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**Sheet Numbering** - Sheet numbers appear in the upper right hand corner of the sheet. Sheets are numbered sequentially and from time to time new sheets may be added to the tariff. When a new sheet is added between existing sheets, a decimal is added to the preceding sheet number. For example, a new page added between Sheets 3 and 4 would be numbered 3.1.

**Explanation of Symbols** - When changes are made in any tariff sheet, a revised sheet will be issued canceling the tariff sheet affected. Changes will be identified on the revised sheet(s) through the use of the following symbols:

- (C) - to signify changed regulation.
- (D) - to signify discontinued rate or regulation.
- (I) - to signify increased rates.
- (M) - to signify material relocated from one page to another without change.
- (N) - to signify new rate, regulation, or text.
- (R) - to signify reduced rate.
- (S) - to signify reissued material.
- (T) - to signify a change in text, but no change in rate or regulation.
- (Z) - to signify a correction.

In addition to symbols for changes, each changed provision in the tariff shall contain a vertical line in the right hand margin of the page which clearly shows the exact number of lines being changed.

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1.0 DEFINITIONS OF TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS

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**Access Line** - An arrangement which connects the Customer's location to a Fiberline Network Communications switching center or point of presence.

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**Automated Calling Card Call** - A service whereby the End User dials all of the digits necessary to route and bill the call.

**Calling Card** - A billing convenience whereby the End User may bill the charges for a call to an approved telephone company issued calling card. The terms and conditions of the local telephone company will apply to payment arrangements.

**Commission** - The Public Service Commission of Missouri.

**Company or Carrier** - Fiberline Network Communications, Limited Partnership unless otherwise clearly indicated by the context.

**Customer** - The person, firm, corporation or other entity which initiates a call on the Company's network, or accepts billing for a call on the Company's network, subject to the terms and conditions of the Company's tariff regulations.

**Customer Owned Pay Telephone Service (COPTS)** - An instrument which is owned and operated by a person or company which is not a local exchange telephone company.

**Collect Billing** - A billing convenience whereby the originating caller may bill the charges for a call to the called party, provided the called party agrees to accept the charges.

**Credit Card** - A billing convenience whereby the End User may bill the charges for a call to an authorized national charge card. The terms and conditions of the agreement between the credit card company and its patrons will apply to payment arrangements.

**Day** - From 8:00 AM up to but not including 5:00 PM local time Monday through Friday.

**End User** - See definition of "Customer."

**Evening** - From 5:00 PM up to but not including 11:00 PM local time Sunday through Friday.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS

MISSOURI

Public Service Commission

2.1 Undertaking of Fiberline Network Communications, Limited Partnership

2.1.1 General

Fiberline Network Communications' services and facilities are furnished for communications originating at specified points within the State of Missouri under terms of this tariff.

FNC installs, operates, and maintains the communications services provided hereinunder in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth under this tariff. FNC may act as the Subscriber's agent for ordering access connection facilities provided by other carriers or entities, when authorized by the Subscriber, to allow connection of a Subscriber's location to the network. The Subscriber shall be responsible for all charges due for such service arrangement.

The Company's services and facilities are provided on a monthly basis unless otherwise stated, and are available twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week.

2.1.2 Limitations

- A. Service is offered subject to the availability of the necessary facilities and equipment, or both facilities and equipment, and subject to the provisions of this tariff. FNC may, from time to time, engage in special promotional service offerings designed to attract new customers or to increase existing customers awareness of a particular tariff offering. These offerings may be limited to certain dates, times and/or locations, subject to prior notification and approval by the Missouri PSC.

