ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

On July 7, 2022, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed an application with the Commission seeking an order granting a certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) pursuant to Sections 393.170 and 393.190.1, RSMo. The CCN would authorize Ameren Missouri to construct, install, own, operate, maintain, and otherwise control and manage a 200 megawatt (MW) solar generation facility, located in Audrain and Ralls Counties, Missouri (referred to as the "Huck Finn Solar Project") pursuant to a Build Transfer Agreement (BTA) with EDF Renewables Development, Inc.

On July 18, 2022, Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri (Renew Missouri) timely filed an application to intervene. In its application, Renew Missouri stated that it is "a non-profit policy group whose mission is to transform Missouri into a leading state in renewable energy and energy efficiency." Renew Missouri also stated that it has interests that are different from those of the general public and could be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case.

Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.080(13) allows parties ten days from the date of filing in which to respond to any pleading unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. Ten days have passed since the application to intervene was filed and no parties have

responded. After considering the unopposed application to intervene, the Commission finds that Renew Missouri has interests that are different from that of the general public and that may be affected by a final order arising from this file. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The application of Renew Missouri to intervene is granted.
- 2. This order shall be effective when issued.
