WIRELESS 911 SERVICE

(AT) 1. Description of Service

- 1.1 Wireless 911 Service (W 911) is a service offering which routes wireless calls to specific Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) and provides a Mobile Directory Number (MDN) for callback information.
- 1.2 W 911 accesses Wireless Automatic Location Information (WALI) (the cell site receiving the 911 call).
- 1.3 The W 911 customer must be either:
 - A. A municipality or other state or local government unit, or an authorized agent of one or more municipalities or other state or local governmental units to whom authority has been lawfully delegated. The customer must be legally authorized to subscribe to the service and have public safety responsibility to respond to telephone calls from the public for emergency police and fire service within the telephone central office areas arranged for 911 Service calling, or
 - B. A licensed wireless carrier with approval of the appropriate 911 agency.

2. Explanation of Terms

Wireless Administrative Site: A location responsible for administration of wireless end user records associated with one or more wireless switches. This location has the computer hardware and software necessary to create and transmit wireless end user information to the W 911 database.

Wireless Automatic Location Identification (WALI): A system that identifies cell site location and associated information for cellular 911 calls.

Wireless Automatic Number Identification (WANI): A system that (1) identifies the billing account for a call in other applications, but for 911 systems, identifies the calling party; and (2) can also be used as a call back number.

Wireless 911 Control Office: The LEC central office providing tandem switching capabilities for 911 service calls from all end offices. It controls the switching of MDN and pseudo-Automatic Number Identification (pANI) information to a PSAP and also provides the Selective Routing service feature, Speed Calling features, Call Transfer services and certain maintenance functions for each PSAP.

Wireless 911 DataBase: A system of manual procedures and computer programs used to create, store, and update the data required to provide the Selective Routing (SR) and location text information.

31.1 GENERAL REGULATIONS

(RT)

31.1.1 This Tariff is applicable to obsolete Centrex C.U. by No. 101 ESS Switching Vehicles that continue to the Telephone Company.

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31.1.2 Centrex C.U. - The Telephone Company will determine and provide the necessary switching equipment and attendant positions required for exchange and other services furnished by the Telephone Company. The Telephone Company reserves the right to remove switching equipment furnished by the Telephone Company when, in its judgment, such equipment or facilities are no longer required or necessary to provide exchange or other services furnished by the Telephone Company. Provision of optional features is limited to the capabilities of the serving vehicle. See Paragraph 31.1.25 for additional charges applicable to Centrex C.U. Service.

31.1.3 Additional equipment or facilities required as a result of seasonal business requirements or for customer-owned facilities will be charged for on an individual-case basis.

31.1.4 The following terms as used in this Section apply to Centrex C.U. Service and shall mean:

Primary Centrex location - The customer's premises where the attendant equipment is located.

Secondary Centrex location - Customer's premises other than the location where the attendant equipment is located.

Centrex station line - a main station line of the Centrex System which has full in-out dialing privileges and access to or from the attendant.

Fully restricted station line - a main station line having intra-system dialing privileges only and having no access to or from the attendant. Fully restricted station lines may call any other station line of the system.

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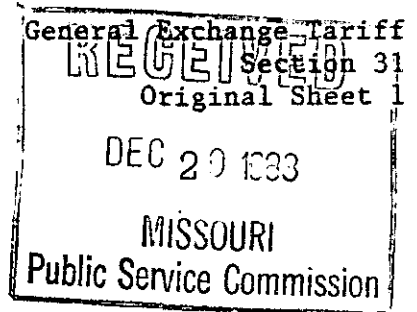

31.1.1 This Tariff is applicable to obsolete Centrex C.U. Service served by No. 101 ESS Switching Vehicles that continue to be maintained by the Telephone Company and Communications Service Package Premises Systems Custom Calling Services.

31.1.2 Centrex C.U. - The Telephone Company will determine and provide the necessary switching equipment and attendant positions required for exchange and other services furnished by the Telephone Company. The Telephone Company reserves the right to remove switching equipment furnished by the Telephone Company when, in its judgment, such equipment or facilities are no longer required or necessary to provide exchange or other services furnished by the Telephone Company. Provision of optional features is limited to the capabilities of the serving vehicle. See Paragraph 31.1.25 for additional charges applicable to Centrex C.U. Service.

31.1.3 Additional equipment or facilities required as a result of seasonal business requirements or for customer-owned facilities will be charged for on an individual-case basis.

31.1.4 The following terms as used in this Section apply to Centrex C.U. Service and shall mean:

Primary Centrex location - The customer's premises where the attendant equipment is located.

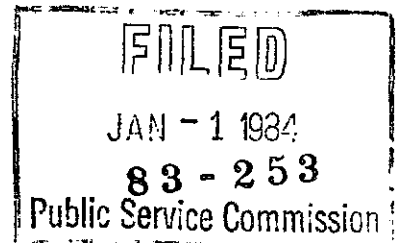

31.1 GENERAL REGULATIONS-(Continued)

31.1.4 The following terms as used in this Section apply to Centrex, C.U. Service and shall mean:-(Continued)

Dormitory station line - a Centrex station line which terminates in a student's room in a dormitory of an accredited public or private educational institution that has Centrex Service for its administrative use.

Workable Station Lines - Centrex station lines available for customer use.

31.1.5 All operation at customer's premises is performed at the expense of the customer and must conform with the rules and regulations the Telephone Company may consider necessary to maintain a proper standard of service.

31.1.6 Other facilities, miscellaneous and supplemental equipment, requested by customers and not detrimental to this service or other services of the Telephone Company will be furnished in accordance with regulations and at the rates specified in the applicable section of this Tariff.

31.1.7 Sufficient floor space and the necessary power wiring, power outlets and commercial power for the operation of Centrex Service are furnished by the customer who assumes all responsibility for the safe condition of such floor space, wiring, outlets and power.

2. Explanation of Terms - (Continued)

Mobile Directory Number (MDN): A 10-digit telephone number that identifies the calling party and can be used as a call back number.

Pseudo-Automatic Number Identification (pANI): A number, consisting of the same number of digits as ANI, but is used in place of an ANI to convey a special meaning. The specific meaning assigned to the pANI is determined by agreements, as necessary, between the telephone system originating the call, intermediate telephone systems handling and routing the call, and the destination telephone system. The pANI identifies the location of the base station or cell site through which a mobile call originates.

Wireless Carrier: A private entity that provides telephone service to residential or business end users served by the provider's wireless switch.

Wireless Carrier Switch: A switch that provides wireless telephone service.

Wireless End User: An individual or organization authorized to use the telephone services provided by the wireless switch.

3. Rules and Regulations - In addition to the following rules and regulation, the Rules and Regulations in the 911 Emergency Number Services Section of the Company's General Exchange Service shall also apply.

3.1 Application for Service

Request for this service: (1) can only be initiated by a 911 customer or a wireless carrier with approval of the 911 customer; (2) must be provided to Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT) in writing; and (3) must identify service locations and arrangements.

PSAP CPE must be capable of accepting 10+ digits when the W 911 tandem office is digital and 20+ digits when the W 911 tandem is analog. If a PSAP's CPE doesn't meet these requirements, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company will still deliver calls and routing for wireless calls on an 8-digit basis.

