PRELIMINARY STATEMENT/APPLICATION OF TARIFF Public Savice Commission

Metropolitan Fiber Systems of St. Louis, Inc. (hereinafter the "Company") has been classified by the Public Service Commission as a competitive carrier. This tariff sets forth the service offerings, rates, terms and conditions applicable to the furnishing of interexchange and local exchange telecommunication services, not including basic local telecommunications service.

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1. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

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Certain terms used generally throughout this tariff for the Network Services of this Company are defined below.

<u>Access</u>: A connection between a Customer Premises and a Point of Presence of an Interexchange Carrier for the transmission of voice data or video/image information.

Alternate Access: Alternate Access has the same meaning as Local Access except that the provider of the Service is an entity other than the Local Exchange Carrier authorized or permitted to provide such service. The charges for Alternate Access may be subject to private agreement rather than published or special tariff if permitted by applicable governmental rules.

Advance Payment: Part or all of a payment required before the start of service.

<u>Bit</u>: The smallest unit of information in the binary system of notation.

<u>Company</u>: Metropolitan Fiber Systems of St. Louis, Inc., the issuer of this tariff, which is a Missouri corporation.

<u>Customer</u>: The person, firm or corporation which orders service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the Company's regulations.

<u>Dedicated</u>: A facility or equipment system or subsystem set aside for the sole use of a specific Customer.

<u>Duplex Service</u>: Service which provides for simultaneous transmission in both directions.

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DEFINITIONS (Cont'd) 1.

MISSOUTH Fiber Optic Cable: A thin filament of glass with a protective outer coating through which a light beam carrying communications signals may be transmitted by means of multiple internal reflections to a receiver, which translates the message.

Individual Case Basis: A service arrangement in which the regulation, rates and charges are developed based on the specific circumstances of the case.

Local Access means the connection between a Local Access: Customer premises and a Company Point of Presence.

Megabits, denotes millions of bits per second.

The Company's digital fiber optics-based network located in the City of St. Louis, Missouri.

The Company's telecommunications access Network Services: services offered on the Company's Network.

Node: The Company office where all Customer facilities are terminated for purposes of interconnection to trunks and/or cross-connection to distant ends.

Non-Recurring Charges: The one-time initial charges for services or facilities, including but not limited to charges for construction, installation, or special fees, for which the Customer becomes liable at the time the Service Order is executed.

<u>Point to Point Service</u>: Point to Point Service is an unswitched full time transmission service utilizing the Company's facilities to connect two or more Customer designated locations.

<u>Premises</u>: The space occupied by a Customerioggauthorized user in a building or buildings or contiguous property (except railroad rights-of-way, etc.) not separated by a highway.

<u>Recurring Charges</u>: The monthly charges to the Customer for services, facilities and equipment, which continue for the agreed upon duration of the service.

Service Commencement Date: The first day following the date on which the Company notifies the Customer that the requested service or facility is available for use, unless extended by the Customer's refusal to accept service which does not conform to standards set forth in the Service Order or this tariff, in which case the Service Commencement Date is the date of the Customer's acceptance. The parties may mutually agree on a substitute Service Commencement Date.

<u>Service Order</u>: The written request for Network Services executed by the Customer and the Company in the format devised by the Company. The signing of a Service Order by the Customer and acceptance by the Company initiates the respective obligations of the parties as set forth therein and pursuant to this tariff, but the duration of the service is calculated from the Service Commencement Date.

<u>Services</u>: The Company's telecommunications access services offered on the Company's network.

<u>Shared</u>: A facility or equipment system or subsystem which can be used simultaneously by several Customers.

2.1 Undertaking of the Company

2.1.1 <u>Scope</u>

Network Services consist of furnishing dedicated communications service in connection with one-way and/or two-way information transmission between points within the St. Louis metropolitan area.

2.1.2 Shortage of Equipment or Facilities

- 2.1.2.1 The Company reserves the right to limit or to allocate the use of existing facilities, or of additional facilities offered by the Company, when necessary because of lack of facilities, or due to some other cause beyond the Company's control.
- 2.1.2.2 The furnishing of service under this tariff is subject to the availability on a continuing basis of all the necessary facilities and is limited to the capacity of the Company's fiber optic cable facilities as well as facilities the Company may obtain from other carriers to furnish service from time to time as required at the sole discretion of the Company.