2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

2.1 Undertaking of Fiberline Network Communications, Limited Partnership (Continued)

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2.1.2 Limitations (Continued)

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- B. FNC reserves the right to discontinue or limit service when necessitated by conditions beyond its control, or when the Subscriber or Customer is using service in violation of provisions of this tariff, or in violation of the law.
- C. The Company does not undertake to transmit messages, but offers the use of its facilities when available, and will not be liable for errors in transmission or for failure to establish connections.
- D. All facilities provided under this tariff are directly controlled by FNC and the Subscriber may not transfer or assign the use of service or facilities without the express written consent of the Company. Such transfer or assignment shall only apply where there is no interruption of the use or location of the service or facilities.
- E. Prior written permission from the Company is required before any assignment or transfer. All regulations and conditions contained in this tariff shall apply to all such permitted assignees or transferees, as well as all conditions of service.

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2.2 Use of Service

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2.2.1 Purpose

Service provided under this tariff may be used for any lawful purpose for which the service is technically suited.

The Company reserves the right to discontinue service, limit service, or to impose requirements on Subscribers as required to meet changing regulatory rules and standards of the Missouri Public Service Commission.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

2.3 Liability

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Public Service Commission

- A. FNC's liability for any claim or loss, expenses or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage) arising out of mistakes, for any interruption, delay, error, omissions, or defects in any service, facility or transmission provided under this tariff shall not exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate monthly subscription fee charged to the subscriber for the period of service or the facility provided during which such interruption, delay, error, omission or defect occurs. Any adjustment shall apply only to the period the interruption, delay, error, omission or defect continues beyond 24 hours after notice of the interruption, delay, error, omission or defect is received by the Company. No other liability shall in any case attach to the Company on account of interruptions, delay, error, omission or defect of service. For the purpose of computing a credit, a month is considered to have thirty (30) days.
- B. The Company shall not be liable for claim or loss, expense or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage), for any interruption, delay, error, omission, or defect in any service, facility or transmission provided under this tariff, if caused by any person or entity other than the Company, by any malfunction of any service or facility provided by any other carrier, by an act of God, fire, war, civil disturbance, or act of government, or by any other cause beyond the Company's direct control.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.3 Liability (Continued)

MISSOURI

- C. The Company shall not be liable for, and shall be fully indemnified and held harmless by Customer and Subscriber against any claim or loss, expense, or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage) for defamation, libel, slander, invasion of privacy, infringement of copyright or patent, unauthorized use of any trademark, tradename or service mark, unfair competition, interference with or misappropriation or violation of any contract, proprietary or creative right, or any other injury to any person, property or entity arising out of the material, data, information, or other content revealed to, transmitted, processed, handled, or used by the Company under this tariff; for connecting, combining or adapting Company's facilities with subscriber's apparatus or systems, or; for any act or omission of the Customer or Subscriber; or for any personal injury or death of any person or for any loss of or damage to subscriber's premises or any other property, whether owned by the subscriber or others, caused directly or indirectly by the installation, maintenance, location, condition, operation, failure, presence, use or removal of equipment or wiring provided by the Carrier, if not directly caused by negligence of the Carrier, or; liability for failure to provide service.
- D. No agent or employee of any other carrier shall be deemed to be an agent or employee of the Company, except independent sales agents who may from time to time be employed by another carrier.
- E. The Company shall not be liable for any defacement of or damages to the premises of a Subscriber resulting from the furnishing of service which is not the direct result of the Company's negligence.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.4 Terminal Equipment

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Public Service Commission

The Company's facilities and service may be used with or terminated in Subscriber-provided terminal equipment or Subscriber-provided communications systems, such as a PBX or Pay Telephone. Such terminal equipment shall be furnished and maintained at the expense of the Subscriber, except as otherwise provided. The Subscriber is responsible for all costs at his or her premises, including personnel, wiring, electrical power, and the like, incurred in the use of FNC's service. When such terminal equipment is used, the equipment shall comply with the generally accepted minimum protective criteria standards of the telecommunications industry as endorsed by the Federal Communications Commission.

2.5 Installation and Termination

2.5.1 Subscriber Service Contract

Subscribers are required to contract for the various services offered by Fiberline Network Communications, Limited Partnership. Contracts may be granted up to a term of sixty (60) months. Service may be purchased for a minimum of 30 days. All rules and regulations governing the contractual arrangement is set forth on the Long Distance Subscriber Agreement Contract, the 1+ Service Contract and/or the Payphone Work Order Contract.