31.1 GENERAL REGULATIONS-(Continued)

- 31.1.8 One primary directory listing will be furnished without charge with each Centrex Service in accordance with the regulations set forth in Section 6 of this Tariff.
- 31.1.9 The primary location of a Centrex customer served by switching equipment located on customer premises must be in the same serving office area from which service is furnished.
- 31.1.10 A Centrex secondary location is furnished the same calling scope as the primary location. In addition, the switching equipment must be located in the same serving office area as the customer's secondary location.
- 31.1.11 Service at a secondary location may be provided with use of either switching equipment located on Telephone Company or customer's premises, irrespective of the method of service provided at the primary or other secondary locations within the Centrex System. [NOTE: Private Line Service Tariff charges are applicable to private lines (tie lines) between a Centrex C.U. premises vehicle and any other switching vehicle, including other Centrex C.U. or Centrex C.O. switching vehicles of the same Centrex System. In addition, Universal Tie Line Terminal charges are applicable.]
- 31.1.12 Service furnished at secondary locations must be of the same grade and class of service as that furnished at the primary location.
- 31.1.13 Where a Centrex C.O. secondary location is associated with a Centrex C.U. primary of the same Centrex System, rates applicable to the Centrex C.O. secondary location shall be equivalent to those for secondary location--located in same serving office area as primary location.
- 31.1.14 A secondary location of a Centrex System will be furnished only if located in the same exchange as the primary location or zones of a metropolitan area, except as provided for by Optional and Extended Area Service arrangements as offered in this Tariff.
- 31.1.15 Centrex C.U. secondary locations are subject to Private Line Service Tariff charges and exchange trunking charges as specified in Paragraph 31.1.25 of this Tariff.

3.2 Customer Obligations (1)(2)

- A. The 911 customer is responsible for coordinating with SWBT and the wireless carrier so that the wireless switch provides the MDN in the CPN field of the SS7 signaling and pANI in the CDN (called number) field according to the technical specifications established by SWBT. The wireless switch number information must be approved by SWBT prior to implementation to ensure that the service will function properly. W 911 Service will not function properly if MDN and pANI are not in the proper fields, if duplicate telephone numbers exist at the wireless switch, or if any telephone numbers assigned by the wireless carrier are inconsistent with the SWBT’s numbering plan.
- B. The 911 customer and the wireless carrier are responsible for coordinating with SWBT so that the wireless carrier creates, maintains, and forwards to SWBT current MDN and pANI data according to the format and procedures specified by SWBT provided SWBT is the database provider.
- C. The 911 customer and the wireless carrier are responsible for coordinating with SWBT so that the wireless carrier uses computer hardware and software for ongoing Wireless End User (WEU) record update programs and processes, that conform to the specifications outlined in the W 911 Technical Interface Standards.
- D. W 911 Service WEU’s information is confidential. The 911 customer agrees to use such information only for the purpose of responding to emergency calls.
- E. The WEU forfeits the privacy afforded by nonlisted and nonpublished service to the extent that the telephone number, the address and name associated with the originating station location are furnished to the PSAP and to the LEC. The WEU (published and nonpublished) consents to the storage and retention of WEU name, location, telephone number, and address in the data base and also consents to access to this information by the PSAP for the sole purpose of responding to an emergency call.
- F. The W 911 customer has the responsibility for reporting all errors, defects and malfunctions that they are aware of to SWBT in a timely manner provided SWBT is the service provider.

(1) Customer obligations described are for situations where the E 911 customer is also the W 911 customer. In situations where a wireless carrier is the W 911 customer, the W 911 customer obligations described in this section are the direct responsibility of the wireless carrier.

(2) SWBT will participate in all coordination efforts as appropriate.

31.1 GENERAL REGULATIONS-(Continued)

31.1.16 The standard or optional features of a Centrex I C.U. and Centrex II C.U. System shall not be combined so as to provide any features of the higher grade system at the rate of the lower grade system.

31.1.17 The assignment of telephone numbers for Centrex Systems shall be in accordance with Section 17 of this Tariff.

31.1.18 When a customer requests special equipment or modification of standard equipment, it will be furnished whenever possible if not detrimental to any of the services or equipment of the Telephone Company. Such special equipment or modification of standard equipment will be furnished at additional charges.

31.1.19 Private line charges as specified in Section 2 of the Private Line Service Tariff apply to station lines extending outside the same building or beyond the same premises at both primary and secondary locations. Such station lines must be provided from the location from which they are measured.

Customer locations meeting the minimum station line requirements for secondary location rate treatment, but served by switching equipment serving another primary or secondary location, may be rated as secondary locations in lieu of mileage charges as specified above. Such locations must be in the same serving office area as the related primary or secondary and must be served by switching equipment located on Telephone Company premises.

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Urban mileage charges for circuits extending beyond the base rate area apply at a primary location as specified in Section 12 of this Tariff. Such charges do not apply to secondary locations.

31.1.20 Mileage charges do not apply to Centrex dormitory station lines that are located in the same serving office area that serves the educational institution.

No minimum number of dormitory station lines is required to establish Centrex dormitory service, except that all occupied dormitory rooms in a dormitory served by Centrex dormitory service must be equipped with a Centrex dormitory station line. Charges for Centrex dormitory station lines do not apply to the minimum charge, per system.

31.1.21 When switching equipment is located on the customer's premises, mileage charges applicable to secondary locations are measured from the primary location.

3.2 Customer Obligations - (Continued) (1)(2)

G. Cancellation of the service in whole or in part by the W 911 customer prior to establishment thereof, will require payment to SWBT of an amount equal to the cost of engineering, manufacturers’ billings resulting from equipment orders, installation, assembly, labor, cost of removal and any other costs incurred by SWBT up to the time of cancellation resulting from the W 911 customer’s order for service.

3.3 Liabilities

A. SWBT’s entire liability to any person for interruption or failure of W 911 Service shall be limited by the terms set forth in this section and other sections of this tariff. SWBT or its officers or employees, may not be held liable for any claim, damage, or loss arising from the provision of W 911 Service unless it is proven that the act or omission proximately causing the claim, damage, or loss constitutes gross negligence, recklessness, or intentional misconduct on the part of SWBT.

B. W 911 Service is provided solely for the benefit of the W 911 customer; the provision of such service shall not be interpreted, construed or regarded as being for the benefit of, or creating any LEC obligation toward, or any right of action on behalf of, any third person or other legal entity.

C. To the extent allowed by law, the W 911 customer agrees to release, indemnify, defend and hold harmless SWBT from any and all loss, claims, demands, suits or other action, or any liability whatsoever, to any other party or person, for any personal injury to or death of any person or persons, or for any loss, damage or destruction of any property, whether owned by the W 911 customer or others.

(1) Customer obligations described are for situations where the E 911 customer is also the W 911 customer. In situations where a wireless carrier is the W 911 customer, the W 911 customer obligations described in this section are the direct responsibility of the wireless carrier.

(2) SWBT will participate in all coordination efforts as appropriate.

- 31.1.22 Centrex main lines terminating in attendant positions or dial equipment of another PBX, Centrex or similar system constitute station-to-trunk tie lines. Universal Tie Line Terminal rates are applicable to such terminations. The Centrex station line rate is not applicable to station-to-trunk tie lines.
- 31.1.23 Tie Line Terminal rates specified in Paragraph 31.6 of this Tariff apply for each tie line terminating in a Centrex System.
- 31.1.24 Network Access Terminal rates shall apply for each SCAN- and CCSA-type access line terminating in a Centrex System.
- 31.1.25 Standard Centrex C.U. features specified in Paragraph 31.3.1, following, require services provided in other sections of this Tariff and other tariffs, including Local Exchange Tariff and the Private Line Service Tariff. These services are provided at standard Tariff rates and include:
 - Direct Inward Dialing Service to Customer - Premises Located Switching Systems (Private Branch Exchange Service - General Exchange Tariff).
 - Automatic Identified Outward Dialing Service From Customer - Premises Located Switching Systems (Private Branch Exchange Service - General Exchange Tariff).
 - Exchange Trunking (Local Exchange Tariff).
 - Tie lines between a Centrex C.U. premises vehicle and any other switching vehicle (Private Line Service Tariff).
 - Touch-Tone Calling Service (General Exchange).

