ORDER GRANTING WAIVER

The Missouri Public Service Commission is granting Staff's motion for waiver ("motion").¹ The motion seeks a waiver of the regulation² that bars Staff from "advocat[ing] a position beyond reporting the results of its investigation." The Commission received no response to the motion within the time allowed by regulation.³

The standard for waiving a regulation is good cause.⁴ In support of the motion, Staff argues that the complaint requires interpretation of a tariff provision. The provision institutes an Energy Efficiency Investment Charge as part of the Missouri Energy Efficiency Initiative Act. The issue is one of first impression. Staff's recommendation might be more helpful to the Commission if Staff is free to advocate a position on that provision. Those facts constitute good cause for a waiver.
