilities furnished by the Carrier to Customer. The Customer's monthly charges for Carrier's service are based upon the total time the Customer actually uses the service, together with his use of service options.
- C. Subject to availability, the Customer or Traffic Aggregator may use Authorization Codes to identify the user groups on his account and to allocate the cost of his service accordingly. The numerical composition of such codes shall be set forth by Carrier to assure compatibility with Carrier's accounting and automation systems and to avoid duplication of Authorization Codes. or in any other provision of this tariff, or in any marketing materials issued by the Carrier shall give any person any ownership interest or proprietary right in any particular code issued by Carrier; provided, however, that a Customer or Traffic Aggregator that continues to subscribe to Carrier's services will be provided a replacement code in the event such Customer or Traffic Aggregator's initial code is cancelled.

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D. The Customer or Traffic Aggregator shall reimburse the Carrier for damages to the Carrier's facilities caused by any negligence or willful act or acts on the part of the Customer or Traffic Aggregator and/or any Authorized User as may be determined by a court having jurisdiction over the parties. After receipt of payment for the damages, Carrier will cooperate with the Customer or Traffic Aggregator in prosecuting a claim against any third party causing damage.

E. The Customer or Traffic Aggregator shall pay and hold the Carrier harmless from the payment of all charges of local exchange carriers or other entities for services and/or facilities connecting the Customer or Traffic Aggregator and the Carrier.

2.4 Service Orders

The Customer or Traffic Aggregator must place a service order with the Carrier to initiate, cancel or change the services provided pursuant to this tariff. All service orders must be in writing and provide the following information:

A. Customer's or Traffic Aggregator's name(s), telephone number(s) and address(es). In the case of a corporation or partnership, a designated officer or agent shall be named as billing agent.

- B. Name(s), address(es) and telephone number(s) of person(s) to whom notices, from the Carrier to the Customer, shall be addressed, if different from (A) above.
- C. The amount of switched access or toll service usage the Customer was billed for the three (3) months immediately preceding the request for service if such information is applicable and available.

2.5 Charges and Payments for Service or Facilities2.5.1 Deposits

- A. The Carrier shall have the right to require the Customer to make a deposit prior to provision of any service, not to exceed two (2) months estimated service based on the average bill during the preceding twelve (12) months or in the case of a new Customer, the average monthly bill for new Customers within a Customer class.
- B. Such deposit shall be released upon satisfactory payment of all undisputed charges during the last twelve (12) billing periods. Payment of a charge is satisfactory if received prior to the date upon which the charge becomes delinquent provided it is not in dispute.

The Carrier shall credit the account of or pay to the Customer interest at a rate of 9% per annum which will be accrued for the period during which time the deposit is held by the Carrier.

- D. Upon discontinuance or termination of service, the deposit shall be credited, with accrued interest, to the charge stated on the final bill and the balance, if any, shall be returned to the Customer within twenty-one (21) days of the rendition of such final bill.

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2.5 Charges and Payments for Service or Facilities (Cont'd)

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2.5.2 Description of Payment and Billing Periods

- A. Charges for service are applied on a recurring or non-recurring basis. Service is provided and billed on a monthly basis.
- B. Service continues to be provided and billed on a monthly basis until cancelled by the Customer in writing on not less than thirty (30) days notice or the notice period specified in the contract between the Carrier and the Customer for the service, whichever is greater.
- C. In addition to all recurring, non-recurring, minimum, usage or special charges, Customers, Authorized Users and End Users shall also be responsible for and shall pay all applicable federal, state and local taxes or surcharges, including sales, use, excise, gross earnings, and gross income taxes. All such taxes shall be separately shown and charged on bills rendered by Carrier or its billing agent(s). Sales and use taxes shall be applied to all charges and shall also be applied to all applicable gross earnings, gross revenue and gross income taxes.
- D. Services furnished under this tariff may be arranged for use of hotel/motel guests, payphone users, patrons of hospitals, businesses and retail establishments, or travelers. Payment for the Carrier's service in such instances is the ultimate responsibility of the Authorized User or End User. Payment options are set forth in Section IV of this tariff. The Carrier reserves the right to refuse or otherwise limit service to Authorized Users or End Users due to insufficient billing information, refusal of an End user to accept responsibility for payment, or an invalid telephone number, credit card number, calling card number or other

circumstances which the Carrier believes may preclude it from receiving payment for services rendered.

E. In the event a Local Exchange Carrier or commercial credit card company ceases efforts to collect any amounts associated with the Carrier's charges, the Carrier may bill the End User, Authorized User or the called party directly, and may utilize its own billing and collection procedures which shall be consistent with all applicable statutes, rules and regulations.

F. When billing functions are performed by a LEC, commercial credit card company or others, the payment conditions and requirements of such companies apply, including any applicable interest.

