Long Distance Message Telecommunications Sentace LLOME Envis the furnishing of those service components required for telecommunications between service points in different local service areas in accordance with the regulations and system of charges specified in this Tariff. The message charges specified in this Tariff are in payment for Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service furnished between the calling and called service points. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service usage is classified as a transitionally competitive service.
 - b. The charges specified in this Tariff do not encompass work being performed by the Telephone Company employees involved at a time when overtime wages apply due to the request of the customer, nor do they encompass work once begun being interrupted by the customer. If the customer requests that overtime labor be performed or interrupts work once begun, an additional charge based on the additional costs involved applies.
 - c. The Telephone Company does not undertake to transmit messages but furnishes the use of its services to its customers for telecommunications.
 - The design, maintenance and operation of Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service envisions that communications will originate or terminate at a service point of the associated exchange telephone service used for LDMTS. Connections of customer premises equipment or communications systems interexchange customer-provided premises equipment However, the communications systems may be made to LDMTS. Telephone Company will not be responsible for the through transmission of signals or for the quality of transmission through such connections.
 - e. The rules and regulations as applied to billing and collection practices for services provided to customers are found in the General Rules and Regulations of the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff.
 - 2. Availability of Services
 - a. In case a shortage of service components exists at any time, either for temporary or protracted periods, the establishment of Local and Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service shall take precedence over all others.

At the option of the Telephone Company, Call Restriction Services, as set forth in the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff, will be furnished to control instances of fraud associated with billed to third party, station-to-station or person-to-person collect calls or in response to a customer request.
- 3. Limitations on Duration of Connections
 The Company reserves the right to limit the duration of connection when necessary because of a shortage of service components caused by emergency conditions.
- 4. Liability
 - a. In view of the fact that the customer has exclusive control of his communications over the services furnished him by the Telephone Company, and of the other uses for which services may be furnished him by the Telephone Company, and because of unavoidableness of errors incident to the services and to the use of such services of the Telephone Company, the services furnished by the Company are subject to the terms, conditions and limitations specified in b., c., and d., following.

The liability of the Telephone Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors or defects in transmission or failures or defects in service components furnished by the Telephone Company occurring in the course of furnishing service and not caused by the negligence of the customer, or of the Telephone Company in failing to maintain proper standards of maintenance and operation and to exercise reasonable supervision shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistake, omission, interruption, delay, error or defect in transmission or failure or defect in service components occurs.

- d. When the services of other telephone companies are used in establishing connections to points not reached by the Telephone Company's services, the Telephone Company is not liable for any act or omission of the other company or companies.

5. Use of Service

- a. The service is provided for use by the customer and may be used by others, when so authorized by the customer, providing that all such usage shall be subject to the provisions of this Tariff.
- b. The service is furnished subject to the condition that there will be no abuse or fraudulent use of the service. Abuse or fraudulent use of service includes:

- 3) The use of the service of the Telephone Company for a call or

When special construction for individual customers is necessary, special construction charges may apply as set forth in the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff.

10. Definitions

<u>ACCESSORIES</u> - The term "Accessories" denotes devices which are mechanically attached to or used with the services furnished by the Telephone Company and which are independent of and not electrically, acoustically or inductively connected to the conductors in the communications path of the telecommunications system.

<u>BILL TO THIRD PARTY</u> - The term "Bill to Third Party" denotes a billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to an authorized service point as determined by the Telephone Company other than the service point originating the call or the service point where the call is terminated.

<u>BUSY INTERRUPT</u> - The term "Busy Interrupt" denotes the service whereby the operator will interrupt a call in progress at the request of a customer after the line has been verified to be busy (see Line Status Verification).

<u>CALL FORWARDING</u> - Call Forwarding denotes that feature whereby a call placed to a customer's telephone number in one exchange (the call forwarding location) is automatically forwarded by Telephone Company serving office equipment on a Long Distance Message Telecommunications Services basis only to a service point designated by said customer in another exchange within the same LATA. Provision of Call Forwarding is subject to the availability of service components.

