b. Responsibility of the Telephone Company (Continued)

event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistake, omission, interruption, delay, or error or defect in transmission, or failures or defects in the recorder connector equipment occurs.

c. Obligation of the Subscriber

(1) The operating characteristics of the subscriber-owned voice recording equipment shall be such as not to interfere with any of the services offered by the Telephone Company. Upon notice from the Telephone Company that the equipment of the customer is causing or is likely to cause hazard or interference, the subscriber shall make such changes as may be necessary to remove or prevent such hazard or interference.

(2) The subscriber indemnifies and saves the Telephone Company harmless against claim for libel, slander, or infringement of copyright arising from the improper use of material transmitted over its facilities and recorded; against claims for infringement of patents arising from combining with, or using in connection with, facilities of the Telephone Company, apparatus or systems of the subscriber and against all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the subscriber in connection with facilities provided by the telephone company.

RADIOTELEPHONE, DIAL

A. REGULATIONS

1. General

- a. Dial radiotelephone service is offered for use by the public at exchanges in which the equipment might be available. This shall consist of "mobile units" (units installed in vehicles), "fixed units" (units installed in locations other than vehicles), "base station" (equipment through which both mobile and fixed units contact the dial central office equipment), and "tower" (receiving and sending antennas which are connected to the base station).
- b. Mobile and fixed units can call or be called by any other telephone connected to the central office equipment in the exchange in which their radiotelephone service is provided. They can also communicate with "Long Distance", as other subscribers do. They can also communicate with each other.
- c. All equipment is owned, installed and maintained by the telephone company.
- d. Minimum period of service shall be twelve months. Should the subscriber terminate service earlier, he shall pay for the unused portion of the minimum period at the rate being charged for the service at the time of termination.
- e. Rates are shown in Section II of this Tariff.

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Base Rate Area

A specific area within which local telephone Exchange service, other than rural line service, is furnished at rates quoted in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs without the application of "Mileage Charges."

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Channel

The term "Channel" designates the electrical path provided by the Telephone Company between two or more locations.

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Circuit

The term applies to a channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of telephone service.

Common Battery Service

Common Battery Service is either manual or automatic service where the talking battery is furnished from the Central Office and where the operator is signalled or dial tone is obtained by lifting the receiver of the calling station.

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Connecting Company

A corporation, association, partnership or individual or operating one or more exchanges and with whom traffic is interchanged.

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Contract

The term "Contract" refers to the service agreement between a subscriber and the Telephone Company under which service and facilities are furnished in accordance with the provisions of the

Exchange

The term "Exchange" means a unit established for the administration of telephone service in a specified area which usually embraces a city, town or village and its environs. It consists of a central office, together with the associated plant used in furnishing communication service within that area.

Exchange Area

The territory, including the Base Rate Area and surrounding territory, served by an Exchange.

Exchange Station

A station owned by the Telephone Company and connected directly or indirectly with a central office of the Company over its own lines.

- (a) Main Station: A station directly connected with a central office switchboard by an individual or party line circuit
- (b) Extension Station: A station connected with a main station either directly or through some switching device, other than P. B. X. system.

Extension and P. B. X Station Mileage

The charges made for the additional circuit required to furnish such stations beyond the allowable distance from the main station or P. B. X. switchboard.

Extra Exchange Line Mileage

"Extra Exchange Line Mileage" is the measurement on which charges are based for that portion of the circuit extending beyond the Base Rate Area but within the Exchange Area, which is used to furnish base rate area classes of service.

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Extra Listing

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An extra listing is any listing of a name or information in connection with a subscriber's telephone number beyond that to which he is entitled in connection with his regular service.

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Individual Line

An exchange line designed for the connection of only one main station. (Not a private branch exchange trunk line).

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Installation Charge

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A non-recurring charge made for the placing or furnishing of telephone equipment, which may apply in place of or in addition to Service Connection charges and other applicable charges for service or equipment.

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Joint User Service

Joint User Service is an arrangement whereby an individual, firm or corporation whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the provision of separate subscriber service is permitted to use the service of a subscriber.

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Local Channel

The term "Local Channel" applies to that portion of a channel which connects a station to the interchange channel; it also applies to a channel connecting two or more stations within an exchange area.

