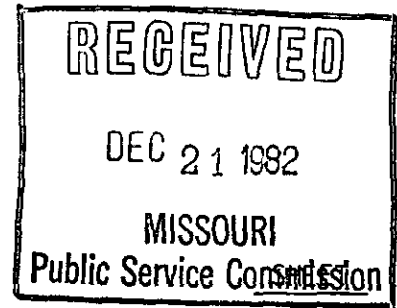

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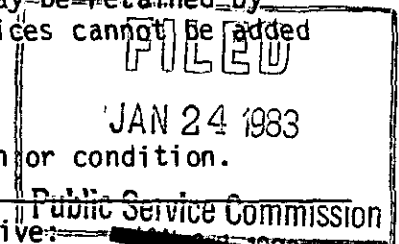

BASE RATE - A rate for urban grades of exchange service available to customers located within a Base Rate Area.

BASE RATE AREA - A specific area within which local telephone exchange service, other than rural-line or suburban service, is furnished at rates quoted in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs without extra mileage charges.

BUSINESS SERVICE - Telephone service furnished to customers where the actual or obvious use is of a business, professional or occupational nature.

CENTRAL OFFICE - A switching unit in a telephone system which provides service to the general public, having the necessary equipment and operating arrangements for the terminating and interconnecting customer lines and trunks or trunks only. There may be more than one central office in a building or exchange.

CENTRAL OFFICE LINE - A circuit directly connecting an individual or party line main station, PBX switchboard, or an intercommunicating system with a central office.

CHANNEL - A path for communication between two or more stations or central offices furnished in such a manner as the Company may elect, whether by wire, radio or a combination thereof and whether or not by a single physical facility or route.

CIRCUIT - A channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of telephone and other communication services.

CLASS OF SERVICE - The various categories of service generally available to the customer such as business, residential, public or semipublic service.

COIN TELEPHONE SERVICE - See "PUBLIC TELEPHONE".

COMMISSIONS - A percentage of amounts handled paid as a fee in consideration of service rendered to the Company.

COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM - Channels and other facilities which are capable, when not connected to exchange telecommunications service, of two-way communications between customer-provided terminal equipment or Company stations.

COMPANY - Continental Telephone Company of Arkansas.

CONNECTING ARRANGEMENT - The equipment provided by the Company to accomplish the direct electrical connection of customer-provided facilities with the facilities of the Company or of facilities of the Company with other facilities of the Company.

CONNECTING COMPANY - A corporation, association, partnership or individual owning or operating one or more exchanges and with which communications services are interchanged.

CONNECTOR - See "SWITCH".

CONNECTION CHARGE - See "SERVICE CHARGES".

CONSTRUCTION CHARGE - A separate nonrecurring charge made for the construction of facilities in excess of those contemplated under the rates quoted in the Exchange Tariffs.

CONTINUOUS PROPERTY - The plot of ground, together with any building thereon, occupied by the customer which is not divided by public highways or separated by property occupied by others. Where a customer occupies property on both sides of a street, alley, highway, body of water, railroad right-of-way, etc., and the properties would otherwise be continuous, such properties are treated as continuous property provided local wire or cable facilities are used and the customer furnishes all local distribution pole line facilities or underground conduit required in connection therewith.

CUSTOMER - The individual, partnership, association or corporation which contracts for telephone service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the rules and regulations of the Company.

CUSTOMER-PROVIDED EQUIPMENT - Devices or apparatus provided by a customer.

DATA ACCESS ARRANGEMENT - A protective connecting arrangement for use with the network control signaling unit; or in lieu of the connecting arrangement, an arrangement to identify a central office line and protective facilities and procedures to assure proper operation and protection of the telecommunications network.

DIAL SWITCHING EQUIPMENT - A unit of electromechanical or electronic switching used in a central office or in connection with a PBX system.

DIRECT CONNECTION - Connection of terminal equipment to the telephone network by means other than acoustic or inductive coupling.

DIRECTORY LISTING - A publication in the Company's alphabetical directory of information relative to a customer's name or other identification and telephone number.

DISCONNECT NOTICE - The written notice sent to a customer following billing, notifying him that his service will be discontinued if charges are not satisfied by the date specified on the notice.