3.3 Liabilities (Continued)

- D. To the extent allowed by law, the W 911 customer also agrees to release, indemnify and hold harmless SWBT for any infringement or invasion of the right of privacy of any person or persons, caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by the installation, operation, failure to operate, maintenance, removal, presence, condition, occasion or use of 911 service features and the equipment associated therewith, or by any services furnished by SWBT in connection therewith, including, but not limited to, the identification of the telephone number, address or name associated with the telephone used by the party or parties accessing W 911 service hereunder, and which arise out of the negligence of SWBT or the negligence or other wrongful act of the W 911 customer, its user, agencies or municipalities or the employees or agents of any one of them.
- E. W 911 Service will be designed by SWBT to provide at least the same level of service reliability and quality as local exchange telephone service in the exchanges where 911 systems are equipped with the features required to provide W 911 Service.
- F. Adjustments for service interruptions experienced by the W 911 customer are governed by and limited in the Rules and Regulations Applying to All Customers' Contracts Section of the General Exchange Tariff.
- G. To the extent allowed by law, the W 911 Customer and the Wireless Carrier agree to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless SWBT from any and all claims, costs, demands, liabilities, losses, actions, lawsuits, and expenses arising from W 911 Customer and/or Wireless Customer providing SWBT with inaccurate, out of date, or improperly formatted MDN or pANI data.
- H. To the extent allowed by law, the W 911 Customer and the Wireless Carrier agree to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless SWBT from any and all claims, costs, demands, liabilities, losses, actions, lawsuits, and expenses arising from any and all equipment failure or defects or errors in transmission on the part of the W 911 customer or the wireless carrier.

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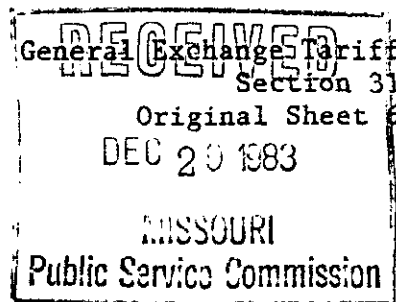

31.1.26 Centrex C.U. - The Exchange Access and Intercommunication portion of main station line charges are not offered separately. The rates and charges specified herein for main station lines provide for a main station line component. The main station line consists of all facilities, including intercommunication, from the Centrex system dial switching equipment to the demarcation point for connection to the premises wire.

The rates and charges specified herein for fully restricted main station lines provide for a fully restricted main station line component. The fully restricted main station line consists of all facilities, including intercommunication, from the Centrex system dial switching equipment to the demarcation point for connection to the premises wire.

31.1.27 Centrex I and Centrex II Service served by switching equipment located on the customer's premises is obsolete to existing installations at existing locations.

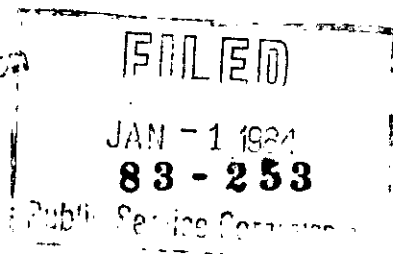
- Except that, growth is permitted only to the capacity of the existing vehicle.
- Except that, with a transfer of contract, growth will be permitted only to the capacity of the existing vehicle.

Where the primary location is served by switching equipment located on customer premises, system growth in the form of additional secondary locations (C.O. or C.U.) is not permitted.

This obsolescence is applicable to each primary and each secondary location.

4.2 Database Management System

The rates and charges in this section will equal the Database Management System monthly rate and nonrecurring charge in Paragraph 28.7.4.B (Database Management System) in Section 28 (Universal Emergency Number Services (911)) of the General Exchange Tariff. These rates and charges relate to the administration and storage of W 911 Service pANI records used for routing and associated location text. The monthly rate will be per 10 records per W 911 customer.

A nonrecurring charge equal to the nonrecurring charge to establish an administrative site in Paragraph 28.7.4.B (Database Management System) in Section 28 (Universal Emergency Number Service (911)) of the General Exchange Tariff applies at the time an administrative site is first established. This charge applies when procedures are established enabling the administrative site to create and update records.

- (1) There will be a trunk needed between the Mobile Switching Center (MSC) and the 911 tandem. The wireless carrier, in cooperation with the appropriate 911 agency, will purchase that element out of the Wireless Carrier Interconnection Service tariff or its existing interconnection agreement.
- (2) When the 911 agency involved also uses SWBT as its 911 database and network provider, the calls and data will be sent over the existing tandem to PSAP trunks and ALI circuits. If the 911 agency uses a different network provider or database provider, the tandem to PSAP trunks and/or ALI circuits must be provisioned separately.
- (3) When SWBT is the Wireless 911 Service provider, both W 911 Service with Selective Routing and Automatic Location Identification rates and charges, paragraphs 4.1.A and 4.1.C will be required. The Selective Routing rates and charges in paragraph 4.1.B only apply if an alternative Wireless 911 Service provider is utilized.

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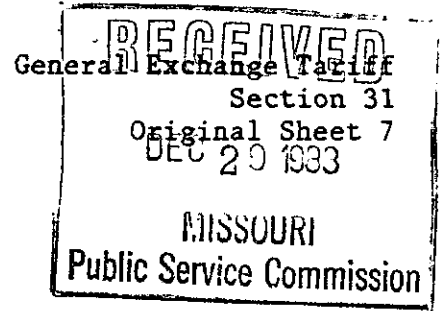

31.3 CENTREX C.U. SERVICE - STANDARD FEATURES

31.3.1 Centrex Service served by switching equipment located on customer premises (C.U.).

Centrex I includes the following standard features(1)(2)(3)(7): attendant positions, direct outward calling, direct inward calling, station-to-station calling, station hunting, call transfer-attendant, restriction from outgoing calls, station restriction(4), reserve power, busy verification, night service, identified outward calling and call interception.

Centrex II(5)(6)(7) - In addition to all standard features provided with Centrex I C.U. Service, the following additional standard features are provided: call transfer-individual, consultation hold, add-on, trunk answer from any station and Touch-Tone Calling Service.

- (1) Station hunting is limited to not more than ten station lines with each hunting arrangement. Requests for service above ten consecutive station lines may be provided on a Special Service Arrangement Request basis.
- (2) The reserve power feature provides an alternate independent source of power to maintain telephone service (excluding certain attendant supervisory functions and key telephone arrangements) during a commercial power failure. The Telephone Company agrees to make every reasonable effort to assure continued operation until such time as commercial power is restored.
- (3) Busy verification will be provided subject to the operating limitations of the equipment or facilities selected by the Telephone Company and provided no unusual expense is involved.
- (4) Does not include toll restriction.
- (5) Call transfer-individual, consultation hold and add-on will function only on an incoming call from the telecommunications network.
- (6) Add-on provided for a maximum of one additional station line being added at one time to an existing incoming call from the telecommunications network.

5. TERM PRICING PLAN

5.1 General

- A. Wireless 911 Service Term Pricing Plan (W911-TPP) provides the customer with rate stabilization and discounted tariff rates. The W911-TPP provides for either a one or three year service period (Initial Service Period) for rate stabilization.
- B. W911-TPP monthly rates will be exempt from Telephone Company initiated rate increases throughout the selected service period. Should the Telephone Company increase its rates during the W911-TPP period, the customer would continue to pay the rates in effect at the time the customer elected to establish service under W911-TPP.