All services offered are subject to the Public Service Commission of the State of Missouri Rules and Regulations as they apply.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.6 Payment for Service and Service Dispute Resolution **MISSOURI**  
Public Service Commission

2.6.1 Payment for Service

All charges due by the Customer are payable to any agency duly authorized to receive such payments. The billing agency may be a local exchange telephone company, credit card company, or other billing service. A customer has at least twenty-one (21) days from the rendition of a bill to pay the charges stated except when the customer has had service discontinued under 2.13 following. Terms of payment shall be according to the rules and regulations of the agency and subject to the rules of regulatory agencies, such as the Missouri PSC. Any objections to billed charges should be promptly reported to the Company's billing agent. Adjustments to Customer's bills shall be made to the extent that circumstances exist which reasonably indicate that such changes are appropriate.

2.6.2 Service Dispute Resolution

Any objection to billed charges should be reported to the billing agent or Company within thirty (30) days from the day the bill is issued. Adjustments to End User's bills shall be made when circumstances exist which reasonably indicate that such changes are appropriate. End Users have the right to appeal service disputes to the Missouri Public Service Commission. The Commission's address and phone number are:

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.7 Establishment and Re-establishment of Credit **MISSOURI**  
Public Service Commission

- 2.7.1 In the event service is temporarily suspended for non-payment such service will be restored upon payment of all charges due.
- 2.7.2 A restoral of service charge will be applicable for each authorization code temporarily suspended. Where service is prescribed to FNC's service a restoral of service charge will be applicable for each line temporarily suspended.
- 2.7.3 Subscribers not reestablished within five (5) days from date of suspension will be treated as a new subscriber and appropriate Nonrecurring Charges and an advance payment will apply.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

2.8 Deposits and Advance Payments

MISSOURI  
Public Service Commission

2.8.1 The Company does not require a deposit from the  
Customer or Subscriber.

2.8.2 For Customers or Subscribers whom the Company  
feels an advance payment is necessary, FNC  
reserves the right to collect an amount not to  
exceed one (1) month's estimated charges as an  
advance payment for service. This will be  
applied against the next month's charges.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.9 Notices

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2.9.1 Notice to the Customer

Public Service Commission

Notices from the Company to a Customer normally will be given in writing, either delivered or mailed to the Customer's address of record.

In emergencies, where delay may result in impaired service or in hazards to the Customer, the public, or the Company's Facilities, the Company may resort to verbal notices given by telephone, radiotelephone, personal contact, or other means of communication.

2.9.2 Notices from the Customer

Notices from a Customer to the Company may be given verbally by the Customer or the Customer's authorized agent at the Company's office, or by written communication mailed thereto. Written notice is required when specified in tariff schedules or in any written agreement.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.10 Rendering and Payment of Bills

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2.10.1 Returned Check Charge

Public Service Commission

When a payment for service is made by check, draft, or similar negotiable instrument, a returned check charge will be made by the Company for each such item returned unpaid by a bank to the Company for any reason. The acceptance of checks, drafts, or other negotiable instruments for the satisfaction of the Customer's debts to the Company shall not constitute a waiver by the Company of its right to payment by legal tender.

2.10.2 Extra Copies of Bill

Extra Copies of a subscriber's monthly bill will be provided by the Carrier at the rate specified in this tariff.

2.10.3 Third Party Billing

The Company reserves the right to refuse Third Party Billing at its discretion.

2.10.4 Credit Card or Calling Card Calls

The Company reserves the right to refuse to process Credit Card or Calling Card billed calls when authorization for use of the card cannot be validated.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.11 Fraud

MISSOURI

The Company shall have the right to refuse Public Service Commission  
discontinue service if the acts of the customer,  
including furnishing false credit information or the  
conditions upon their premises are such as to indicate  
intention to defraud the Company.