<u>CALLING CARD</u> - The term "Calling Card" denotes a billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to an authorized telecommunications company calling card number.

<u>COLLECT CALL</u> - The term "Collect Call" denotes a billing arrangement by which the charge for a call may be reversed provided the charge is accepted at the called service point. A collect call may be billed to a calling card or third party number. In the case of a public or semi-public coin telephone, the charges must be billed to a calling card or third-party number, or the call may be reoriginated from the called service point.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS</u> - Channels and other service components which are capable, when not connected to the Telecommunications Network, of two-way communications between customer premises equipment and/or Telephone Company service points.

<u>COMMUNITY OPTIONAL SERVICE (COS) CALLING SCOPE</u> - The Community Optional Service (COS) Calling Scope consists of the Target Exchange to which Petitioning Exchange customers have qualified for COS calling, plus all other exchanges with which customers in the Target Exchange have Extended Area Service (EAS).

<u>COS PETITIONING EXCHANGE</u> - The COS Petitioning Exchange is that exchange whose customers petition the MPSC to have COS calling with the customers in the COS Target Exchange.

<u>COS TARGET EXCHANGE</u> - The Target Exchange is the exchange to which customers in another exchange have petitioned for COS service.

<u>CUSTOMER</u> - The person, firm or corporation which orders service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the regulations of the Telephone Company.

<u>EXCHANGE ACCESS ARRANGEMENT</u> - (EAA) A telephone service component which permits access to and from the customer's premises and the telephone exchange network point. A telephone exchange network point is also known as a serving office.

<u>EXTENDED AREA SERVICE (EAS)</u> - Mandatory interexchange telephone service furnished at a flat rate between two or more exchange areas.

<u>INITIAL AND ADDITIONAL PERIOD</u> - The initial period denotes the interval of time allowed at the rate specified for a connection between given points. The additional period denotes the unit of time used for measuring and charging for time in excess of the initial period.

PUBLIC SERVICE VOIDE INTEREXCHANGE CUSTOMER(S) (IC) - Denotes any individual, partnership. association, corporation, or governmental agency or any other entity which subscribes to the services offered under Tariff P.S.C. Mo. No. Facilities for Intrastate Access, to provide intrastate telecommunications services for its own use or for the use of its customers (End Users).

INTERFACE - That point on the premises of the customer at which provision is made for connection of other than Telephone Company provided service components to service components provided by the Telephone Company.

<u>INTRALATA</u> - Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service (LDMTS) where the originating service point location and the terminating service point location are all within the same Local Access and Transport Area (LATA).

LINE STATUS VERIFICATION - The term "Line Status Verification" denotes the service whereby the operator will verify and provide the status of a subscriber line at the request of a customer.


LOCAL ACCESS AND TRANSPORT AREA (LATA) - The Local Access and Transport Area denotes a geographical area established for the administration of communications service. It encompasses designated local operating Telephone Company exchanges which are grouped to serve common social, economic and miscellaneous purposes.

LOCAL EXCHANGE CARRIER (LEC) - The certificated provider of basic local exchange telephone service.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING - The transmission of signals used in the telecommunications system which perform functions such as supervision (control status and charging signals), address signaling (i.e., dialing), calling and called number identification, audible tone signals, (call progress signals indicating re-order or busy conditions, alerting, coin denominations, coin collect and coin return tones) to control the operation of switching machines in the telecommunications system.

<u>NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING UNIT</u> - The equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Telephone Company for the provision of network control signaling.

<u>ORIGINATING EXCHANGE</u> - Telephone Company exchanges in which residential and business customers may order Extended Exchange Calling Plan (EECP) Service. A listing of all EECP originating exchanges is found in Section J.4.a. of this tariff.


PERSON-TO-PERSON (See Two-Point Service).

<u>SERVICE POINT</u> - When used in connection with customer provided communications channels or systems, denotes the point on the customer's premises where channels provided by or furnished to the customer are terminated in switching equipment used, in the normal mode of operation, for communications with service points or customer premises equipment located on the premises.