DROP WIRE - That portion of a circuit between the pole line or cable distributing box and the point of demarcation on or at the building in which the station or switchboard is located. (C)

EXCHANGE - A geographical area established for the administration of telephone service in a specified area, called the "exchange area," which usually embraces a city, town or village and its environs. It may contain one or more central offices together with the associated plant, equipment and facilities used in furnishing communication service within that area.

EXCHANGE ACCESS LINE - Serving Central Office line equipment, all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving Central Office with the customer premises, and the inside wire and outlet of one working service point. These facilities are Company provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for message long distance service and for local calling.

EXCHANGE AREA - The territory served by an exchange.

EXCHANGE LINE - Any circuit connecting an exchange station with a central office.

EXCHANGE SERVICE - The furnishing of facilities for the telephone communication within an exchange area in accordance with the regulations and charges specified in the Local or General Exchange Tariffs. Exchange facilities are used to establish and maintain connection between an exchange station and the other telephone plant and facilities in connection with long-distance calls or Extended Area Service calls.

EXCHANGE STATION - A station connected with a central office of the Company over its own lines.

EXTENDED AREA SERVICE - Interexchange telephone service furnished at a flat rate between one or more exchange areas.

EXTENSION BELL - A bell on the same circuit and operated in connection with the signaling device of the primary, extension or PBX station.

EXTENSION OF STATION LINE - A circuit extending from a main terminal to an auxiliary terminal such as a line from a PBX switchboard to a telephone set or to a key.

DEFINITIONS

EXTENSION STATION - See "TELEPHONE SET".

EXTRA EXCHANGE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement on which charges are based for that portion of the circuit extending beyond the Base Rate Area but within the exchange area which is used to furnish urban classes of service in the suburban or rural area.

EXTRA LISTING - See "ADDITIONAL LISTING".

FLAT-RATE SERVICE - Service furnished at a fixed monthly charge including Extended Area Service where applicable.

FOREIGN ATTACHMENT - Equipment or facilities not owned, furnished or authorized by the Company which are attached or connected to, and used with, exchange telephone service.

FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE - Any central office other than that which serves the area in which the customer is located.

FOREIGN EQUIPMENT - See "FOREIGN ATTACHMENT".

FOREIGN EXCHANGE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement applying to that portion of a central office line connecting a customer with a foreign central office, from the common boundary line to the customer's station, for which a monthly charge is made in addition to the base rate for exchange service.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE - Telephone exchange service furnished to a customer through a central office of an exchange other than the exchange regularly serving the area in which the customer is located.

FOUR-PARTY LINE - See "PARTY LINE".

GRADE OF SERVICE - The term used in describing exchange service with respect to the number of main terminals which may be connected to a central office line (one party, two party, four party, multiparty).

GRANDFATHERED EQUIPMENT - Equipment listed by the FCC which may be connected to access services of the Company.

HARM - Harm consists of hazards to personnel, damage to Company equipment, and impairment of service to persons other than the user of the customer-provided equipment. Types of harm include, but shall not be limited to, voltages dangerous to personnel, destruction of or damage to equipment, induced noise or cross talk, incorrect dial pulsing, failure of supervision, false answer, incorrect billing, absence of voice band transmission path for call progress signals, and loss of capability to answer an incoming call.

INDIVIDUAL LINE - An exchange line designed for the connection of one main station (not a PBX trunk line).

INDUCTIVE CONNECTION - Electromagnetic coupling between customer-provided equipment and Company equipment by means of mutual inductance between an inductor in the Company equipment and a customer-provided inductor external to the Company equipment.

INITIAL SERVICE PERIOD - The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

INSTALLATION CHARGE - A nonrecurring charge made at the time of installation of communications service or equipment which may apply in place of or in addition to Service Charges and other applicable charges for service or equipment.

INTERCOMMUNICATING SYSTEM - An arrangement involving two or more stations which enables a user to signal and connect with other stations in the system.

INTERCONNECTION - The method by which telecommunications facilities of the Company are arranged to transmit to, or receive information from, customer-provided equipment.