2.5.3 Payment and Late Payment Charge

A. Payment will be due upon receipt and will be considered delinquent twenty-one (21) days after rendition of the bill. Carrier reserves the right to assess a charge in an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per billing cycle to cover the cost of handling the delinquent account.

B. Collection procedures and the requirement for a deposit are unaffected by the application of a late payment charge. The late payment charge does not apply to unpaid balances associated with disputed amounts. Undisputed amounts on the same bill are subject to the late payment charge if unpaid and carried forward to the next bill.

- C. Service may be denied or discontinued at Carrier's discretion, for non-payment of amounts due Carrier past the due date specified in 2.5.3 upon ten (10) days prior written notice to customer. Restoration of service will be subject to all applicable installation charges.

2.5.4 Returned Check Charge

In cases where the Carrier issues direct bills to Authorized Users, End Users or Customers, and payment by check is returned for insufficient funds, or is otherwise not processed for payment, there will be a \$10.00 charge. Such charge will be applicable on each occasion when a check is returned or not processed.

2.5.5 Suspension or Termination for Non-payment

In the event of non-payment of any bill rendered or any required deposit, the Carrier may suspend service, subject to any notice requirement imposed by the Commission.

2.5.6 Credit Allowances/Service Interruptions

- A. Credit for failure of service or equipment will be allowed only when failure is caused by or occurs in facilities or equipment owned, provided and billed for, by Carrier. Such credit, when applicable, will be determined on a case by case basis. In the event a hung trunk results in continuous billing, AMNEX will credit the Customer for the full amount of the call. A credit allowance is not applicable for any period during which Customer fails to afford access to its facilities for the purpose of investigating and clearing troubles.

- B. Credit allowances for failure of service or equipment starts when the Customer notifies Carrier of the failure and ceases when the operation has been restored and written notice has been sent to the Customer.
- C. The Customer shall notify Carrier of failures of service or equipment and make reasonable attempts to ascertain that the failure is not caused by Customer provided facilities, any act, or omission of the Customer or in wiring or equipment connected to the terminal.
- D. Only those portions of the service or equipment operation disabled will be credited.
- E. No credit allowance will be made for interruptions of service resulting from Carrier performing routine maintenance.

2.6 Termination or Denial of Service by Carrier

- A. The Carrier may, after providing the Customer or Traffic Aggregator with an opportunity to cure and upon ten (10) days written notice to the Customer or Traffic Aggregator, without liability of any nature, temporarily deny, terminate, or suspend service to any Customer or Traffic Aggregator:
1. In the event such Customer or Traffic Aggregator or his agent wilfully damages Carrier's equipment, interferes with use of Carrier's service by other Customers or Traffic Aggregators of the Carrier, or violates any statute or provision of law, or any rule or regulation of any state or federal regulatory agency relating to communications, or otherwise fails to comply with the provisions of this tariff or applicable law, or;

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2.6 Termination or Denial of Service by Carrier (Cont'd)

A. (Cont'd)

2. In the event a Customer or Traffic Aggregator becomes insolvent, is the subject of any formal legal proceeding commenced in a court involving a voluntary or involuntary petition or proceeding in bankruptcy, seeks protection or relief from creditors in a formal legal proceeding after a filing for such relief, or executes an assignment for the benefit of creditors; or

3. In the event that Carrier determines that any service is being used fraudulently or illegally, whether by a Customer or Traffic Aggregator, Authorized User or any other person.

B. Carrier reserves the right to discontinue the use of any Authorization Code provided to a Customer or Traffic Aggregator upon prior written notice and to substitute another Authorization Code for the use of such Customer or Traffic Aggregator.

2.7 Cancellation by Customer

If a Customer or Traffic Aggregator orders services requiring special facilities dedicated to the Customer or Traffic Aggregator's use and then cancels his order before the service begins, before completion of a contractual minimum period or before completion of some other period mutually agreed upon by the Customer or Traffic Aggregator and Carrier, a charge will be made to the Customer for the nonrecoverable portions of expenditures or liabilities incurred expressly on behalf of the Customer or Traffic Aggregator by Carrier and not fully reimbursed by installation and monthly charges. If, based on such an order, any construction has either begun or been completed, but no such services provided, the nonrecoverable cost of such construction shall be borne by the Customer or Traffic Aggregator and shall not exceed the full installment cost.

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2. Rules and Regulations (Cont'd)

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2.8. Special Services2.8.1 GeneralMISSOURI
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For the purpose of this tariff, a Special Service is deemed to be any service requested by the Customer or Traffic Aggregator for which there is no prescribed rate in this tariff. Charges for Special Services will be developed on an individual case basis and may be established by contract between Carrier and the Customer or Traffic Aggregator. Such contract and proposed rates will be filed with the Commission as required by applicable rules and regulations and only after approval by the Commission may they be charged.

2.8.2 Basis for Charges

Charges for Special Services will be based on the estimated cost of furnishing such services including the cost of operating and maintaining such a service, the cost of equipment and materials used in providing such a service, the cost of installation including engineering, labor, supervision, transportation, and the cost of any other specific item associated with the particular Special Service request.