2.1.3 Terms and Conditions

2.1.3.1 Service is provided on the basis of a minimum period of at least one month, 24-hours per day. For the purpose of computing charges in this tariff, a month is considered to have 30 days.

- 2.1.3 Terms and Conditions (Cont'd) Public Series Commission
 - 2.1.3.2 Customers may be required to enter into written service orders which shall contain or reference a specific description of the service ordered, the rates to be charged, the duration of the services, and the terms and conditions in this tariff. Customer will also be required to execute any other documents as may be reasonably requested by the Company.
 - 2.1.3.3 At the expiration of the initial term specified in each Service Order, or in any extension thereof, service shall continue on a month to month basis at the then current rates unless terminated by either party upon 30 days written notice. Any termination shall not relieve Customer of its obligation to pay any charges incurred under the service order and this tariff prior to termination. The rights and obligations which by their nature extend beyond the termination of the term of the service order shall survive such termination.

If installation is started during regular business hours but, at the Customer's request, extends beyond regular business hours into time periods including, but not limited to, weekends, holidays, and/or night hours, additional charges may apply.

- (g) involving abnormal costs; or
- (h) in advance of its normal construction.

2.4.2 Station Equipment

- 2.4.2.1 Customer provided terminal equipment on the Customer Premises, and the electric power consumed by such equipment shall be provided by and maintained at the expense of the Customer.
- 2.4.2.2 The Customer is responsible for ensuring that Customer-provided equipment connected to Company equipment and facilities is compatible with such equipment and facilities. magnitude and character of the voltages and currents impressed on Company-provided equipment and wiring by the connection, Company-provided operation, or maintenance of such equipment and wiring shall be such as not to cause damage to the Company-provided equipment and wiring or injury to the Company's employees or to other persons. Any additional protective equipment required to prevent such damage or injury shall be provided by the Company at the Customer's expense.

2.4.3.2 Network Services may be connected to the services or facilities of other communications carriers only when authorized by, and in accordance with, the terms and conditions of the tariffs of the other communications carriers which are applicable to such connections.

2.4.4 <u>Inspections</u>

2.4.4.1 Upon suitable notification to the Customer, and at a reasonable time, the Company may make such tests and inspections as may be necessary to determine that the Customer is complying with the requirements set forth in section 2.4.2.2 for the installation, operation, and maintenance of Customer-provided facilities, equipment, and wiring in the connection Customer-provided facilities and equipment to Company-owned facilities and equipment.

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2.4.4 <u>Inspections</u> (Cont'd)

If the protective requirements for Customerprovided equipment are not being complied with, the Company may take such action as it deems necessary to protect its facilities, equipment, and personnel. The Company will notify the Customer promptly if there is any need for further corrective action. days of receiving this notice, Customer must take this corrective action and notify the Company of the action taken. the Customer fails to do this, the Company may take whatever additional action is deemed necessary, including the suspension service, to protect its facilities, equipment and personnel from harm.

2.5 Payment Arrangements

2.5.1 Payment for Service

The Customer is responsible for the payment of all charges for facilities and services furnished by the Company to the Customer.

2.5.1.1 <u>Taxes</u>

The Customer is responsible for the payment of any sales, use, gross receipts, excise, access or other local, state and federal taxes, charges or surcharges (however designated) (excluding taxes on the Company's net income) imposed on or based upon the provision, sale or use of Network Services.

2.5 Payment Arrangements (Cont'd)

2.5.2 Billing and Collection of Charges HUSSELING Funite Collection

The Customer is responsible for payment of all charges incurred by the Customer or other users for services and facilities furnished to the Customer by the Company.

- 2.5.2.1 Non-recurring charges are due and payable within 30 days after the date an invoice is mailed to the Customer by the Company.
- 2.5.2.2 The Company shall present invoices for Recurring Charges monthly to the Customer, in advance of the month in which service is provided, and Recurring Charges shall be due and payable within 30 days after the invoice is mailed.
- 2.5.2.3 When service does not begin on the first day of the month, or end on the last day of the month, the charge for the fraction of the month in which service was furnished will be calculated on a pro rata basis. For this purpose, every month is considered to have 30 days.
- 2.5.2.4 Billing of the Customer by the Company will begin on the Service Commencement Date, which is the first day following the date on which the Company notifies the Customer that the service or facility is available for use, except that the Service Commencement Date may be postponed by mutual agreement of the parties, or if the service or facility does not conform to standards set forth in this
