## **NOTICE OF DISMISSAL**

COMES NOW The Empire District Electric Company ("Empire"), and, as its Notice of Dismissal, states as follows to the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission"):

- 1. On July 22, 2002, Empire filed its application which initiated this case. That application requested permission to transfer functional control over designated transmission facilities to a new company that would reflect the consolation of the Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator, Inc. (Midwest ISO) and the Southwest Power Pool, Inc. (SPP).
- 2. On March 20, 2003, SPP and MISO issued a press release stating that they had mutually agreed to terminate the consolidation of the organizations and were notifying the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission of this fact.
- 3. As Empire's application in this case was premised upon the completion of the SPP/MISO merger, Empire does not believe there is any purpose to a continuation of this case at this time.
- 4. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1) states that a "[a]n applicant or complainant may voluntarily dismiss an application or complaint without an order of the commission at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered, by filing a notice of dismissal with the commission and serving a copy on all parties."
  - 5. No prepared testimony has been filed, nor has any oral testimony been offered, in

this case.

WHEREFORE, Empire prays that the Commission recognize this Notice of Dismissal and close this case.
