## ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE AND DIRECTING FILING OF STAFF RECOMMENDATION

On October 28, 2020, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed an application for a certificate of convenience and necessity to construct, install, own, operate, maintain, and otherwise control and manage a solar electric generating facility in Montgomery County, Missouri, to serve as the second program resource for its expanded Community Solar Program.

The Commission directed notice and set a deadline of November 20, 2020, for applications to intervene. The Commission also set a deadline of December 4, 2020, for the Commission's Staff to file a recommendation or a status report indicating when it expects to file a recommendation. On November 18, 2020, Sierra Club filed a timely application to intervene. On December 4, 2020, the Staff filed a status report.

More than ten days have passed since the application was filed and no one has responded. After considering the unopposed application to intervene, the Commission finds that Sierra Club has interests which are different from that of the general public and allowing it to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

In its status report, Staff indicated that it expects to file its recommendation on February 5, 2021. The Commission will set that deadline for Staff's recommendation.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The application to intervene of Sierra Club is granted.
2. Staff shall file its recommendation no later than February 5, 2021.
3. This order shall be effective when issued.
