RE: Notice of Election and Withdrawal of CenturyTel of Missouri, LLC d/b/a CenturyLink (Missouri) Tariffs Pursuant to §392.461, RSMo.

Dear Secretary:

Section 392.461 allows telecommunications companies, upon notice to the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission"), to elect to be exempt from the requirement that they offer retail services to residential or business end users only through tariff, and to withdraw such tariffs.

CenturyTel of Missouri, LLC d/b/a CenturyLink hereby provides notice of its election to be exempt from tariff filing requirements, and of its intent to withdraw the below-listed tariffs, effective October 1, 2014.

Compliant with the requirement that electing companies publish generally available retail prices on a website, the *Local Terms of Service* containing the terms, conditions and rates for services previously provided under tariffs will be located on CenturyLink's website at www.CenturyLink.com/tariffs. Affected customers were advised at least thirty days in advance of CenturyLink's withdrawal of the above referenced tariffs and of the website at which *Local Terms of Service* are available.

The withdrawal of tariffs and establishment of *Local Terms of Service* will not result in any changes to customers' current services or rates. CenturyLink will notify customers in advance if future changes are made.

Scope

Service Commission

- a. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service (LDMTS) is the furnishing of those service components required for telecommunications between service points in different local service areas in accordance with the regulations and system of charges specified in this Tariff. The message charges specified in this Tariff are in payment for Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service furnished between the calling and called service points. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service usage is classified as a transitionally competitive service.
- b. The charges specified in this Tariff do not encompass work being performed by the Telephone Company ey encompass work once begun being interrupted by the customer. If the customer requests that overtime labor be performed or interrupts work once begun, an additional charge based on the additional costs involved applies.
- The Telephone Company does not undertake to transmit messages but furnishes the use of its services to its customers for telecommunications.
- d. The design, maintenance and operation of Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service envisions that communications will originate or terminate at a service point of the associated exchange telephone service used for LDMTS. Connections of customer premises equipment or communications systems or interexchange customer-provided premises equipment or communications systems may be made to LDMTS. However, the Telephone Company will not be responsible for the through transmission of signals or for the quality of transmission through such connections.
- e. The rules and regulations as applied to billing and collection practices for services provided to customers are found in the General Rules and Regulations of the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff.

2. Availability of Services

In case a shortage of service components exists at any time, either for temporary or protracted periods, the
establishment of Local and Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service shall take precedence over
all others.

- Availability of Services (Cont'd)
 - b. Service is furnished subject to the availability of the service components required. The Telephone Company will (1) determine which of those components shall be used and (2) make modifications to those components at its option.
 - c. At the option of the Telephone Company, Call Restriction Services, as set forth in the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff, will be furnished to control instances of fraud associated with billed to third party, station-to-station or person-to-person collect calls or in response to a customer request.
- 3. Limitations on Duration of Connections

The Company reserves the right to limit the duration of connection when necessary because of a shortage of service components caused by emergency conditions.

- 4. Liability
 - a. In view of the fact that the customer has exclusive control of his communications over the services furnished him by the Telephone Company, and of the other uses for which services may be furnished him by the Telephone Company, and because of unavoidableness of errors incident to the services and to the use of such services of the Telephone Company, the services furnished by the Company are subject to the terms, conditions and limitations specified in b., c., and d., following.
 - b. The liability of the Telephone Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors or defects in transmission or failures or defects in service components furnished by the Telephone Company occurring in the course of furnishing service and not caused by the negligence of the customer, or of the Telephone Company in failing to maintain proper standards of maintenance and operation and to exercise reasonable supervision shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistake, omission, interruption, delay, error or defect in transmission or failure or defect in service components occurs.

 - c. The customer indemnifies and saves the Telephone Company harmless against claims for libel, slander or infringement of copyright from the material transmitted over its services; against claims for infringement of patents arising from, combining with or using in connection with, services of the Telephone Company, apparatus and systems of the customer and against all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with services provided by the Telephone Company.
 - d. When the services of other telephone companies are used in establishing connections to points not reached by the Telephone Company's services, the Telephone Company is not liable for any act or omission of the other company or companies.
- Use of Service
 - a. The service is provided for use by the customer and may be used by others, when so authorized by the customer, providing that all such usage shall be subject to the provisions of this Tariff.
 - b. The service is furnished subject to the condition that there will be no abuse or fraudulent use of the service. Abuse or fraudulent use of service includes:
 - The use of the service of the Telephone Company to transmit a message or to locate a person or otherwise to give or obtain information without payment of the charge applicable for service.
 - 2) The obtaining, or attempting to obtain, or assisting another to obtain or to attempt to obtain Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service by rearranging, tampering with or making connection with any service components of the Telephone Company or by any trick, scheme, false representation or false credit device, or by or through any other fraudulent means or device whatsoever with intent to avoid the payment, in whole or in part, of the regular charge for such service.