JACK - A connecting device provided for use with portable station equipment or furnished for use as a point of demarcation between network access service and station equipment.

JOINT USER SERVICE - An arrangement whereby an individual, firm or corporation whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the provision of separate customer service is permitted to use the service of a customer.

KEY EQUIPMENT - An arrangement of equipment, including keys and associated wiring, used to provide various supplemental services in connection with telephone stations.

KEY TELEPHONE SET - A telephone set equipped with keys or buttons in the mounting.

LOCAL CHANNEL - That portion of a channel which connects a station to an inter-exchanging channel or channel connecting two or more stations within an exchange area.

LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE - Telephone communications within a local service area in accordance with the provisions of the Company's tariffs.

LOCAL MESSAGE - A completed communication between stations located within the same exchange area or local service area.

LOCAL SERVICE AREA - The area within which telephone service is furnished under a specific schedule of rates without the application of specific charges for each message.

LONG DISTANCE MESSAGE - See "TOLL MESSAGE".

MAIN TERMINAL - The initial termination of a central office line on a customer's premises.

MAINTENANCE OF SERVICE CHARGE - A charge applied when the use of customer provided equipment or facilities causes impairment or harm or when it is determined that the service difficulty or trouble report results from customer-provided terminal equipment and/or communications systems connected or arranged for connection to Company facilities.

MESSAGE - A completed customer call.

MILEAGE - The measurement upon which charges are computed for long distance, extension, tie and private lines and for lines serving exchange stations located outside the Base Rate Area or outside the central office area of the serving central office.

MINIMUM CONTRACT PERIOD - The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

MOBILE TELEPHONE SERVICE - A communication service provided by means of radio frequencies through a land radiotelephone base station. Connections may be established between a wire station and a mobile or fixed unit or between two mobile or fixed units.

MODULAR CONNECTING DEVICE - A type of jack and plug arrangement as defined by the FCC.

MULTILINE TELEPHONE SYSTEMS - See "KEY EQUIPMENT".

MULTIPARTY LINE - A single circuit furnished by the Company for rendering exchange service to a number of primary stations outside the Base Rate Area.

NETWORK ACCESS POINTS - A connector, outlet, or wiring termination on a customer's premises which affords connection to the services of the Company.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING UNIT - The terminal equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Company for the provision of network control signaling.

NONRECURRING CHARGE - A one-time charge associated with certain installations, charges or transfers of services either in lieu of or in addition to recurring monthly charges.

POINT OF DEMARCATION - That point at which the Company's responsibility for installation and maintenance on a tariffed basis ends and the customer's option to install and/or maintain inside wire begins. (C)

For Simple Inside Wire the demarcation point is the first penetration at or inside a customer's premises on the customer's side of the protector where inside wiring becomes dedicated to an individual customer's use. For an individual customer's dwelling, this point of connection will generally be twelve inches on the customer's side of the protector. In those locations where there is a Company-provided plug-in jack within twelve inches of the customer's side of the protector, that plug-in jack will serve as the demarcation point. The drop and block, including the protector, will continue to be provided by and remain the property of the Company.

For Complex Inside Wire the demarcation point is the first jack or interconnection strip on the customer's side of the Company Network Terminal. This jack or interconnection strip is generally located within twenty-five (25) feet of the customer's common equipment, i.e., any telecommunications apparatus in which two or more business lines terminate which facilitates pick up. NETWORK ACCESS POINTS - A connector, outlet, or wiring termination on a customer's premises which affords connection to the services of the Company.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING UNIT - The terminal equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Company for the provision of network control signaling.

NONRECURRING CHARGE - A one-time charge associated with certain installations, charges or transfers of services either in lieu of or in addition to recurring monthly charges.

NOTICE - See "DISCONNECT NOTICE".

OPERATOR'S SET - A headset used by an operator at a switchboard or console consisting of a receiver, transmitter and necessary cords.

PARTY LINE - An exchange line designed for the connection of more than one main terminal with the central office.

POINT OF DEMARCATION -

- A. For acoustic or inductive connections, it is the Company-owned instrument.
- B. For equipment not requiring protective connecting arrangements, it is the Company-provided modular jack.
- C. For equipment requiring protective connecting arrangements, it is either the Company's protective connecting arrangement or the Company-owned modular jack for use in connection with the customer-provided protective connecting arrangement.

PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SYSTEM - An arrangement of equipment consisting of switching apparatus with attendant's telephone, trunks to a central office and stations connected with the switching apparatus, providing for intercommunication between these stations and communication with the general exchange and interexchange systems. Throughout this Tariff, the commonly used abbreviation, "PBX", will be substituted for the words "Private Branch Exchange" and "PABX" will be substituted for the words "Private Automatic Branch Exchange."

Any communications system or its components which has the capability to automatically select or direct a line from a group or groups of lines in a predetermined fashion shall be classified as a PBX/PABX System.

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- A. PBX Trunk: A circuit connecting a PBX system with a central office.
- B. PBX Station: Any station connected with a PBX system.
- C. Switchboards: Switchboards are classified as follows:
  - 1. Cord Switchboard: A switchboard on which all lines terminate in jacks; interconnection of stations and of stations and trunk lines is established manually by means of cords equipped with plugs.
    - a. Multiple Cord Switchboard: A cord switchboard arranged so that each line may have two or more appearances or jack terminations.
    - b. Nonmultiple Cord Switchboard: A cord switchboard arranged so that each line has only one appearance or jack termination.
  - 2. Cordless Switchboard (Key Switchboard): A switchboard on which all lines terminate on keys which may be used to interconnect stations and stations and trunk lines.
  - 3. Dial Switchboard: A switchboard on which interconnection of stations and stations and trunk lines is established by means of dialing.
- D. Power Source: Power furnished for talking and for operating lamp or visual signals and relays.

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DEFINITIONS

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PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE TRUNKS - See "PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SYSTEM" Public Service Commission

PRIVATE LINE - A circuit provided to furnish communication between two or more instrumentalities directly connected to it. Such instrumentalities do not have access to the general exchange and interexchange networks.

PUBLIC TELEPHONE - An exchange station, either attended or equipped with a coin-collecting device, designed and placed for use by the public in general at locations chosen or accepted by the Company.

REGISTERED TERMINAL EQUIPMENT - Terminal equipment registered in accordance with FCC regulations which may be connected to access services of the Company.

RESIDENCE SERVICE - Telephone service furnished to customers when the actual or obvious use is for domestic purposes.

RURAL AREA - See "SUBURBAN AREA".

RURAL SERVICE - Base Rate classes and grades of service furnished to customers in certain sections outside the Base Rate Area but within the Exchange Area, with the addition of rural or extra exchange mileage.

SELECTOR - See "SWITCH".

SERVICE CHARGES - The charge a customer is required to pay at the time of the establishment of telephone service or subsequent additions to that service. Definitions of individual charge functions are given in Section 6.

SPECIAL RATE AREA - A portion of an exchange area in which special base flat rates apply.

STATION - Specific identifying number associated with a location on a communications system.

SUBSCRIBER - See "CUSTOMER".

SUBURBAN AREA - The territory outside the Base Rate Area but within the exchange where Suburban and Rural Services are furnished at established rates.

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SUBURBAN SERVICE - Service furnished to customers outside the Base Rate or Special Rate Area(s) but within the exchange area without mileage charges.

SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES OR FACILITIES - Services or facilities other than primary telephone service.

SWITCH - A unit of dial switching equipment which provides interconnection between station lines or trunks.

SWITCHBOARD - See "PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE SYSTEM".

TARIFF - The rates, charges, rules and regulations adopted and filed by the Company with the Public Service Commission of the State of Arkansas.

TELEPHONE COMPANY - See "COMPANY".

TELEPHONE SET - A telephone instrument, consisting of a transmitter, receiver and associated apparatus, connected to permit transmission and reception of telephone messages.

TELETYPEWRITER - A teletypewriter consists of apparatus designed for the sending and receiving, or receiving only, of typewritten messages transmitted electrically.

TERMINATION CHARGE - A charge applied under certain conditions when a contract for service is terminated by the customer before the expiration of the minimum contract period.