<u>SERVICE TERMINATING ARRANGEMENT</u> - The term "Service Terminating Arrangement" denotes Telephone Company provided equipment which terminates exchange telephone service, used for Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service (LDMTS), at a customer's premises. The "Service Terminating Arrangement" provides a clearly delineated interface which facilitates the design, isolation and testing of LDMTS. Where a protective connecting arrangement is required, the "Service Terminating Arrangement" is provided as a part of the protective connecting arrangement.

STATION - The network control signaling unit, ditable structher equipment at the customer's premises which enables the customer to establish the communications connection to effect communications through such connections; also denotes a termination of an individual exchange line or PBX trunk, provided in accordance with the provisions of this Tariff, in switching equipment located in an exchange foreign to the exchange in which the customer is located.

STATION-TO-STATION (See Two-Point Service).

<u>TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICE</u> - Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service is that of furnishing service for telecommunications between service points in different local service areas within the same LATA in accordance with the regulations and system of charges specified in this Tariff.

TELEPHONE COMPANY - SPECTRA COMMUNICATIONS GROUP, LLC.

<u>TERMINATING EXCHANGE</u> - Missouri exchanges in which SPECTRA Extended Exchanges Calling Plan (EECP) customers may terminate calls. A listing of EECP Originating and Terminating Exchanges is found in Section J.4.a. of this tariff.





C. METHOD OF APPLYING RATES

- 1. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service rates between points (cities, towns, or localities) within the same LATA are based on the airline distance between rate centers. In general, each point is designated as a rate center; certain small towns or localities are assigned adjacent rate centers with which they are closely associated for communication purposes or by community of interest.
- 2. For the purpose of determining airline mileages vertical and horizontal grid lines have been established across the United States and Canada. The spacing between adjacent vertical grid lines and between horizontal grid lines represents a distance of one coordinate unit. This unit is the square root of 0.1, expressed in statute miles. A vertical (V) and a horizontal (H) coordinate is computed for each rate center from its latitude and longitude location by use of appropriate map projection for determining airline mileages, at a particular intersection of an established vertical grid line with and established horizontal grid line. The distance between any two rate centers is the airline mileage computed as explained in 3., following.
- 3. Determination of Airline Mileages
 - a. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service To determine the rate distance between any two rate centers proceed as follows:
 - 1) Obtain the (V) and (H) coordinates for each rate center.
 - 2) Obtain the difference between the (V) coordinates of the two rate centers. Obtain the difference between the (H) coordinates. NOTE: The difference is always obtained by subtracting the smaller coordinate from the larger coordinate.
 - 3) Divide each of the differences obtained in 2) by three, rounding each quotient to the nearer integer.

- 1) The Outstate Calling Area (OCA) Plan is an optional one-way Dial Station-to-Station Message Telecommunications Service (MTS) for customers in selected exchanges. See H.1.b following.
- 2) The OCA Plan offers discounted block of time calling beyond a customer's local exchange to rate centers that fall within the Calling Scope. See H.l.c following.
- 3) The local exchange company providing basic local exchange service in each exchange has the option to determine whether this service will be dialed as either 1+ (NXX-XXXX) or on a seven-digit basis.

b. Service Availability

- 1) The exchange listing in Section A.2 and A.3 identifies exchanges where OCA service is available. Customers in exchanges that are not referenced by Footnote 1 or 2 are eligible to subscribe to the OCA Plan. 

 - 1) The Calling Scope for an OCA exchange includes all intrastate intraLATA toll rating points within a 23-mile radius. The 23-mile radius, from each exchange, is based on air miles and is measured from rate center to rate center, as defined in this Tariff.
 - 2) Customers in Kansas City MCA-5, St. Louis MCA-5 and Springfield MCA-2 exchanges will be able to subscribe to the OCA Plan; however, the 23-mile radius will not include any toll rating points within the MCA.  - d. Calling Options

Residential and Business customers can choose from two OCA options.