Changes to Pricing Plans

- B. At any time, the customer may request existing W 911 provided on a monthly rate basis to be converted to a W911-TPP.

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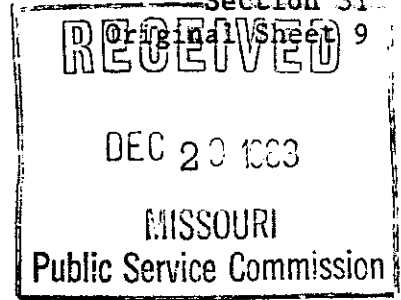

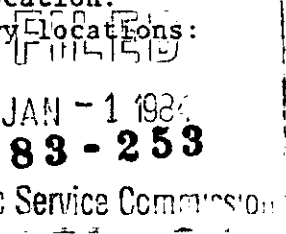

D. If special construction was applied to the service being terminated, any termination charges associated with the special construction will also apply.

Secondary Location - The customer's premises other than the location where the attendant equipment is located.

Workable Stations - Those station lines available for customer use.

- E. All operating at customers' premises is performed at the expense of the customer and must conform to whatever rules and regulations the Company may consider necessary to maintain a proper standard of service.
- F. Other facilities, miscellaneous and supplemental equipment requested by customers and not detrimental to this service or other services of the Telephone Company, will be furnished in accordance with regulations and at the rates specified in the applicable section of this tariff.

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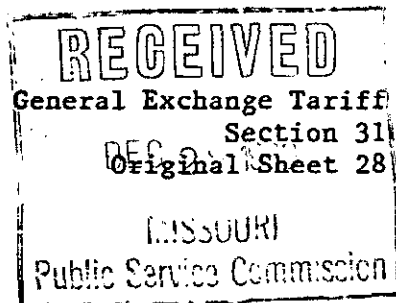

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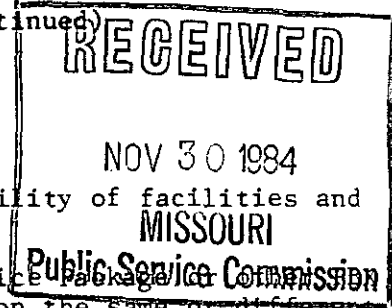

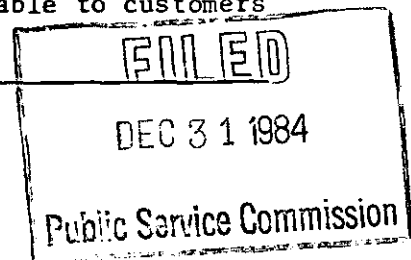

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32.1 REGULATIONS

32.1.1 Definitions

Actual Cost - Denotes all costs charged against a specific case of special construction, including any appropriate taxes.

Annual Underutilization Liability - Denotes a per-unit amount which may be billed annually if fewer services are in use utilizing specially constructed facilities at filed tariff rates than were originally specially constructed.

Authorized Services - Those domestic public land mobile radio communications services which the carrier may now or hereafter lawfully provide on an interconnected basis.

Carrier's System - The communications system of the carrier used to furnish public land mobile radio services.

Class 5 Central Office - The central office trunking entity where telephone loops are terminated for purposes of interconnection to each other and to the network.

Company's System - The communications network of the Company and its connecting companies.

Connecting Circuit - The facility and associated service arrangement used to connect the carrier's system with the Company's system for the purpose of interchange local and intraLATA traffic.

Dial Access Line - This is equivalent to a regular business exchange service line between the Company's serving (Class 5) central office in the exchange of interconnection and the carrier's control point. The exchange of interconnection is normally that exchange within which the control point of the carrier's land radio station is located.

Direct Inward Dial (DID) - An operational feature that provides direct dial access to mobile radio and paging terminals by transmitting address signaling from the serving C.O. to the terminal. This is generally referred to as "outpulsing."

Estimated Cost - Denotes all estimated costs that will be incurred in providing a specific case of special construction, including any appropriate taxes.

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Facilities - Denotes any cable, poles, conduit, microwave or carrier equipment, wire center distribution frames, central office switching equipment, etc., utilized to provide services offered under the tariffs referenced by this Tariff.

32.1.1 Definitions--(Continued)

Installed Cost - Denotes the total investment (estimated or actual) required by the Telephone Company to provide specially constructed facilities.

Maximum Termination Liability - Denotes the maximum amount which may be billed if all services using specially constructed facilities are terminated prior to the expiration of the Maximum Termination Liability Period.

Maximum Termination Liability Period - Denotes the length of time for which a Termination Charge may apply if all services using specially constructed facilities are terminated.

Net Salvage - Denotes the estimated scrap, sale or trade-in value, less the estimated cost of removal. Cost of removal includes the costs of demolishing, tearing down or otherwise disposing of the material and any other applicable costs. Since the cost of removal may exceed salvage value, net salvage may be negative.

Nonrecoverable Cost - Denotes the cost of specially constructed facilities for which the Telephone Company has no foreseeable use should the service be terminated.

Normal Cost - Denotes the estimated cost to provide services using normal construction.

Normal Construction - Denotes all facilities the Telephone Company would normally use to provide service in the absence of a request for special construction.

Permanent Facilities - Denotes facilities providing service for one month or more.

Point of Connection - The point of connection between the connecting circuits provided by the Company and the facilities of the carrier.

Recoverable Cost - Denotes the cost of the specially constructed facilities for which the Telephone Company has a foreseeable reuse, either in-place or elsewhere, should the service be terminated.

Reliable Service Area - The reliable service area of the carrier's base station as described in Section 22.504 of the Federal Communications Commission's Rules.

Termination Charge - Denotes the portion of the Maximum Termination Liability that is applied as a nonrecurring charge when all services are discontinued prior to the expiration of the specified liability period.

32.1.2 Interchange of Traffic

At the carrier's request, the Company and carrier will physically connect their facilities and interchange traffic originating or terminating on carrier's system in connection with carrier's authorized services. Such interconnection shall be in accordance with the service, operating and facility arrangements set forth hereinafter.

Interchanged local and intraLATA traffic shall be handled only over connecting circuits provided, except in the case of occasional emergency traffic of carrier's subscribers.

Where the state franchised area or state authorization of carrier differs or is modified after the effective date of this Tariff so as to differ from its reliable service area, the terms and conditions of interconnection may be modified to recognize the extent of such franchise or authorization.

32.1.3 Facilities and Arrangements

- A. Subject to the availability of facilities and the reasonable requirements of the Company for its telecommunications services, Company will provide to carrier, upon request, those facilities and arrangements described herein which are necessary to establish the physical connection and interchange of local and intraLATA traffic provided for herein and other intraLATA facilities carrier may require for operation of its system such as remote transmitter and receiver links. The facilities and arrangement, the location(s) of such connection(s), including maintenance and operating points of demarcation and the additional facilities provided for use in carrier's system are set forth in Paragraphs 32.1.20, A. and B.

- B. In interchanging two-way mobile traffic, Company will extend and connect its facilities with those of carrier between:
 - 1. A Class 5 central office of any telephone exchange within a LATA whose rate center is located in carrier's reliable service area, and
 - 2. The message center(s) or control point(s) in or serving carrier's reliable service area in the same LATA.

- C. In interchanging one-way signaling traffic, Company will extend and connect its facilities with those of carrier between:
 - 1. A Class 5 central office of any telephone exchange within a LATA which a paging device is serviced by carrier's integrated single or multi-transmitter extended area paging system, and
 - 2. The control point(s) in or serving carrier's extended area system in the same LATA.

