ORDER REGARDING APPLICATION

Issue Date: July 2, 2014 Effective Date: July 6, 2014

Application

On June 11, 2014¹, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company ("GMO") asked the Commission to approve its residential lighting program. This program will be part of GMO's Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act ("MEEIA") program plan.

At the same time, GMO filed a tariff that has an effective date of July 11.² But, in a Motion for Expedited Treatment, GMO asks that the tariff go into effect on July 6. This will allow GMO's program to go into effect simultaneously with Kansas City Power & Light's ("KCP&L") similar residential lighting program.

GMO states that in File No. EO-2014-0095, the parties filed a stipulation that allows GMO to have the same residential lighting program as KCP&L. Thus, the Commission notified the parties in File No. EO-2014-0095. No party from that file responded to the application.

Calendar references are to 2014 unless otherwise noted.

Further, GMO asks for variances from certain Commission rules. GMO states that the signatories to the stipulation resolving its MEEIA case all agreed that GMO should have these variances.³ GMO states that these variances, regarding net shared benefits, tariff flexibility, integrated resource plans, and annual reporting, are still needed.⁴

Staff Recommendation

The Staff of the Commission ("Staff") filed a Recommendation on June 27. Staff states that GMO has complied with the stipulation in File No. EO-2014-0095.

Staff recommends that the Commission approve: GMO's proposed residential home lighting rebate program;⁵ the program's cumulative annual energy and demand savings targets of 25,162,228 kWh and 2,673 kW, respectively; the modified GMO MEEIA program plan's cumulative annual energy and demand savings targets of 161,280,888 kWh and 66,525 kW, respectively; and all variances from Commission rules that GMO requests. GMO further recommends expedited approval of the tariff sheets.

Discussion

The Commission has reviewed the above-mentioned filings, and determines that the filings comply with the Commission's order approving the stipulation in File No. EO-2014-0095. The Commission further finds that good cause exists for GMO to be

excused from the Section 393.140(11) requirement that tariffs have a 30-day effective date, and finds good cause to grant GMO waivers from the previously mentioned rules.⁶

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Application is granted.
- 2. The Motion for Expedited Treatment is granted.
- 3. The Commission approves GMO's proposed residential home lighting rebate program; the program's cumulative annual energy and demand savings targets of 25,162,228 kWh and 2,673 kW, respectively; the modified GMO MEEIA program plan's cumulative annual energy and demand savings targets of 161,280,888 kWh and 66,525 kW, respectively; and all variances from Commission rules that GMO requests.
- 4. The tariff KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company filed on June 11, 2014, as substituted on June 24, 2014, and denominated Tariff No. JE-2014-0537, is approved as of July 6, 2014.
 - 5. This order shall become effective on July 6, 2014.
 - 6. This file shall be closed on July 7, 2014.
