**ORDER DIRECTING FILING**

John B. Jackson filed a complaint with the Missouri Public Service Commission against Union Electric Company, d/b/a AmerenUE, on July 5, 2005. Mr. Jackson contends that "AmerenUE till this date has failed to define monetary amount or percentage if any that I am legally responsible." On August 8, 2005, AmerenUE filed its answer. AmerenUE states that it has provided the Complainant with an itemized bill that includes an unpaid amount from a previous address where the Complainant resided. AmerenUE attached a copy of the Complainant's current bill, as well as related previous bills, as Attachment A (Highly Confidential) to its answer.

On October 4, 2005, the Commission's Staff filed its Recommendation and Memorandum. Staff notes that there appear to be no violations of any Commission rule

and that AmerenUE has acted in accordance with its tariff. Therefore, Staff recommends that the Commission dismiss the complaint.

The Commission will direct the Complainant to file a response to Staff's Recommendation and Memorandum, and to show cause why his complaint should not be dismissed. Although Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(16) allows ten days to respond to any filing, the Commission will extend that deadline by a few days.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. That no later than October 19, 2005, the Complainant, John B. Jackson, is directed to file a response to Staff's Recommendation and Memorandum, and to show cause why his complaint should not be dismissed.
2. That this order shall become effective on October 11, 2005.
