ORDER APPROVING AGREEMENT

Issue Date: July 21, 2022

Effective Date: July 31, 2022

On March 4, 2022, Missouri-American Water Company (MAWC) filed its petition to change its water and sewer infrastructure rate adjustments (WSIRAs) under Sections 393.1500-1509, RSMo. MAWC also requested that the Commission approve its tariff sheets to implement the WSIRAs.¹ The tariff sheets bore an effective date of April 3, 2022. The Commission suspended the tariff sheets until August 31, 2022.

On July 7, 2022, MAWC, the Commission's Staff, and Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers filed a Notice of Agreement (Agreement). The Agreement indicated that the Office of Public Counsel (OPC) did not oppose the Agreement.

The Agreement includes Appendix A, which details the agreed-upon revenue requirement. Appendix A includes \$3,036,211 in WSIRA property taxes. The Agreement also includes Appendix B, which is an example of the tariff MAWC plans to file to collect the agreed-upon revenue requirement.

Because OPC did not sign the Agreement, it is non-unanimous. Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.115(2) allows the Commission to treat non-unanimous agreements as

unanimous if no party objects within seven days of its filing. OPC did not object to the agreement. Thus, the Commission may treat the Agreement as unanimous.

The Commission has reviewed the Agreement, finds it reasonable, and will approve it.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Agreement, which is Exhibit 1 to this order, is approved, and the signatories of the Agreement shall comply with its terms.
2. The tariffs filed with the petition, Tariff Nos. JW-2022-0234 and JS-2022-0235, are rejected. MAWC shall file a tariff to implement the Agreement. That tariff shall be identical to or substantially similar to Appendix B of the Agreement.
3. This order shall become effective on July 31, 2022.

NOTICE OF AGREEMENT

COME NOW Missouri-American Water Company ("MAWC"), Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Staff"), and Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers ("MIEC"), and in regard to *Notice of Agreement* ("*Notice*") state as follows to the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission"):

1. On March 4, 2022, MAWC filed a *Petition to Change a Water and Sewer Infrastructure Rate Adjustment* ("*Petition*") with the Commission. The *Petition* seeks to recover Water and Sewer Infrastructure Rate Adjustment ("WSIRA") investment that was placed into service for the period November 1, 2021 to January 31, 2022, with estimated WSIRA costs for February 1, 2022 through April 30, 2022, also included. The Commission assigned File Nos. WO-2022-0176 and SO-2022-0177 to the *Petition*.

2. On March 9, 2022, the Commission issued its *Order Directing Notice, Setting Deadlines, Directing Filings, Consolidating Cases, and Suspending Tariffs* ("*Order*"). The *Order*: consolidated File Nos. WO-2022-0176 and SO-2022-0177, with File No. WO-2022-0176 being the lead case; issued notice of the *Petition*; directed the Staff of the Commission to file its recommendation no later than June 2, 2022; directed the Office of the Public Counsel and any other parties to file objections, recommendations, or requests for hearing no later than June 2, 2022; and for MAWC to respond to Staff's recommendation or other objections or recommendations no later than June 13, 2022.

3. On June 2, 2022, Staff filed its recommendation for the Commission to: approve WSIRA surcharge revenues in the incremental pre-tax revenue amount of \$18,302,606 for the St. Louis County water service area, \$2,658,518 for All Other water service area, \$16,951 for Arnold sewer service area, and \$225,490 for All Other sewer service area for a total in this filing of \$21,203,565 and a total current and cumulative WSIRA surcharge of \$40,206,346; and authorize MAWC to file revised tariff sheets for each utility, service area, and customer class, as reflected in Staff's Appendix 1, to generate \$21,203,565.

4. On June 3, 2022, MIEC filed out of time the "Direct Testimony" of Greg R. Meyer objecting to the level of property taxes included in the WSIRA.

5. On June 16, 2022, MAWC filed a Response to Staff's Recommendation and MIEC's filing, stating that the Company agrees with the Staff recommendation and disagrees with MIEC's position.

6. On June 17, 2022, the Commission issued an *Order Granting Motion to File Testimony Out of Time and Order Directing Filing*, which included an order for the parties to jointly file a proposed procedural schedule by June 22, 2022.

7. On June 22, 2022, Staff filed a Joint Proposed Procedural schedule on behalf of Staff, MAWC and MIEC (the signatories).

8. MAWC, Staff and MIEC have reached an agreement on the issues involved in this matter. Attached as **Appendix A** to this Notice is the revenue requirement agreed to by the signatories.

9. The revenue requirement in **Appendix A** includes \$3,036,211 in WSIRA property taxes.

10. The amount of property taxes agreed to by parties in this case is for settlement


purposes only and does not prevent any party from proposing a different methodology to calculate property taxes in a future WSIRA case.

11. **Appendix B** to this *Notice* is an example of the tariff that the Company would file and seek approval as part of the agreement.

12. OPC counsel has stated to undersigned counsel that OPC does not oppose this agreement.

WHEREFORE, the signatories respectfully submit this *Notice of Agreement* and request that the Commission issue an order approving a change to MAWC's WSIRA as described herein.

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
