On November 12, 2015, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO)

filed an application with the Missouri Public Service Commission requesting a Certificate

of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") as authorized by Section 393.170, RSMo 2000.

The CCN would authorize GMO to construct, install, own, operate, maintain and

otherwise control and manage solar generation facilities in Jackson County, Missouri.

GMO asks the Commission to approve its application by January 31, 2016.

This is considered a contested case pursuant to § 536.010(4), RSMo (2013 Cum.

Supp.). A contested case is a formal hearing procedure that includes discovery. The Commission's discovery rules are set forth in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.090.

The Commission will direct notice be given and set a deadline for intervention requests.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Commission's Data Center shall provide a copy of this order to the County Commission of Jackson County, Missouri.

2. The Commission's Public Information Officer shall make notice of this order available to the members of the General Assembly representing GMO's service territory and to the media serving GMO's service territory.

3. Any person wishing to intervene in this matter shall file an application to intervene no later than December 7, 2015. The application shall be filed in the Commission's Electronic Filing and Information System ("EFIS") or with the Secretary of the Commission.

4. The Staff of the Commission shall file a status update no later than November 23, 2015, stating when it will file a recommendation on GMO's application.

5. This order shall be effective when issued.