- D. Any facility or arrangement provided hereunder shall be of the type normally utilized in the furnishing of the Company's intraLATA telecommunications services including, but not limited to: effective two-wire and four-wire voice grade and voice grade data facilities, wire pair facilities to the extent offered under tariff to other carrier, central office outpulsing facilities and exchange access lines or trunks from the central office serving carrier to carrier's premises.

- E. Central office facilities and blocks of telephone numbers provided by Company for carrier's use shall be assigned by Company and may be changed to meet the reasonable operating and service requirements of Company. Carrier shall not acquire any proprietary interest in numbers assigned for its use. Where such changes are to be made, Company shall advise carrier in writing not less than 60 days in advance and will coordinate the changes with carrier.

- F. Central office codes used with telephone numbers furnished to carrier may be used by Company in providing its subscriber services and for other purposes.

32.1.3 Facilities and Arrangements-(Continued)

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- G. Carrier shall be provided telephone numbers in initial and incremental blocks of 100 numbers each, but Company and carrier may agree to the provision of numbers in greater quantities. Carrier shall furnish Company its number requirements for planning purposes, but shall not be required to pay for numbers in advance of their assignment by Company in order to guarantee number availability. Within the number blocks assigned under Paragraph E., preceding, the assignment and use of such numbers of carrier to its subscribers for its authorized services shall be the responsibility of carrier subject to coordination with Company for efficient operation with Company's system.
- H. Company will cooperate with carrier in the development of any necessary specialized telecommunications facilities or arrangements reasonably required for the physical connection and interchange of traffic provided hereunder.

32.1.4 Use of Facilities and Services

- A. The connecting circuits provided hereunder shall be used only for the handling of interchanged local and/or intraLATA traffic originating or terminating on carrier's system in connection with carrier's authorized services. Such circuits may, however, be used occasionally or incidentally for incoming calls concerning administrative matters related to carrier's authorized services.
- B. Connecting circuits, facilities or arrangements provided shall not be used, switched or otherwise connected together by the carrier for the provision of through calling from a landline telephone to another landline telephone, nor shall they be switched or otherwise connected together by the carrier for the provision of through calling from a landline or mobile unit located in one reliable service area to a landline telephone or mobile unit in another reliable service area, except as specifically provided for in this Tariff.
- C. Connecting circuits, facilities and arrangements provided to carrier by Company shall not be used knowingly for any purpose or in any manner, directly or indirectly, in violation of law or in aid of any unlawful act or undertaking.

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32.1 REGULATIONS-(Continued)

32.1.5 Charges for Facilities and Arrangements
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- A. The facilities and arrangements provided by Company to carrier and all charges, therefore, are set forth hereinafter in Section 32.3. Carrier agrees to pay the Company all charges specified in Section 32.3 within 30 days of the date of the statement rendered for those charges.
- B. All monthly charges provided for in Section 32.3 shall be billed by Company monthly, in advance, except that charges due for the initial month, or a portion of the initial month, during which new items are provided will be included in the next bill rendered.
- C. In the event that the facility or arrangement has been in service for less than one month, the full monthly charge shall be due on termination, together with any applicable nonrecurring charges. In the event prior to initiating service to the public, carrier cancels an order for a facility or arrangement prior to placing it in service; and Company has incurred costs in connection with the facilities or arrangements to be provided, carrier shall reimburse Company the full charges for one month, together with any applicable nonrecurring charges or the reasonable costs, less net salvage, actually incurred by the Company if such costs are greater than the monthly and applicable nonrecurring charges.
- D. For the purposes of Paragraph C., preceding, the term "costs" shall include the nonrecoverable cost of equipment and material ordered, plus the nonrecoverable cost of installation and removal including the cost of engineering, labor, supervision, transportation, rights-of-way and other associated costs.

32.1.6 Charges, Billing and Payments for Interchanged Calls

- A. The charges to subscribers of Company and of carrier for an interchanged call shall be determined as set forth in this paragraph and shall be set forth in their respective tariffs applicable to the type of traffic interchanged.

- 1. The total charge for an interchanged call shall be the Company's charge for its portion of the service plus the carrier's charge for its portion of the service. Except as provided in 27, following, neither Company nor carrier may impose charges (other than those for facilities and arrangements as set forth in Section 1323) upon the other carrier or upon subscribers of the other carrier in connection with interchanged calls provided hereunder.

2. The charges for intraLATA message toll telephone service shall be the charges set forth in Company's applicable message toll tariff between the point of origination or termination on Company's system and the point or points of interchange with carrier's system, plus carrier's charge for use of its system during such message.

a. For messages billable to stations on Company's system or to Company's subscribers (i.e., sent-paid from Company stations or placed on a received-collect or Company credit card basis to Company stations), Company shall bill and collect from its subscriber its charges for its portion of the service.

b. For messages sent-paid from stations on carrier's system or placed on a received-collect basis to such stations, Company shall bill carrier for Company's charges for its portion of the service, and carrier will pay such charges without allowance for uncollectibles. Carrier shall bill and collect its charges for its portion of the service and Company's charges billed to carrier.

c. Where carrier bills its subscriber for intraLATA message toll telephone service, carrier shall bill at the Tariff rates of the Company without discount or surcharge.

B. Necessary timing and ticketing of Company's portion of an interchanged call shall be performed by Company. Necessary timing and ticketing of carrier's portion of a through call shall be performed by carrier.

C. An itemized statement of charges payable to Company by carrier for Company's portion of through calls originating sent-paid from stations on carrier's system or placed on a received-collect basis to stations on carrier's system shall be rendered monthly to carrier by Company. Carrier shall remit the full amount of all stated charges to Company within 30 days following the date of the statement.

The Company and the carrier each may make reasonable tests and inspections of its facilities and may, upon notice to and coordination with the other, temporarily interrupt the facilities being tested or inspected. When cooperative testing is requested by either party, such testing shall be done in accordance with Paragraph 32.1.18.

32.1.8 Trouble Reporting

Subscribers of the carrier shall be instructed to report all cases of trouble to the carrier. The carrier shall handle trouble reporting and advise the Company in accordance with the procedures established in Paragraph 32.1.18.

32.1.9 Equipment Space and Power

The carrier shall furnish or arrange to have furnished to the Company, at no charge, equipment space and electrical power required by the Company to provide facilities. The selection of ac or dc power shall be mutually agreed to by the carrier and the Company. The carrier shall also make necessary arrangements in order that the Company and its agents will have access to such equipment space at reasonable times for installing, inspecting, repairing or removing its facilities.

32.1.10 Liability and Indemnity

- A. Neither party assumes any liability for any act or omission of the other in the furnishing of its service to its subscribers.
- B. The parties' performance shall be excused by labor difficulties, governmental orders, civil commotions, acts of God and other circumstances beyond the parties' reasonable control, subject to the interruption allowance provisions of Paragraph 32.1.12, following.
- C. The liability of the Company for damages arising out of delays in installation, maintenance or restoration of facilities, services or arrangements or out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of providing such facilities, services or arrangements shall in no event exceed the amount of the allowance, if any, available under Paragraph 32.1.12, following.