2.12 Non Compliance with the Company's Rules

The Company may discontinue service if a customer  
fails to comply with any of the rules herein.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.13 Discontinuance and Restoration of Service

MISSOURI

2.13.1 Service may be discontinued for any of the following reasons: <sup>Public Service Commission</sup>

- (A) Nonpayment of an undisputed delinquent charge;
- (B) Failure to post a required deposit or guarantee;
- (C) Unauthorized use of telephone utility equipment in a manner which creates an unsafe condition or creates the possibility of damage or destruction to such equipment;
- (D) Failure to comply with terms of a settlement agreement;
- (E) Refusal after reasonable notice to permit inspection, maintenance or replacement of telephone utility equipment;
- (F) Material misrepresentation of identity in obtaining telephone utility service; and
- (G) As provided by state or federal law.

2.13.2 The failure to pay charges not subject to commission jurisdiction shall not constitute cause for a discontinuance unless specifically authorized in telephone utility tariffs approved by the Commission.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

2.13 Discontinuance and Restoration of Service (Continued) **MISSOURI  
Public Service Commission**

2.13.3 Subject to the requirements of this tariff, service may be discontinued during normal business hours on or after the date specified in the notice of discontinuance. Service shall not be discontinued on a day when the offices of FNC are not available to facilitate reconnection of service or on a day immediately preceding such day. Service shall not be discontinued for nonpayment of a delinquent charge until five (5) days after a charge has become delinquent except as provided in section 2.13.10 of this tariff.

2.13.4 Service shall not be discontinued under section 2.13.1 of this tariff unless written notice by first-class mail is sent or delivered to the customer at least five (5) days prior to the date of the proposed discontinuance. A notice of discontinuance shall not be effective if a customer has pending with FNC a complaint concerning the charge upon which the notice is based. FNC, at the time service is contracted for, shall inquire if the customer will also be the user. If the user is different from the customer, FNC shall maintain a record of this showing the name and address of the user. Unless notified by a customer, FNC shall not be required to know of changes in this status after the initial contract for service has been fully executed.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.13 Discontinuance and Restoration of Service (Continued)

Public Service Commission

2.13.5 A notice of discontinuance shall contain the following information:

- (A) The name, address and the telephone number of the customer;
- (B) A statement of the reason for the proposed discontinuance and the cost for reconnection;
- (C) The date after which service will be discontinued unless appropriate action is taken;
- (D) How a customer may avoid the discontinuance;
- (E) The customer's right to enter into a settlement agreement if the claim is for a charge not in dispute and the customer is unable to pay the charge in full;
- (F) The telephone number where the customer may make an inquiry;
- (G) A statement that this notice will not be effective if the charges involved are part of an unresolved dispute; and
- (H) A statement of the exception for medical emergency under section 2.13.7 of this tariff.

2.13.6 At least twenty-four (24) hours preceding a discontinuance, FNC shall make reasonable efforts to contact the customer to advise them of the proposed discontinuance and what steps must be taken to avoid it.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.13 Discontinuance and Restoration of Service (Continued) Missouri Commission

2.13.7 Notwithstanding any other provision of this tariff, FNC shall postpone a discontinuance for a time not in excess of twenty-one (21) days if the telephone is necessary to obtain emergency medical assistance for a person who is a member of the household where the telephone service is provided and where such person is under the care of a physician. Any person who alleges such emergency, if requested, shall provide FNC with reasonable evidence of such necessity.

2.13.8 Upon the customer's request, FNC shall restore service consistent with all other provisions of this tariff when the cause for discontinuance has been eliminated.

2.13.9 Payment may be made by the customer for restoration of service in any reasonable manner, including personal check. Payment by personal check may be refused if the customer, within the last twelve (12) months, has tendered payment in this manner and the check has been dishonored, excepting bank error.