2.8.3 When Applicable

Rates for Special Services apply in the following circumstances:

- A. If at the request of the Customer or Traffic Aggregator, Carrier obtains facilities not normally used to provide service to its Customers or Traffic Aggregators;
- B. If at the request of the Customer or Traffic Aggregator, Carrier provides technical assistance not normally required to provide service;

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2.8. Special Services (Cont'd)

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2.8.3 When Applicable (Cont'd)

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- C. Where special signaling, conditioning, equipment, or other features are required to make Customer Provided Equipment compatible with Carrier service;
- D. When at the specific request of the Customer or Traffic Aggregator, installation and/or routine maintenance is performed outside of the regular business hours. Such charges will be based upon the actual labor, material, and other costs incurred by, or billed to Carrier in the provision of the particular Special Service.
- E. If installation and/or routine maintenance is extended beyond normal business hours at the request of the Customer or Traffic Aggregator and these circumstances are not the fault of Carrier, Special Service charges may apply. Such circumstances include, but are not limited to, stand-by in excess of one-hour, weekend, holiday or night time cut-over, and additional installation testing in excess of the normal testing required to provide service.

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2.9 System Maintenance and Installation2.9.1 General

- A. The transmission facilities used by the Carrier in providing services pursuant to this tariff shall be maintained by the Carrier. The Customer or Traffic Aggregator shall maintain all apparatus and equipment provided by it.

2.9.1 General (Cont'd)

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- B. In the event that system maintenance requires the material interruption of services, to the extent possible, the Carrier will notify Customer or Traffic Aggregator prior to such interruption. No credit will be allowed for any interruption during such system maintenance.

2.9.2 Description of Non-Routine Maintenance and Installation

Maintenance and/or installation services are separated into routine and non-routine services.

- A. Non-routine maintenance and non-routine installation shall include the following:

- (a) maintenance problems resulting from equipment provided by persons other than the Carrier; and
- (b) maintenance problems for which the Customer or Traffic Aggregator or its agent specifically requests a dispatch of Carrier personnel, but no trouble is either reported or found in the Carrier's facilities.

- B. All other maintenance and/or installation services are considered routine services.

2.10 Inspection, Testing and Adjustment

- A. Carrier may, upon reasonable notice, make such tests and inspections as may be necessary to investigate the installation, operation or maintenance of the Customer's, Traffic Aggregator's or Carrier's equipment or connecting facilities. The Carrier may interrupt service at Carrier may interrupt service at any time, without penalty or liability to itself, where necessary to prevent improper use of service, equipment, facilities, or connections.

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2. Rules and Regulations (Cont'd)2.10 Inspection, Testing and Adjustment (Cont'd)MISSOURI
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- B. Upon reasonable notice, the facilities and equipment provided by the Carrier shall be made available to Carrier at a time mutually agreeable to Customer and Carrier for such tests and adjustments as may be necessary for their maintenance in a condition satisfactory to Carrier. No interruption allowance will be granted for the time during which such tests and adjustments are made, unless such interruption exceeds twenty-four (24) hours in length.

3.1 800 AMNEX Omni Service

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3.1.1 General Description

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800 AMNEX Omni Service is a one way switched, inbound service which permits inward 800 number calling from any location in the state to a station selected by the Customer. Calling parties use a three digit access number to direct the call to the proper location. All charges are billed to the Customer, and all calls are toll free to the calling party. 800 AMNEX Omni Service may be ordered only in on-net cities where suitable facilities exist for AMNEX to switch 800 AMNEX Omni traffic. Rates for 800 AMNEX Omni Service are set forth in Section 4.1.

3.2 Dialed Access Switched Services3.2.1 General Description

Dialed Access Switched Services are measured use, full time services and are offered on a monthly basis, utilizing intercity communications facilities. When appropriate access arrangements exist, these switched services are available on a presubscription (equal access) basis. Otherwise, the services require that a Customer access the AMNEX network via a seven-digit (950-0370) toll-free access number, or with an AMNEX-provided automatic dialing device. In cities where AMNEX does not have a point of presence, all access to the network will be via an "800" number provided to Customers. Customers using the "800" number to access AMNEX will pay rates for the services

3.2.1 General Description (Cont'd)

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associated with their Authorization Code. The individual Customer's charges for the use of the Carrier's communications facilities are based upon the time of day, the total minutes the Customer utilizes such facilities and the distance of each call. Carrier may occasionally offer promotional discounts upon Commission approval.

When the AMNEX Calling Card is used to place a call from a location other than the Customer's premises, a Calling Card Surcharge and Measured Usage Charge described in Section 3.4.1 will apply.

3.2.2 Standard AMNEX Omni Service

Standard Omni Service is available from any location within the Service Location Areas, and originates over AMNEX's switched access facilities.