32.1.10 Liability and Indemnity-(Continued) Public Service Commission
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- D. The Company shall reimburse the carrier for damages to premises or equipment of the carrier resulting from the provision of facilities, services or arrangements by the Company on such premises or resulting from the installation or removal thereof if caused by the negligence or willful act of the Company.
- E. The carrier shall reimburse the Company for damages to facilities of the Company if caused by the negligence or willful act of the carrier due to malfunction of any facilities or equipment provided by other than the Company. The Company will, upon reimbursement for damages, cooperate with the carrier in prosecuting a claim against the person causing such damage, and the carrier shall be subrogated to the right of recovery by the Company for the damages to the extent of such payment.
- F. The carrier shall reimburse the Company for any loss through theft of facilities provided on the carrier's premises.
- G. The parties shall cooperate with each other in the defense of any suit, claim or demand by third persons against either or both of them arising out of the connection arrangements and interchange of traffic hereunder including, without limitation, Workmen's Compensation claims, actions for infringement of copyright and/or unauthorized use of program material, libel and slander actions based on the content of communications.
- H. Neither party shall be required to reimburse the other for any claim or loss pursuant to this paragraph where the amount in controversy is less than \$100.

32.1.11 Patents

- A. With respect to claims of patent infringement made by third persons, carrier shall defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless Company from and against all claims arising out of the combining with or use in connection with, the facilities, services or arrangements of any circuit, apparatus, system or method provided by carrier or its subscribers.

B. No license under patents is granted by Company to carrier or shall be implied or arise by estoppel in carrier's favor with respect to any circuit, apparatus, system or method used by carrier in connection with any facilities, services or arrangements. With respect to claims of patent infringement made by third persons, Company will defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless carrier from and against all claims arising out of the use by carrier of facilities, services or arrangements furnished by Company.

32.1.12 Allowance for Interruptions

When use of the facilities furnished by Company is interrupted due to trouble in such facilities, and such interruption is not caused by (a) the negligence of carrier or its subscriber or (b) the fault of facilities or equipment provided by carrier or its subscriber, carrier shall, upon request, be allowed a credit as follows:

- A. The amount of credit to carrier shall be an amount equal to the pro rata monthly charge specified in Section 32.3 for the period during which the facility affected by the interruption is out of service.
- B. All credit for interruption shall begin from the time of actual notice by carrier to Company, in accordance with Paragraph 32.1.8, preceding, that an interruption of use has occurred. No credit shall be allowed for an amount of less than \$5.00.
- C. A credit shall not be applicable for any period during which carrier fails to afford access to the facilities furnished by Company for the purpose of investigating and clearing troubles.

32.1.13 Technical Specifications

Subject to any special arrangements pursuant to Paragraph 32.1.3, H., preceding, the design, installation, operation and maintenance of all circuits, equipment and other facilities of carrier and Company which are used in handling interchanged traffic shall be made in accordance with Bell System Technical Reference Number 43303, as from time to time may be amended, a copy of which has been provided to carrier by Company.

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32.1 REGULATIONS-(Continued)

32.1.14 Protection

- A. The characteristics and methods of operation of any circuits, facilities or equipment of the carrier connected with the services, facilities or equipment of the Company shall not interfere with or impair service over any facilities of the Company, its affiliated companies or its connecting and concurring carriers involved in its services, cause damage to their plant, impair the privacy of any communications carried over their facilities or create hazards to the employees of any of them or the public.
- B. If such characteristics or methods of operation are not in accordance with A., preceding, the Company will, where practicable, notify the carrier that temporary discontinuance of the use of any circuits, facility or equipment may be required; however, when prior notice is not practicable, nothing contained herein shall be deemed to preclude the Company from temporarily discontinuing forthwith the use of a circuit, facility or equipment if such action is reasonable under the circumstances. In case of such temporary discontinuance, the carrier will be promptly notified and afforded the opportunity to correct the condition which gave rise to the temporary discontinuance. During such period of temporary discontinuance, allowance for interruption of service as set forth in Paragraph 32.1.12, preceding, is not applicable.
- C. The physical connection of facilities and interchange of traffic hereunder may be temporarily discontinued by either party upon 30 days' notice to the other for repeated or willful violation of or a refusal to comply with this paragraph or Paragraphs 32.1.2, 32.1.4 and 32.1.17.
- D. The party discontinuing will notify the Federal Communications Commission and the appropriate state regulatory body concurrently with the notice to other party of the prospective discontinuance for cause.

32.1.15 Records

Each party will keep adequate records of its operations and transactions and shall furnish to the other party such information as may be reasonably required for the administration of this tariff. Carrier will, upon reasonable request, furnish copies or otherwise make available to Company its licenses and other federal and, if applicable, state regulatory authorization and its filed or to be filed tariffs or other published schedule of charges pertaining to the traffic to be interchanged hereunder.

32.1.16 Deposits

- A. The Company may, in order to safeguard its interests, require the carrier to make a deposit to be held by the Company as a guarantee of the payment of charges. Such deposit may not exceed an amount equal to the sum of (a) twice the amount of the monthly charges for facilities and arrangements specified in Section 32.3, plus (b) twice the estimated average monthly charges for local and toll messages billed to the carrier.
- B. The fact that a deposit has been made does not relieve the carrier from complying with the requirements for advance payments or the prompt payment of bills as specified elsewhere in this Tariff. At such time as the provision of facilities and arrangements to the carrier is terminated, the amount of the deposit will be credited to the carrier's account, and any credit balance which may remain will be refunded. At the option of the Company, such a deposit may be refunded or credited to the carrier at any time. In case of a cash deposit, simple interest at the annual rate of 9 percent shall be paid for the period during which such deposit is held by the Company.

32.1.17 Changes and Modifications

- A. If the Company proposes to make any permanent changes in its operations which would affect the carrier's operations or services once the facilities, arrangements, apparatus, equipment or any other item furnished by the Company to the carrier are installed, the Company shall give notice to the carrier in advance of any such changes advising when such changes will be made. All such changes shall be coordinated with the carrier. Where such changes are made for Company's purposes, and where practicable, temporary equipment or facilities shall be provided to the carrier by the Company at no additional charge. If the carrier proposes to make any changes in its operations or services which would affect Company's operations or services, the carrier shall give notice to the Company in advance of any such changes advising when such changes will be made. All such changes shall be coordinated with the Company.
- B. Subject to the provisions of Paragraph A., preceding, carrier shall be solely responsible, at its expense, for the overall design of its services and for any redesigning or rearrangement of its services which may be required because of changes in facilities, operations or procedures of the Company, minimum network protection criteria or maintenance characteristics of the facilities.

32.1.18 Trouble Reporting, Installation and Testing Procedures

- A. In order to facilitate trouble reporting and to coordinate the repair of private line circuits (e.g., remote transmitter links) provided to the carrier by the Company, the Company will designate a Plant Control Office (PCO) for such private line circuits.
- B. Where new private line circuits are installed, the PCO will ensure that continuity has been established and that appropriate transmission measurements have been made before advising the carrier that the new circuit is ready for service.
- C. In locations where requested by the carrier, the Company will furnish a direct seven-digit trouble reporting number for the designated PCO. This number will give the carrier access to the location where its facility records are normally located and where current status reports on any trouble reports are readily available. Alternative out-of-hours procedures will be established as required to ensure access by the carrier to a location which is covered and has the authority to initiate corrective action.
- D. To minimize outages on Company-provided exchange access and private lines, it is important that effective trouble reporting and clearing procedures be established. To that end:
 - 1. When the carrier reports a trouble condition, it will first have used its best efforts to isolate the trouble to the Company's facilities. It will also advise the Company of the usage sensitivity of the circuit and the need for expedited clearance.
 - 2. In cases where the carrier indicates essential or important subscriber usage on lines provided by Company, the Company will attempt to expedite the clearance in a manner similar to its local procedures used to restore similar Company essential services.
 - 3. Company and carrier will make cooperative tests, as appropriate, to eliminate the necessity for either party to dispatch repair forces needlessly to distant unattended locations merely to isolate the trouble.