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Local Exchange Service

Local Exchange Service provides for telephone communication within an Exchange Area in accordance with the provisions of the Telephone Company's Tariffs, including the use of exchange facilities as required to establish connection between an exchange station and the toll board or between an exchange station and toll trunks when such trunks are employed to effect connection with the toll board.

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Local Messages

A Local Message is a communication between subscribers' stations within the same Exchange Area.

Local Service Area

That area throughout which a subscriber to local exchange service, at a given rate, obtains telephone service without the payment of a toll charge.

GENERAL EXCHANGE SERVICES - Facilities, services or features furnished by the Company connected to or associated with primary local exchange service.

GRADE OF SERVICE - The term used to describe individual-line, or various party line services.

INDIVIDUAL LINE - A Central Office Access Line to provide one-party service. (Not a private branch exchange trunk).

INITIAL SERVICE PERIOD - The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment, whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

INSTALLATION CHARGE - A nonrecurring charge made at the time of installation of communications service or facilities, which may apply in place of or in addition to Service Charges and other applicable charges for service.

INTERCOMMUNICATING SYSTEM - An arrangement involving two or more stations which enables a user to signal and connect with other stations in the system.

JOINT USER SERVICE - An arrangement whereby an individual, firm or corporation whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the provision of separate customer service is permitted to use the services of another customer.

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(A) P. B. X. Trunk: A circuit connecting the P. B. X. system with a central office.

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(B) P. B. X. Stations: Any station (including the operating set or sets) connected directly or indirectly with a P. B. X. system.

(C) Switchboards: Switchboards are classified as follows:

(1) Cord Switchboard: A switchboard on which all lines terminate in jacks; interconnection of stations and of stations and trunk lines established by means of cords equipped with plugs.

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(a) Multiple Cord Switchboard: A cord switchboard arranged so that each line may have two or more appearances or jack terminations.

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(b) Non-multiple Cord Switchboard: A cord switchboard arranged so that each line has only one appearance or jack termination.

(2) Cordless Switchboard (Key Switchboard): A switchboard on which all lines terminate on keys; interconnection of stations and of stations and trunk lines, is established by means of keys.

(3) Dial Switchboard (P. B. X.): A switchboard on which all lines terminate on switches; interconnection of stations and of stations and trunk lines, is established by dial-pulsed selectors and connectors.

Private Branch Exchange Trunks

(See Private Branch Exchange System)

Public Telephone

An exchange station, either attended or equipped with a coin-collecting device which is installed for the convenience of the Public at a location chosen or accepted by the Telephone Company.

Private Line

A circuit provided to furnish communication only between the two or more telephones directly connected to it, and not having connection with either central office or P. B. X. switching apparatus.

Rural Line Service

A type of multi-party line service furnished to subscribers in certain sections outside the base rate area but within the exchange area.

Rural Area

The territory surrounding the Base Rate Area in which Rural Line Service is furnished and in which urban classes of service are furnished at established rates plus Extra Exchange Line Mileage Charges.

Semi-Public Telephone

A semi-public telephone is an exchange station equipped with a coin collecting device, designed for a combination of subscriber and public usage at locations more or less public in character. Semi-public telephone service is considered as a form of subscriber service.

Service Connection Charge

A charge applied to installation of apparatus, establishing service, changing, or relocating equipment on the premises.

Service Station

(See Telephone Station)

Subscriber

As used in this Tariff, a separate subscriber is involved at each location, or continuous property, where service is furnished. One individual or firm therefore may be considered as two or more separate subscribers even in the same Exchange. The privileges, restrictions and rates established for a subscriber to any class of service are limited to the service at one location; and no group treatment of service at separate locations, furnished to one individual or firm, is contemplated or to be implied,

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**PAY TELEPHONE SERVICE** - A central office access line providing connections for pay telephone equipment.

Pay Central Office Access Line: A circuit extending from the central office equipment up to and including the demarcation point to provide both local and toll service.

Interexchange Pay Access Line: A one-way outgoing circuit extending from the central office up to and including the demarcation point for use with toll service only.

**PREMISES** - The space occupied by an individual customer in a building, in adjoining buildings, or on contiguous property including property separated only by a public thoroughfare, a railroad right-of-way, or a natural barrier.

**PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TRUNKS** - See "Central Office Access Line."

**PRIVATE LINE** - A circuit provided to furnish communication between two or more instrumentalities directly connected to it. Such instrumentalities do not have access to the general exchange and interexchange networks.

**PROTECTOR** - A utility owned electrical device located in the central office, at a customer's premises or anywhere along any telephone facilities which is designed to protect both the telephone company's and the customer's property and facilities from over-voltage and over-current by shunting such excessive voltages and currents to ground.

**RATES** - Recurring amounts billed to customers for regulated communications services.

**RESIDENCE SERVICE** - Telecommunication service furnished to customers when its use is for domestic purposes.

Telephone Station

A telephone instrument, consisting of a transmitter, receiver and associated apparatus, so connected as to permit transmitting of and receiving telephone messages.

(A) Company Station: A station owned by the Telephone Company, receiving service from and through central office equipment and lines normally owned, maintained and operated by the Telephone Company, and provided as a part of the Telephone Company's service function. Service stations are not included under this classification.

(1) Main Station: A Company station directly connected by means of an individual line or party line circuit with a central office.

Toll Station: A Company station installed for the convenience of the public or of a subscriber in a locality where the Telephone Company does not generally furnish exchange service and from which established toll rates are charged for all messages sent over the Telephone Company's lines.

Toll Terminal: A Company station, or a terminal on a private branch exchange switchboard, and the associated exchange circuit connecting the station or terminal directly with a toll office (Also known as Long Distance Terminal).

- (2) **Extension Station:** An additional Company station connected on the same circuit as the main station and having the same telephone number as the main station.
- (3) **Private Branch Exchange Station:** Any Company station (including the operator's set or sets) connected directly or indirectly with a private branch exchange system.

(B) **Service Station:** A station or one of a group of stations which, under arrangements made by the service station subscribers, receive service from a Telephone Company central office over facilities provided in part by such subscribers and in part by the Telephone Company.

Tie Trunk

A circuit connecting two P. B. X. systems for the purpose of inter-communicating between the stations connected with such P. B. X. switching apparatus. A circuit is not intended to provide for general exchange service through either of the P. B. X. systems with which it connects.

Toll Message

A message from a calling station to a station located in a different local service area.

Toll Service

Toll service is that part of the total telephone service rendered by the Telephone Company which is furnished between patrons in different local service areas in accordance with the rates and regulations specified in the Company's Toll Tariff.

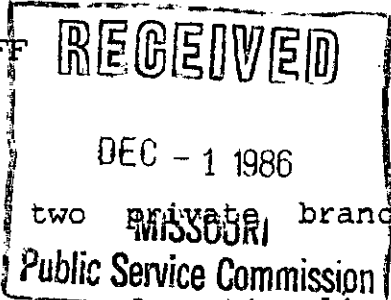

DEFINITIONS

TIE LINE - A communication circuit connecting two private branch exchange services together.

TIE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement on which the rates for tie lines are based.

TIMELY PAYMENT - Payment on a customer's account made on or before the due date shown: (1) on a current bill for rates and charges, or (2) by an agreement between the customer and the Company for a series of partial payments to settle a delinquent account.

TOLL CENTER - A telephone switching center at which the operations (manual or dial) function (message timing, switching and recording) takes place in connection with the provision of long distance telecommunication service.

TOLL LINE - A circuit used exclusively for the transmission of messages between points located in different exchange areas where specific charges for each such message are applicable.

TOLL MESSAGE - A message between different exchange areas furnished under the provision of the applicable toll tariff.

TOLL RATE - The tariff charge prescribed for toll messages, usually based upon the duration of the message, the distance between the exchanges, the day and time of the message and the degree of operator assistance.

TOLL SERVICE - Toll service (Long Distance Service) is that part of the total telephone service rendered by the Company which is furnished between different exchange areas in accordance with the rates and regulations specified in the Company's long distance telecommunication service tariff.

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TOLL STATION - A telephone connected to a toll line or directly to a toll board.

TOLL STATION SERVICE - Telephone service rendered from a toll station.

TOLL TERMINAL - The circuit connecting the customer premise equipment directly with a toll center. (Also known as Long Distance Terminal).