TERMINAL EQUIPMENT ACCESSORIES - Devices, apparatus and their associated wiring, provided by a customer, which do not constitute a communications system and which when connected to the telecommunications system of the Company are connected electrically, acoustically or inductively.

TIE LINE - A circuit connecting two PBX systems for the purpose of inter-connection between the stations connected with such systems.

TIE LINE MILEAGE - The measurement on which the rates for tie lines connecting customers' switchboards are based.

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TOLL CENTER - A telephone switching center at which the operations function (message timing, switching and recording) takes place in connection with the provision of toll message service.

TOLL LINE - A circuit used exclusively for the transmission of messages between points located in different exchange areas where specific charges for each such message are applicable.

TOLL MESSAGE - A message between stations in different exchange areas and furnished under the provisions of the applicable Toll Tariff.

A. Person-to-Person Toll Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communication with a specified person or extension station at a specified location.

B. Station-to-Station Toll Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communication only with a specified telephone or switchboard.

C. Collect Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates that the called party accept and pay all charges associated with the message.

D. Third Number Message: A toll message in which associated charges are billed neither to the calling station nor to the called station but rather to a station not involved in the message.

E. Calling Card Message: A toll message in which associated charges are billed to a credit card number assigned by a telephone company and issued to either the called or calling party. (T)

TOLL RATE - The initial period charge prescribed for a toll message usually based upon a minimum initial period and distance between exchanges.

TOLL SERVICE - Toll service (long-distance service) is that part of the total telephone service rendered by the Company which is furnished between customers and different exchange areas in accordance with the rates and regulations specified in the Company's Toll Tariff.

TRUNK LINE - A circuit over which customers' messages are sent between two central offices or between a central office and a PBX system.

The Call Forwarding customer is responsible for the payment of charges for each call between his Call Forwarding equipped telephone and the telephone to which the call is being forwarded. The transmission may vary depending on the distance and routing necessary, therefore, transmission may not meet normal standards.

2. Call Forwarding Busy/No Answer - Variable

This feature allows calls to either a party who does not answer or a busy line to be routed to an alternate specified directory number. The alternate specified directory number may be in the same switching office or may be reached via local toll trunks.

3. Call Forwarding Busy Line - Fixed

This feature, permanently activated, provides customers the ability to redirect incoming calls to a preselected line number when such incoming calls encounter a normal busy line condition.

4. Call Forwarding No Answer - Fixed

This feature, permanently activated, provides customers the ability to redirect incoming calls to a preselected line number when such incoming calls encounter either a normal busy line condition or a no answer conditions.

6. Call Waiting

When a customer is talking on the telephone, a short spurt of tone signals him that a call is waiting. The tone is heard only by the Call Waiting customer, while the incoming caller hears a regular ringing signal. Flashing the hookswitch "holds" the first call while the second is answered. The customer can alternate between calls by flashing the hookswitch.

Cancel Call Waiting which provides the customer the ability to disable the Call Waiting feature for the duration of one call will also be provided as an adjunct feature where available. 5. Responsibility of the Company

- a. The technical criteria for customer-provided systems and equipment is contained in the FCC tariffs of the AT&T Company with which this Company concurs.
- b. The Company shall not be responsible to the customer for changes in the technical criteria or in any of the facilities, operations or procedures initiated by the Company or appropriate regulatory agencies which might render any customer-provided equipment obsolete or require modification or alteration of such equipment or otherwise affect its use or performance. The Company will make a reasonable effort to notify a customer in advance of changes in technical criteria, operations or procedures which might affect customer-provided equipment or systems.
- c. The Company shall not be responsible for the installation, operation or maintenance of any customer-provided communications systems or equipment.
- d. The Company will not provide systems or equipment on the customer side of the point of demarcation.

B. Local Exchange Service Access

1. Customers providing their own communications systems or telephone stations must subscribe to Local Exchange Service as a means of connection to the Company's switching network. Local Exchange Service access will be that customer's sole means of connection to the Company's switching network and cannot be combined with any other exchange service.
2. In the event an existing business customer to local exchange service decides to provide his own system, the Company reserves the right to assess the fair value of its wiring facilities within that customer's premises beyond the point of demarcation and to physically recover its facilities or negotiate for the purchase of said facilities at their fair value.