(CT) 32.1.19 Customer Owned Equipment Trouble Isolation Charges

A. Carrier obtains from the Company intraLATA access lines terminating in RCC equipment and intraLATA private line circuits connecting its control terminals to its transmitter/receiver isolation of each carrier's equipment and facilities for testing purposes. Both Company and carrier believe that because each carrier is a responsible, regulated communications common carrier, each should be responsible for isolating and clearing troubles on its own system.

(CT) B. Carrier and Company recognize that isolation charges need not be applied if each carrier carries out its proper function and have, therefore, agreed to implement on a trial basis a procedure which will eliminate these charges.

C. Under this procedure, either Company or carrier upon discovering trouble in its service will respond to the trouble reported by isolating the problem to its own or the other carrier's system. Each carrier will clear the trouble in its own system prior to handing off the trouble to the other. However, if either carrier feels that the other is abusing the trouble reporting system and causing the other unreasonable or inordinate time and expense to find troubles which are ultimately determined to be in the reporting carrier's system, the aggrieved carrier may institute an isolation charge in accordance with the following procedure:

(CT) 1. Should a carrier believe that another carrier is not carrying out its responsibilities to isolate troubles to and clear troubles on its own system prior to reporting troubles to another carrier, the aggrieved carrier should notify the other carrier in writing that the accepted trouble reporting practices and procedures are being abused, with specific illustration of the abuse, and that he intends to assess isolation charges for any further abuses that occur.

2. Upon receipt of the written notice by the other carrier, both carriers will meet as soon as possible to review the problem and take corrective action.

(CT) 3. If the carriers are unable to resolve the dispute, the aggrieved carrier will give written notice that he intends to implement isolation charges by a specific date, but not less than ten days from the date of such notice.

- 3. When carrier's terminal is not able to complete calls because of malfunction in the terminal or other equipment, carrier shall either divert the call to its operator or provide a recorded announcement to the calling party that the call cannot be completed.
- 4. Carrier shall provide supervisory tones or voice announcement to the calling party on all calls, consistent with standard telephone industry practices.

32.2 SPECIAL CONSTRUCTION

32.2.1 This Section contains the regulations, liabilities, rates and charges applicable for special construction of Telephone Company facilities which are used to provide services offered in this and other Southwestern Bell Telephone Company Tariffs.

When special construction of facilities is required, the provisions of this Section apply in addition to all regulations, rates and charges set forth in other Southwestern Bell Telephone Company Tariffs.

32.2.2 Ownership of Facilities

The Telephone Company retains ownership of all specially constructed facilities.

32.2.3 Interval to Provide Facilities

Based on available information and the type of service ordered, the Telephone Company will establish a completion date for the specially constructed facilities. The Telephone Company will make every reasonable effort to assure that the date is met. However, shortage of material, personnel or other factors may lengthen the installation interval. The Telephone Company does not guarantee that the facilities will be available on the scheduled date and assumes no liability if that date is missed. If the scheduled completion date cannot be met, the carrier will be notified, and a new completion date will be established.

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32.2 SPECIAL CONSTRUCTION-(Continued)

32.2.4 Payments for Special Construction

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A. Payment of Charges

All bills associated with special construction charges are due in accordance with the appropriate regulations in the service tariff under which service is being provided.

B. Start/End of Billing

Billing of recurring charges for specially constructed facilities starts on the day after the facilities are made available for use. Billing accrues through and includes the day that the specially constructed facilities are discontinued.

C. Partial Payments

To safeguard its interests during construction, the Telephone Company may require partial payment(s) for the portion of the estimated cost of the special construction for which a nonrecurring charge will apply. Partial payments may be requested as costs are incurred and will be credited against the total bill. Partial payments may not exceed the total non-recurring charge for the special construction. If any partial payment is not received by the Telephone Company by the end of the first working day of the next month, the Telephone Company will cease all work on the special construction case, and cancellation charges will apply as set forth in Paragraph 32.2.5, D.7., following.

32.2.5 Liabilities and Charges for Special Construction

A. General

This Section describes the various charges and liabilities that may apply when the Telephone Company provides special construction of facilities in accordance with an order for service. Written approval of all liabilities and charges must be provided to the Telephone Company prior to the start of construction.

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32.2 SPECIAL CONSTRUCTION-(Continued)

32.2.5 Liabilities and Charges for Special Construction-(Continued)

B. Conditions Requiring Special Construction

Special construction is required when (1) suitable facilities are not available to meet an order for service, and (2) the Telephone Company constructs facilities and (3) one or more of the following conditions exist:

- The Telephone Company has no other requirement for the facilities constructed.
- It is requested that service be furnished using a type of facility, or via a route, other than that which the Telephone Company would normally utilize in furnishing the requested service.
- More facilities are requested than would normally be required to satisfy an order.
- It is requested that construction be expedited, resulting in added cost to the Telephone Company.

C. Development of Liabilities and Charges

Special construction charges and liabilities will be developed based on estimated costs, except when actual costs are requested in writing prior to start of special construction. In order to meet a scheduled service date when actual costs are requested, an initial special construction case will be made based on estimated costs. Such case will be revised when actual costs are available.

D. Types of Liabilities and Charges

Depending on the specifics associated with each individual case, one or more of the following special construction charges and/or liabilities may be applicable:

1. Quotation Charge

A nonrecurring charge for the preparation of a quotation applies whenever an estimate for special construction charges and liabilities is requested. The charge includes the costs associated with the development and preparation of the quotation.

32.2.5 Liabilities and Charges for Special Construction-(Continued)

D. Types of Liabilities and Charges-(Continued)

1. Quotation Charge-(Continued)

The quotation is valid for 90 days and identifies all rates, charges and liabilities associated with the provision of the facilities required to satisfy a service request. Within this 90-day period, if the service is ordered as quoted and service is subsequently provided, the Quotation Charge will be credited to the appropriate account.

If a request for a quotation is cancelled prior to its completion, a bill will be rendered for the costs incurred for quotation preparation through the cancellation date.

The payment of a Quotation Charge does not assign, confer, or transfer title or ownership rights of proposals or facilities designed or furnished by the Telephone Company. Title and ownership rights for any item remains with the Telephone Company, except as specifically provided by a written agreement between all parties.

2. Nonrecurring Charge

A nonrecurring charge always applies and includes one or more of the following components:

a. Case Preparation Charge

A nonrecurring charge always includes a case preparation charge component to cover the administrative expenses associated with preparing a special construction case.

b. Expediting Charge

A nonrecurring charge may include an expediting charge when it is requested that special construction be completed on an expedited basis. The charge equals the difference in estimated cost between expedited and non-expedited construction.

2. Nonrecurring Charge-(Continued)

c. Optional Payment

An optional payment charge may be included in the non-recurring charge in association with a type of facility or route other than that which the Telephone Company would normally use in furnishing the requested service if lower recurring monthly charges are desired for the specially constructed facilities. This charge is equal to the excess installed cost or the total nonrecoverable cost, whichever is less. This election must be made in writing before special construction starts. If this election is coupled with the actual cost option, the optional payment charge will reflect the actual cost of the specially constructed facilities.

d. Replacement Charge

If any portion of specially constructed facilities for which an optional payment charge has been paid requires replacement involving capital investment, a replacement charge will apply. This charge will be in the same ratio to the total replacement cost as the initial optional payment charge was to the installed cost of the original specially constructed facilities. If any portion of the facilities subject to the replacement charge fails, service will not be restored until modification is provided in writing that replacement is required and such replacement is ordered.

e. Rearrangement Charge

If the Telephone Company is requested to rearrange existing specially constructed facilities, a nonrecurring charge component equal to the cost of rearrangement will apply.

f. Special Construction of Facilities For Use For Less Than One Month

When the Telephone Company is requested to construct facilities to provide service for less than one month, a nonrecurring charge only applies. In addition to the case preparation charge component, this nonrecurring charge recovers all elements of cost, including engineering, shipping of equipment, equipment installation, line-up, equipment leasing, space rental, equipment removal, and any other costs associated with the construction of the facilities.

