Definitions of terms used in this Tariff:

<u>Incoming Facility</u> - The means by which the remote caller gains access to Centrex Services. This incoming facility may be a Centrex station or other tariffed exchange access line (e.g., 800 Service).

<u>Outgoing Facility</u> - This will always be a Centrex station line. The line class of service assigned to this station will determine what Centrex features/services can be accessed by the remote caller.

<u>Remote Access Path</u> - The combination of one incoming facility and one outgoing facility constitutes a remote access path.

A. Description:

Remote Access is an arrangement that will permit a remote caller access to the features and/or service facilities of a C.O. Centrex. Access is gained by dialing the number associated with the incoming facility. Optionally, the remote caller may be required to input a customerspecified security code.