Application of Construction Charges

When special construction for individual customers is necessary, special construction charges may apply as set forth in the Telephone Company's General and Local Exchange Tariff.

10. Definitions

ACCESSORIES - The term "Accessories" denotes devices which are mechanically attached to or used with the services furnished by the Telephone Company and which are independent of and not electrically, acoustically or inductively connected to the conductors in the communications path of the telecommunications system.

<u>BILL TO THIRD PARTY</u> - The term "Bill to Third Party" denotes a billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to an authorized service point as determined by the Telephone Company other than the service point originating the call or the service point where the call is terminated.

<u>BUSY INTERRUPT</u> - The term "Busy Interrupt" denotes the service whereby the operator will interrupt a call in progress at the request of a customer after the line has been verified to be busy (see Line Status Verification).

<u>CALL FORWARDING</u> - Call Forwarding denotes that feature whereby a call placed to a customer's telephone number in one exchange (the call forwarding location) is automatically forwarded by Telephone Company serving office equipment on a Long Distance Message Telecommunications Services basis only to a service point designated by said customer in another exchange within the same LATA. Provision of Call Forwarding is subject to the availability of service components.

<u>CALLING CARD</u> - The term "Calling Card" denotes a billing arrangement by which a call may be charged to an authorized telecommunications company calling card number.

<u>COLLECT CALL</u> - The term "Collect Call" denotes a billing arrangement by which the charge for a call may be reversed provided the charge is accepted at the called service point. A collect call may be billed to a calling card or third party number. In the case of a public or semi-public coin telephone, the charges must be billed to a calling card or third-party number, or the call may be reoriginated from the called service point.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS</u> - Channels and other service components which are capable, when not connected to the Telecommunications Network, of two-way communications between customer premises equipment and/or Telephone Company service points.

<u>COS PETITIONING EXCHANGE</u> - The COS Petitioning Exchange is that exchange whose customers petition the MPSC to have COS calling with the customers in the COS Target Exchange.

<u>COS TARGET EXCHANGE</u> - The Target Exchange is the exchange to which customers in another exchange have petitioned for COS service.

<u>CUSTOMER</u> - The person, firm or corporation which orders service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the regulations of the Telephone Company.

INTEREXCHANGE CUSTOMER(S) (IC) - Denotes any individual, partnership, association, corporation, or governmental agency or any other entity which subscribes to the services offered under Tariff P.S.C. Mo. No. 2, Facilities for Intrastate Access, to provide intrastate telecommunications services for its own use or for the use of its customers (End Users).

<u>INTERFACE</u> - That point on the premises of the customer at which provision is made for connection of other than Telephone Company provided service components to service components provided by the Telephone Company.

<u>INTRALATA</u> - Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service (LDMTS) where the originating service point location and the terminating service point location are all within the same Local Access and Transport Area (LATA).

<u>LINE STATUS VERIFICATION</u> - The term "Line Status Verification" denotes the service whereby the operator will verify and provide the status of a subscriber line at the request of a customer.

LOCAL ACCESS AND TRANSPORT AREA (LATA) - The Local Access and Transport Area denotes a geographical area established for the administration of communications service. It encompasses designated local operating Telephone Company exchanges which are grouped to serve common social, economic and miscellaneous purposes.

LOCAL EXCHANGE CARRIER (LEC) - The certificated provider of basic local exchange telephone service.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING - The transmission of signals used in the telecommunications system which perform functions such as supervision (control status and charging signals), address signaling (i.e., dialing), calling and called number identification, audible tone signals, (call progress signals indicating re-order or busy conditions, alerting, coin denominations, coin collect and coin return tones) to control the operation of switching machines in the telecommunications system.

ORIGINATING EXCHANGE - Telephone Company exchanges in which residential and business customers may order Extended Exchange Calling Plan (EECP) Service. A listing of all EECP originating exchanges is found in Section J.4.a. of this taniff.

PERSON-TO-PERSON (See Two-Point Service).






