ORDER APPROVING DEMAND SIDE INVESTMENT MECHANISM RIDER RATE ADJUSTMENT

Issue Date: January 18, 2018 Effective Date: February 1, 2018

On November 30, 2017, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company ("GMO") filed an application under the Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act (MEEIA) to adjust its Demand Side Investment Mechanism (DSIM) rider, and submitted a tariff sheet with an effective date of February 1, 2018, to implement the proposed adjustments. The Commission issued notice of the filing, set an intervention deadline, and directed the Commission's Staff to submit a recommendation. No one filed an application to intervene.

4 CSR 240-20.093(4) and 4 CSR 240-3.163(8) require GMO to make semi-annual adjustments of its DSIM rates to reflect the amount of revenue that have been over or under-collected. The proposed tariff sheet increases the current residential DSIM Rider rate from \$0.00372 per kWh to \$0.00394 per kWh for residential customers and decreases rates from \$0.00995 per kWh to \$0.00832 per kWh for non-residential customers. GMO's requested adjustment would result in an increase in the DSIM Rider rate of a typical residential customer using 1,000 kWh by \$0.22 per month and a decrease in the DSIM

Rider rate for non-residential customers of \$1.63 for every 1,000 kWh used. The comprehensive DSIM Rider rate change decreases revenue collected from both residential and non-residential classes by \$3.4 million.

The Commission's Staff filed a recommendation on December 28, 2017, advising the Commission to approve the tariff sheet submitted by GMO based upon a review of GMO's calculations. No one filed a response or objection to the Staff recommendation.

The Commission's rule 4 CSR 240-20.093(4) regarding adjustment of DSIM rates between general rate proceedings states that if the proposed adjustments are in accordance with the rule, Section 393.1075, RSMo, and the previously-approved DSIM, the Commission shall issue an order approving the tariff sheets, and the adjustments shall take effect sixty days after the tariff is filed. The Commission has reviewed GMO's tariff filings and Staff's recommendation and memorandum, and finds that the proposed tariff sheet implementing the DSIM rate adjustment is in compliance with GMO's existing DSIM tariffs and with all applicable statutes and regulations. The Commission will approve GMO's proposed tariff.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company's tariff filing, assigned Tariff Tracking No. JE-2018-0071, as substituted, is approved to be effective February 1, 2018, as an interim rate adjustment, subject to prudence review. The tariff sheet approved is:
