**NOTICE INFORMING COMPLAINANT OF  
LACK OF JURISDICTION  
AND  
ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT**

Effective Date: May 3, 2014

On April 16, 2014, Derek Seney filed a complaint against Kansas City Power & Light Company. The complaint concerns service at an address in Overland Park, Kansas. The Commission does regulate, and has jurisdiction over, Kansas City Power & Light Company. However, the Commission’s jurisdiction, under Section 386.250(1) RSMo, is limited to service within the State of Missouri. Because this complaint involves service at an address outside of Missouri, the Commission lacks jurisdiction.

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.116 states that a case may be dismissed for good cause. The Commission’s lack of jurisdiction over this matter constitutes good cause. The Commission must therefore dismiss this complaint.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. This complaint is dismissed for lack of jurisdiction.

2. This order shall become effective on May 3, 2014.
3. This file shall be closed on May 4, 2014.