2.13.10 Notwithstanding any other provisions of this tariff, service to a customer may be discontinued at any time after written notice has been sent, certified mail, to such customer at his/her last known address and at the address where the service to be discontinued is provided if such customer;

(a) Incurs charges not covered by a deposit or guarantee and evidences an intent not to pay such charges when due; or

(b) Damages or evidences an intent to damage telephone utility equipment

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2.13 Discontinuance and Restoration of Service (Continued)

2.13.11 The notice required by section 2.13.10 of this tariff shall state how a customer has evidenced an intent not to pay charges when due or evidenced an intent to damage telephone utility equipment.

2.13.12 The Company may disconnect the Telephone Services in accordance with the terms hereof without any liability except for an appropriate refund of prepaid charges and any service deposit with accrued interest.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

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2.14 Installation and Termination

MISSOURI

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Service is installed upon mutual agreement between the Subscriber and the Company. The agreement will determine terms and conditions of installation, termination of service, any applicable sales commission structure, and sales commission payment schedule. The service agreement does not alter rates specified in the tables and schedules contained in this tariff.

2.15 Ownership of Equipment

Equipment furnished by the Company on the premises of a subscriber is the property of the Company.

2.16 Taxes

All state and local taxes (i.e., gross receipts tax, sales tax, municipal utilities tax) are listed as separate line items and are not included in the quoted rates.

2.17 Taxes and Fees Chargeable to Customers/Subscribers

2.17.1 Adjustments for Municipality Payments

If at any future time a municipality acquires the legal right to impose an occupation tax, license tax, permit fee, franchise fee or other similar charge upon the Carrier, and imposes the same by ordinance or otherwise, such taxes, fees or charges shall be billed to the subscribers receiving service within the territorial limits of such municipality. Such billing shall allocate the tax, fee or charge among subscribers uniformly on the basis of each subscriber's monthly charges for the types of service made subject to such tax, fee or charge.

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2.0 RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

2.17 Taxes and Fees Chargeable to Customers/Subscribers **MISSOURI**  
**Public Service Commission**

2.17.2 Adjustments for County or Other Local Taxing  
Authority Payments

If at any future time a county or other local taxing authority acquires the legal right to impose an occupation tax, license tax, permit fee, franchise fee or other similar charge upon the Carrier, and imposes the same by ordinance or otherwise, such taxes, fees or charges shall be billed to the subscribers receiving service within the territorial limits of such county or other taxing authority. Such billing shall allocate the tax, fee or charge among subscribers uniformly on the basis of each subscriber's monthly charges for the types of service made subject to such tax, fee or charge.

2.17.3 Gross Receipts Tax

When utility or telecommunications assessments, franchise fees, or privilege, license, occupational, excise, or other similar taxes or fees, based on interstate receipts are imposed by certain taxing jurisdictions upon the Company or upon local exchange companies and passed on to the Company through or with interstate access charges, the amounts of such taxes or fees will be billed to Customers in such a taxing jurisdiction on a prorated bases. The amount of charge that is prorated to each Customer's bill is determined by the interstate telecommunications services provided to and billed to a Customer service location in such a taxing jurisdiction with the aggregate of such charges equal to the amount of the tax or fee imposed upon or passed on to the Company.

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**3.0 DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES**

**3.1 General**

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Public Service Commission

The Carrier endeavors to provide high quality service. Service is available 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, subject to routine maintenance and outages beyond the control of the Carrier. Carrier's switching equipment is designed and engineered to provide high quality transmission of voice and data with a minimum level of impairment such as noise and echo. However, overall quality may vary somewhat due to the variability in quality of the connections provided by the local telephone companies and other interexchange carriers which is beyond the Company's control.

The customer shall be responsible for payment of an FNC Service Trip Charge of \$50.00 for each visit to a customer's premises or the premises of any other customer where a service difficulty or trouble report results from customer provided equipment and facilities including inside wire. When at the specific request of the customer, installation or routine maintenance is performed outside the regular business hours additional Service Trip Charges may apply.
