2.1 Undertaking of Fiberline Network Communications, Limited Commission Partnership

2.1.1 General

Fiberline Network Communications' services and facilities are furnished for communications originating at specified points within the State of Missouri under terms of this tariff.

FNC installs, operates, and maintains the communications services provided hereinunder in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth under this tariff. FNC may act as the Subscriber's agent for ordering access connection facilities provided by other carriers or entities, when authorized by the Subscriber, to allow connection of a Subscriber's location to the network. The Subscriber shall be responsible for all charges due for such service arrangement.

The Company's services and facilities are provided on a monthly basis unless otherwise stated, and are available twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week.

2.4 Terminal Equipment

The Company's facilities and service may be used with or terminated in Subscriber-provided terminal equipment or Subscriber-provided communications systems, such as a PBX or Pay Telephone.
