MOTION FOR EXPEDITED TREATMENT AND FOR APPROVAL OF TARIFF SHEETS ON LESS THAN THIRTY DAYS' NOTICE

Comes now Green Hills Telephone Corporation (Company), and, in accordance with Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(14), moves the Commission for expedited treatment of Company's proposed tariff sheets, filed on March 9, 2012:

- 1. On February 6, 2012, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) released its Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in its Docket No. 11-42, In the Matter of Lifeline and Line Up Reform and Modernization (Report and Order).
- 2. The FCC's changes to the Lifeline and Link Up programs include a reduction in the maximum amount of federal Lifeline support available from \$10.00 to \$9.25 and the elimination of the Link Up program to subsidize telephone connection charges. As a result, the Company's current intrastate tariffs must be revised to comply with the FCC's new mandates for the Lifeline and Link Up programs by April 2, 2012.
- 4. Concurrently with the filing of this Motion, Company filed tariff sheets in order to comply with the FCC Order.
- 5. As good cause for an expedited effective date and approval of the revised tariff sheets on less than thirty (30) days' notice, Company states that the FCC's *Report and Order* contains numerous provisions which substantially alter the federal Lifeline and Link Up programs on an expedited timeframe. The tariff sheets have been filed in compliance with the

FCC's Report and Order. Granting this Motion will allow Company to comply with the FCC's Report and Order in a timely manner.

- 6. The subject tariff sheets and this Motion have been filed as soon as possible after the receipt and review of the FCC's lengthy *Report and Order*. If the revised tariff sheets are not allowed to go into effect on April 2, 2012, the Company's tariff will not be in compliance with the FCC's new rules regarding Lifeline and Link Up and, as a practical matter, the Company will be required to provide Lifeline and Link Up subsidies to qualifying subscribers for which it will not be fully reimbursed by the Universal Service Administration Company (USAC).
- 7. Accordingly, Company seeks a Commission order allowing the proposed tariff sheets to go into effect for service rendered on and after April 2, 2012.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, Company respectfully requests the Commission to grant this Motion for Expedited Treatment and approve Company's proposed tariff sheets effective on and after April 2, 2012.
