## ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT

Issue Date: October 8, 2014 Effective Date: November 7, 2014

The Missouri Public Service Commission is dismissing the complaint of Martin City Sports Complex ("MSCS").

On June 16, 2014<sup>1</sup>, MCSC filed a formal complaint pursuant to rule 4 CSR 240-2.070 against Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCP&L"). The complaint was signed by Mark Nigro, Partner. Because MCSC did not have legal counsel, the Commission issued a Notice of Deficiency on June 24. <sup>2</sup>

The Commission issued an order to show cause on September 24, giving MSCS until October 2 to show cause why this case should not be dismissed. MCSC did not respond.

The Commission's regulations provide:

Cases may be dismissed for lack of prosecution if no action has occurred in the case for ninety (90) days and no party has filed a pleading requesting a continuance beyond that time.<sup>3</sup>

The Commission's regulations also provide:

A party may be dismissed from a case for failure to comply with any order issued by the commission.<sup>4</sup>

More than ninety days have elapsed since MSCS filed its complaint, and MSCS has taken no further action since filing the complaint. Therefore, the Commission will dismiss the complaint.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The complaint is dismissed without prejudice.
- 2. This order shall become effective on November 7, 2014.
- 3. This file shall be closed on November 8, 2014.