3. Maximum Termination Liability and Termination Charge

A Maximum Termination Liability is equal to the nonrecoverable costs associated with specially constructed facilities and is the maximum amount which could be applied as a Termination Charge if all specially constructed facilities were discontinued before the Maximum Termination Liability expires.

The liability period is equal to the average life of the account associated with the specially constructed facilities. The liability period is generally expressed in terms of an effective date and expiration date.

A Termination Charge may apply when all services using specially constructed facilities which have a tariffed Maximum Termination Liability are discontinued prior to the expiration of the liability period. The charge reflects the unamortized portion of the nonrecoverable costs at the time of termination, adjusted for net salvage and possible reuse. Administrative costs associated with the specific case of special construction and any cost for restoring a location to its original condition are also included.

4. Annual Underutilization Liability and Underutilization Charge

Annual Underutilization Liability is a per-unit amount which is based on the per-unit cost of specially constructed facilities. The liability remains in effect until the expiration of the Maximum Termination Liability or until the special construction case is discontinued and all termination liabilities associated with the case are discharged. An underutilization charge may be applicable after the expiration of the minimum period, as set forth in the appropriate service tariff under which service is being provided, depending on the quantity of specially constructed facilities in service.

No underutilization charges are computed or billed until one year after the minimum period expires. At that time, an underutilization charge applies to the difference, if any, between the original number of specially constructed facilities and the number of specially constructed facilities in service at filed tariff rates. The underutilization charge applies from the date the minimum period expires and annually thereafter. For purposes of determining an underutilization charge, any facilities subject to minimum service period monthly charges are considered to be in service at filed tariff rates.

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5. Recurring Monthly Charges

a. Excess Capacity Charge

A recurring monthly excess capacity charge applies when more facilities are requested and subsequently specially constructed than are required to satisfy an order for service. The charge is based on the estimated cost difference between the facilities constructed and the facilities which would normally be required to meet the order for service. Charges apply until there are sufficient services to warrant the facilities which were originally constructed.

5. Recurring Monthly Charges--(Continued)

b. Charge for Route or Type Other Than Normal

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When special construction is requested using a route or type of facility other than that which the Telephone Company would normally use, a recurring monthly charge, in addition to the monthly rates for service, is applicable. The charge is equal to the difference between the recurring costs of the specially constructed facilities and the recurring costs of the facilities the Telephone Company would have normally used.

(1) When an Optional Payment Charge as set forth in Paragraph 32.2.5, D.2.c., preceding, has been elected, the recurring monthly charge will be reduced to include specially constructed facility operating expenses only.

(2) If the actual cost option as set forth in Paragraph 32.2.5, C., preceding, has been elected, the recurring charge will be adjusted to reflect the actual cost of the new construction when the costs have been determined. This adjusted recurring charge is applicable from the start of service.

6. Lease Charge

This charge applies when the Telephone Company leases equipment in order to meet service requirements. The amount of the charge is equal to the net added cost to the Telephone Company caused by the lease.

7. Cancellation Charge

If a service order with which special construction is associated is cancelled prior to the start of service, a Cancellation Charge will apply. The charge will include all nonrecoverable costs incurred by the Telephone Company in association with the special construction up to and including the time of cancellation.

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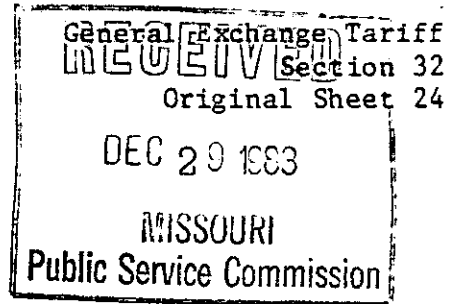

32.2.6 Deferral of Start of Service

The Telephone Company may be requested to defer the start of service which will use specially constructed facilities subject to the provisions set forth in the service tariff under which service is being provided. Requests for special construction deferral must be in writing and are subject to the following regulations:

A. Construction Has Not Begun

If the Telephone Company has not incurred any installation costs before receiving a request for deferral, the Quotation Charge applies. The original quotation is subject to Telephone Company review at the time of reinstatement to determine if the original charge estimates are still valid.

An additional quotation charge will, therefore, apply. Any change in liabilities and charges requires concurrence in writing.

B. Construction Has Begun

If the construction of facilities has begun before the Telephone Company receives a request for deferral, charges will vary as follows:

1. All Services Are Deferred

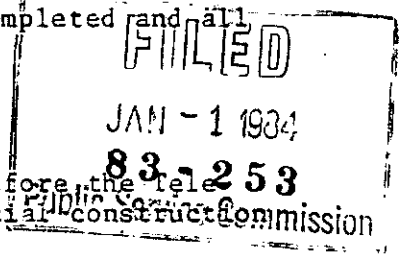
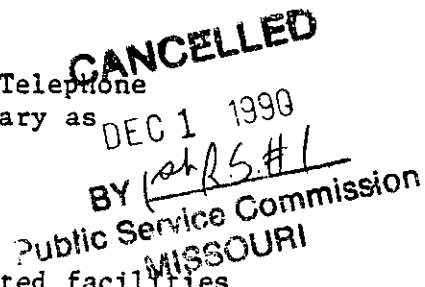
When all services which will use specially constructed facilities are deferred, a charge based on the costs incurred by the Telephone Company during each month of the deferral will apply. Those costs include the recurring costs for that portion of the facilities already completed and any other costs associated with the deferral. The Quotation Charge and cost of any components of the nonrecurring charge which have been completed at the time of deferral will also apply.

2. Some Services Are Deferred

When some services which will use the specially constructed facilities are deferred, the construction case will be completed and all special construction charges will apply.

C. Construction Complete

If the construction of facilities has been completed before the Telephone Company receives a request for deferral, all special construction charges will apply.

- (1) The method of applying rates for interexchange and intraexchange service involving Radio Common Carriers (RCC's) are determined as follows:

Local Channel

A local channel charge shall apply for each channel terminated on the RCC's premises.

Interoffice Channel

Intraexchange - When station locations of an RCC service are located in different serving office areas, interoffice mileage charges apply. Charges are based on the V&H distance between the serving offices.

Interexchange - When a station location of an RCC service is located in an area served by a serving office that is not also the primary serving office, interoffice mileage charges apply. Charges are based on the V&H distance between the primary serving office and the serving office.

Channel Terminal

Channel Terminal Charges apply (1) at each termination of an interexchange channel and (2) each termination of an interoffice channel.

Interexchange Channel

When station locations of an RCC service are located in different exchanges or Metropolitan Exchanges, interexchange mileage charges apply.

Each exchange and each zone of a Metropolitan Exchange has one primary serving office. Charges are based on the V&H distance between primary serving offices.

An SSAR should only be issued if a vendor must be scheduled into the central office to provide the proper trunk units. The trunk units will be added at no cost to the carrier if the carrier can wait until the vendor is scheduled into that office for our purposes (next-job basis).
