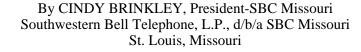

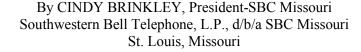

40.1 GENERAL REGULATIONS

Personalized Ring allows a customer to establish up to three telephone numbers on the same local exchange access line and distinguish calls to each number by a distinctive ringing pattern. The billing number is called the Primary Number and additional associated telephone numbers are called Personalized Ring Numbers. Damages arising out of such interruptions, defects, failures, or malfunctions of this service after the Telephone Company has been notified, and has had a reasonable time (FELE) repair, shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the charges made for the service for the period following notice from the customer until service is restored.
- E. The Primary number is the telephone number associated with the access Rive and therefore is allowed direct-dialed Directory Assistance calls in Commission accordance with the Directory Services section of this Tariffic Dervice Commission additional call allowances are provided with Personalized Ring.
